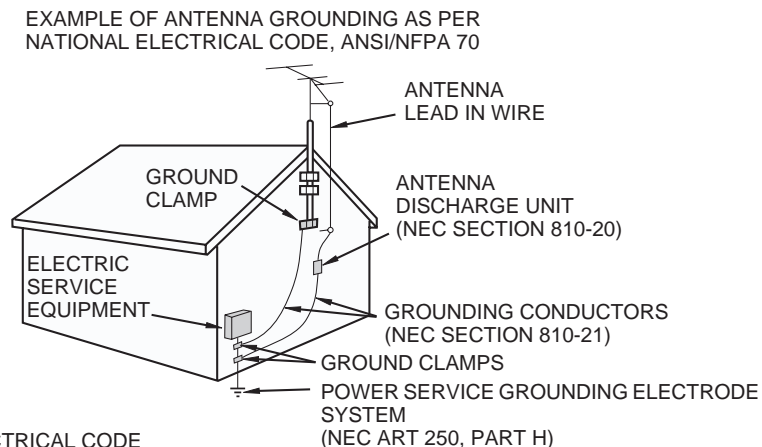

- **Lightning** — For added protection for this television equipment during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna. This will prevent damage to the equipment due to lightning and power-line surges.

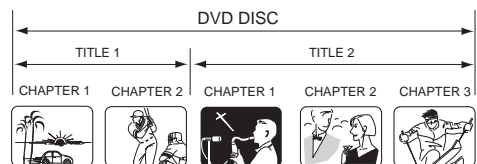

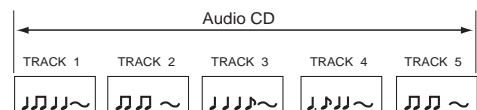

#### Removing the Disc from its case

- Do not drop or bend the disc.



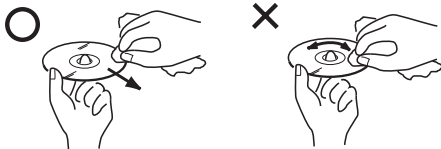
#### Storing discs

- Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.



## QUICK REFERENCE

### Ventilation & Cleaning Tips

Keep your TV/DVD in a well ventilated area and make sure not to place it by a heat source or use near water. The TV/DVD is designed for AC use only and should be used with supplied AC cord.



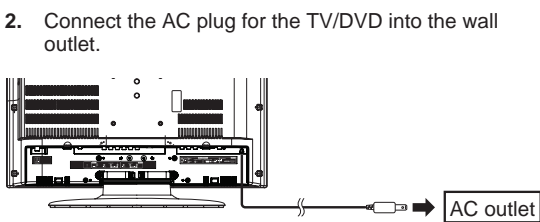
Clean the screen by spraying a soft lint free cloth with water to lightly moisten. Gently wipe and avoid pressing on the screen. To clean the outer cabinet, use the same method. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.



The screen is glass and can be scratched or broken when dropped or impacted.

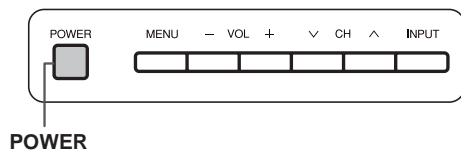
1. Attach your antenna to the back of the TV/DVD.

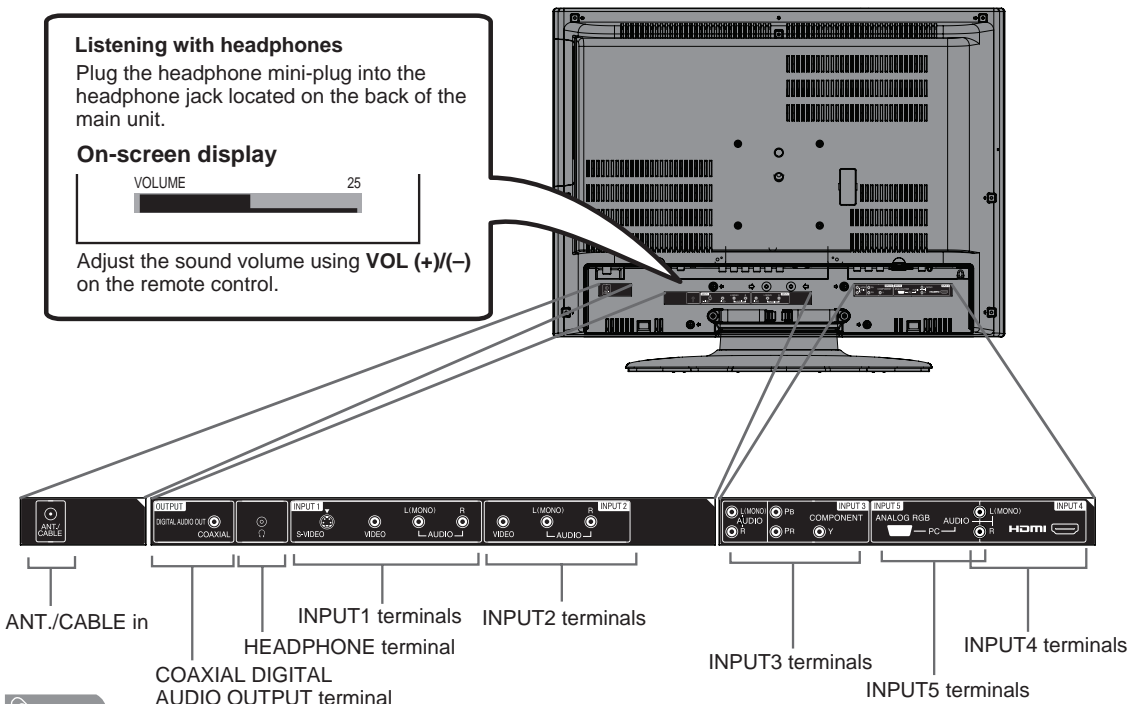
### Listening with headphones

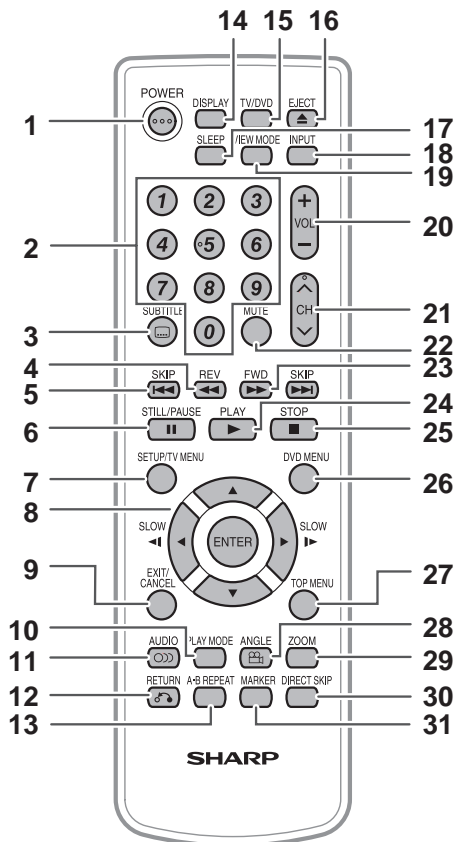

- 13 **A-B REPEAT:** Repeat playback between A and B. (See page 32.)

- 14 **DISPLAY:** Display the current channel (or input source) information on the screen. Press again to clear the display.
  - Analog channel status will display on the screen for approx. 4 seconds.
- 15 **TV/DVD:** Switch between TV/AV and DVD. (See pages 13, 29.)
- 16 **EJECT:** Eject the disc. (See page 30.)
- 17 **SLEEP:** Set a time when the TV automatically switches to standby. Each time you this button, the sleep timer automatically starts counting down.
  - If you want to adjust the sleep timer again, you can press this button repeatedly then change the time setting.
  - Select "0h00m" by pressing SLEEP repeatedly to cancel the sleep timer.
  - The TV will enter the standby mode when the remaining time reaches zero.
- 18 **INPUT:** Select input source. (TV, INPUT1-5) (See page 20.)
- 19 **VIEW MODE:** Select the screen size. (See page 22.)
- 20 **VOL +/-:** Set the volume. (See page 13.)
- 21 **CH ^/∨ :** Select the channel. (See page 13.)
- 22 **MUTE:** Mute the sound. "MUTE" will be displayed on the screen, and the sound is silenced. The muting feature can be released by pressing this button again or one of the VOL +/- buttons.
- 23 **FWD:** Fast forward playback. (See page 31.)
- 24 **PLAY:** Playback. (See page 30.)
- 25 **STOP:** Stop. (See page 30.)
- 26 **DVD MENU:** Display DVD menu. (See page 33.)
- 27 **TOP MENU:** Select title. (See page 33.)
- 28 **ANGLE:** Change playback channel. (See page 33.)
- 29 **ZOOM:** Zoom. (See page 31.)
- 30 **DIRECT SKIP:** Locating desired scene of DVD. (See page 31.)
- 31 **MARKER:** Index (DVD). (See page 32.)

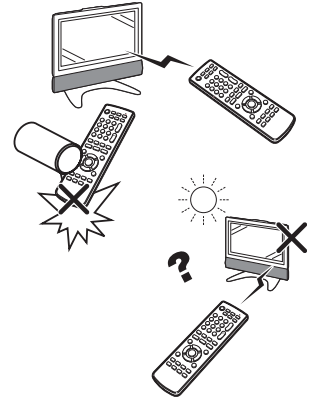
# Preparation

## Using the remote control unit

Use the remote control unit by pointing it towards the remote control sensor on the TV. Objects between the remote control unit and the remote control sensor may prevent proper operation.

## Cautions regarding remote control unit

- Do not expose the remote control unit to shock. In addition, do not expose the remote control unit to liquids, and do not place in an area with high humidity.
- Do not install or place the remote control unit under direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformation of the remote control unit.
- The remote control unit may not work properly if the remote control sensor on the TV is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such cases, change the angle of the lighting or the TV, or operate the remote control unit closer to the remote control sensor.

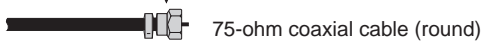


## Antennas

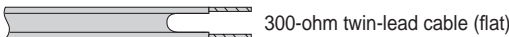
To enjoy a clearer picture, use an outdoor antenna. The following is a brief explanation of the types of connections that are used for a coaxial cable. If your outdoor antenna uses a 75-ohm coaxial cable with an F-type connector, plug it into the antenna terminal at the rear of the TV set.

1. A 75-ohm system is generally a round cable with F-type connector that can easily be attached to a terminal without tools (Commercially available).

F-type connector



2. A 300-ohm system is a flat "twin-lead" cable that can be attached to a 75-ohm terminal through a 300/75-ohm adapter (Commercially available).



## NOTICE F-type connector should be finger-tightened only.

When connecting the RF cable to the TV set, do not tighten F-type connector with tools. If tools are used, it may cause damage to your TV set. (The breaking of internal circuit, etc.)

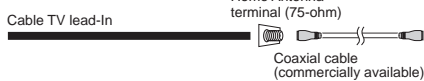

## Preparation

Perform the following steps before you press **POWER** on the remote control unit.

1. Insert the batteries into the remote control unit. (See page 8.)
2. Connect the antenna cable to the TV/DVD. (See page 12.)
3. Plug in the AC cord to the AC outlet. (See page 7.)

## Turning on the power

Press **POWER** on the TV/DVD, or **POWER** on the remote control.

- POWER indicator (Green): The TV/DVD is on.

## Select the TV mode

Press **TV/DVD** to select the TV mode.

### NOTE

- The LANGUAGE setup menu will appear automatically when **TV MENU** is pressed on for the first time.

## Turning off the power

Press **POWER** on the TV/DVD, or **POWER** on the remote control.

- The TV enters standby mode and the image on the screen disappears.
- The POWER indicator on the TV/DVD changes to Red.

### NOTE

- If you are not going to use this TV/DVD for a long period of time, be sure to remove the AC cord from the power outlet.
- Weak electric power is still consumed even when **POWER** is turned off.
- If a station being viewed stops broadcasting, the TV will automatically shut itself off after 15 minutes.

## Changing channels

You can change channels in several ways.

### Method 1

Using **CH ^/v** on the remote control unit or on the TV/DVD.

### Method 2

Using remote control buttons **0-9** to select channels for VHF/UHF/CATV.

**To select a 1 or 2-digit channel number (e. g., Channel 5):**  
Press **5**

**To select a 3-digit channel number (e. g., Channel 115):**  
Press **1→1→5**

### NOTE

- When selecting a 1-digit channel number, it is not necessary to press **0** before the number.
- If you push "0" by itself, nothing will happen.
- Complete the above steps within a few seconds.

## Changing volume/sound

### Changing the volume

You can change the volume on the TV/DVD or on the remote control unit.

Using **VOL +/-**

- To increase the volume, press **VOL +**.
- To decrease the volume, press **VOL -**.



### NOTE

- **VOL +/-** on the TV/DVD operates the same as **VOL +/-** on the remote control unit.

#### Skipping stored channel

You can set channel selection disabled using CH ^/∨.

- 1 Select the channel you want to skip.
- 2 Press TV MENU and the MENU screen displays.
- 3 Press ◀/▶ to select (SETUP).
- 4 Press ▲/▼ to select "ADD/DELETE".
- 5 Press ◀/▶ to select "DELETE" for selected channel.
- 6 Press EXIT to return to the normal screen. Now, skipping channel is applied.

- To skip the other channels: Repeat steps 1-6.
- To release the skipping channel: Select "ADD" in step 5.

## Watching TV

### Setting MTS/SAP stereo mode

The TV/DVD has a feature that allows reception of sound other than the main audio for the program. This feature is called Multi-channel Television Sound (MTS). The TV/DVD with MTS can receive mono sound, stereo sound and Secondary Audio Programs (SAP). The SAP feature allows a TV/DVD station to broadcast other information, which could be audio in another language or something completely different like weather information.

**You can enjoy Hi-Fi stereo sound or SAP broadcasts where available.**

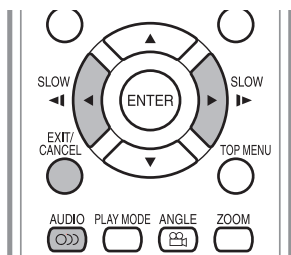
- **Stereo broadcasts**  
View programs like live sporting events, shows and concerts in dynamic stereo sound.
- **SAP broadcasts**  
Receive TV broadcasts in either MAIN or SAP sound.  
MAIN sound: The normal program soundtrack (either in mono or stereo).  
SAP sound: Listen to a second language, supplementary commentary or other information. (SAP is mono sound.)

**If stereo sound is difficult to hear.**

- Obtain a clearer sound by manually switching to fixed mono-sound mode.

#### NOTE

- MTS only operates while in TV mode.
- When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word "STEREO" or "SAP" displays on-screen every time you turn the TV on, change the channel, or press **DISPLAY**.

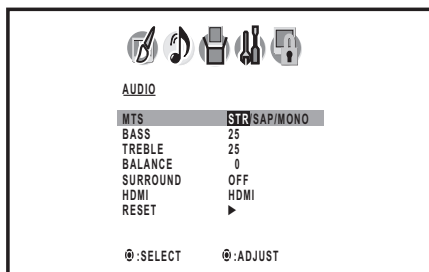


### Changing MTS

You can change MTS as shown below to match the television broadcast signal.

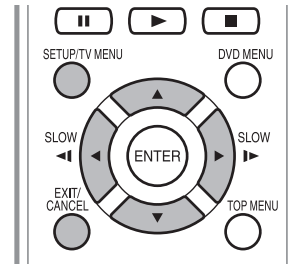

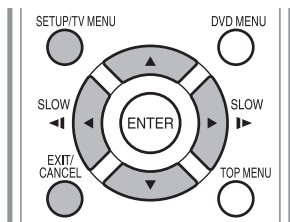
### Closed captions


Your TV/DVD is equipped with an internal Closed Caption decoder. It allows you to view conversations, narration and sound effects as subtitles on your TV/DVD. Closed Captions are available on some TV programs and on some VHS home video tapes at the discretion of the program provider.

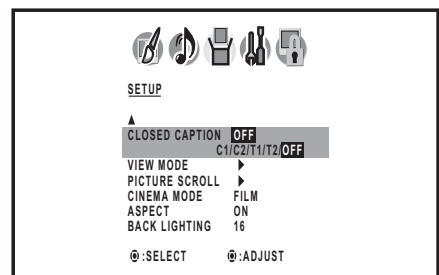
Not all programs and VHS videotapes offer closed captions. Please look for the "CC" symbol to ensure that captions will be shown.

In the Closed Caption system, there can be more than one caption service provided. Each is identified by its own number. The "C1" and "C2" services display subtitles of TV programs superimposed over the program's picture. Generally, Closed Captions in English are transmitted on C1 and Closed Captions in other languages are transmitted on C2.

In the Closed Caption system, the "Text1" or "Text2" services display text that is unrelated to the program being viewed (e.g., weather or news). These services are also superimposed over the program currently being viewed.



- 1 Tune the TV to the desired program.
- 2 Press **TV MENU** and the MENU screen displays.
- 3 Press ◀/▶ to select  (SETUP).
- 4 Press ▲/▼ to select "CLOSED CAPTION".
- 5 Press ◀/▶ to select your desired Closed Caption mode.



- 6 Press **EXIT** to return to the normal screen.

#### NOTE

- To turn the Closed Caption feature off, select "OFF".

#### NOTE

- If the program or video you selected is not closed-captioned, no captions will display on-screen.
- If text is not available in your viewing area, a black rectangle may appear on-screen. If this happens, set the Closed Caption feature to "OFF".
- When selecting Closed Captions, the captioning will be delayed approx. 10 seconds.
- If no caption signal is received, no captions will appear, but the television will remain in the Caption Mode.
- Misspellings or unusual characters may occasionally appear during Closed Captioning. This is normal with Closed Captioning, especially with live programs. This is because during live programs, captions are also entered live. These transmissions do not allow time for editing.
- When Captions are being displayed, on-screen displays, such as volume and mute may be seen but may interfere with Closed Captions.
- Some Cable TV systems and copy protection systems may interfere with the Closed Captioned signal.
- If using an indoor antenna or if TV reception is very poor, the Closed Caption Decoder may not appear or may appear with strange characters or misspelled words. In this case, adjust the antenna for better reception or use an outdoor antenna.

### Password setting for parental control


Allows you to use a password to protect certain settings from being accidentally changed.

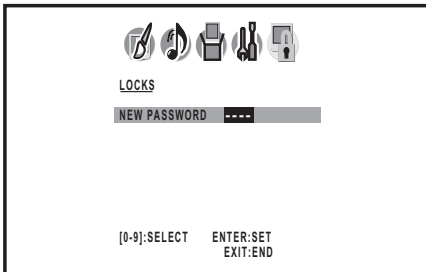

## Useful adjustment settings

### Parental control (V-CHIP)

V-CHIP is an electronic filtering device built into your TV/DVD. This tool gives parents a great degree of control over broadcasts accessed by their children. It allows parents to select programs judged suitable for child viewing while blocking ones judged not suitable. It does so automatically once you activate the V-CHIP feature in your TV/DVD.

**V-CHIP SET menu will not be selectable from the menu if you do not first configure your password.**  
(See page 24 for password setting for parental control.)

- The U.S. has two rating systems for viewing content: movie ratings and TV Parental Guidelines.
- The TV Parental Guidelines work in conjunction with the V-CHIP to help parents screen out inappropriate television shows from their children.
- Movie ratings are used for original movies rated by the Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) as watched on cable TV and not edited for television. The V-CHIP can also be set to block MPAA-rated movies.

## Preparation

Perform the following steps before you press **POWER** on the remote control unit.

1. Insert the batteries into the remote control unit. (See page 8.)
2. Connect the antenna cable to the TV/DVD. (See page 12.)
3. Plug in the AC cord to the AC outlet. (See page 7.)

## Turning on the power

Press **POWER** on the TV/DVD, or **POWER** on the remote control.

- POWER indicator (Green): The TV/DVD is on.

## Select the DVD mode

Press **TV/DVD** to select the DVD mode.

## Turning off the power

Press **POWER** on the TV/DVD, or **POWER** on the remote control.

- The TV/DVD enters standby mode and the image on the screen disappears.
- The POWER indicator on the TV/DVD changes to Red.

### NOTE

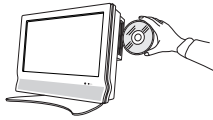
- If you are not going to use this TV/DVD for a long period of time, be sure to remove the AC cord from the power outlet.
- Weak electric power is still consumed even when **POWER** is turned off.
- If a station being viewed stops broadcasting, the TV/DVD will automatically shut itself off after 15 minutes. (TV mode only.)

## Watching the DVD

### Playback procedure

1

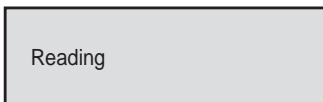
Place the disc in the disc slot with the label side facing forward. (If the disc has a label.) Hold the disc without touching its surface, align it with the guides, and place it in position.



2

On the screen, "▲" changes to "Reading" and then playback will commence.

- A menu screen appear on the TV screen, if the disc has a menu feature. In this case, press ▲/▼/◀/▶ or ENTER to operate a menu feature.

Press **STOP** to end playback.

- The unit memorizes the stopped point, depending on the disc. "■" appears on the screen. Press **PLAY** to resume playback (from the scene point).
- If you press **STOP** again ("■" appears on the screen) or unload the disc, the TV/DVD will clear the stopped point.

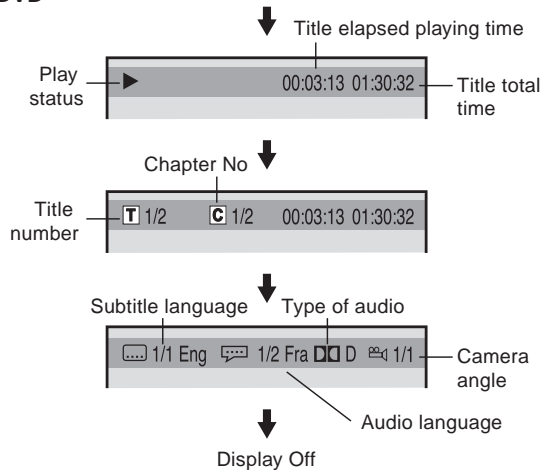
Press **EJECT**.

Remove the disc and then press **POWER**. The TV/DVD turns off. When you eject the disc, you may hear mechanism noise, but it is not malfunction.

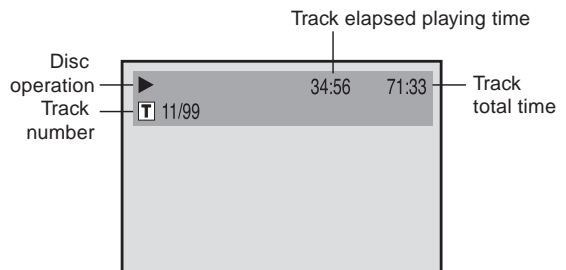

#### NOTE

##### If the TV/DVD does not operate properly:

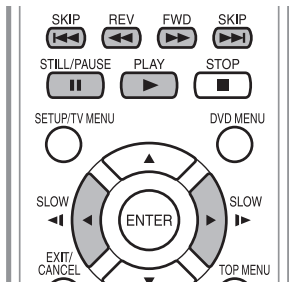
Static electricity, etc., may affect the player's operation. Disconnect the AC power cord once, then connect it again.

#### NOTE

- If a non-compatible disc is loaded, "Incorrect Disc", "Region Code Error" or "Parental Error" will appear on the TV screen according to the type of loaded disc. If these appear, check your disc again (see pages 5 and 41).
- Some discs may take a minute or so to start playback.
- When an 8 cm disc is placed into the disc slot, and the playback picture or menu display does not appear, press **PLAY**.
- A "Prohibition" symbol "⊘" may appear at the upper left of the screen. This symbol means either the feature you tried is not available on the disc, or the TV/DVD cannot access the feature at this time. This does not indicate a problem with the TV/DVD.
- When you set a single-faced disc label downwards (i.e. the wrong way up) "Reading" will appear on the display and then "Incorrect Disc" will be displayed.
- Some playback operations of DVDs may be intentionally fixed by software producers. Since this TV/DVD plays DVDs according to the disc content recorded, some playback features may not be available. Also refer to the instructions supplied with the DVDs.

## Watching the DVD

### Special playback



#### Fast Forward Playback

Press **FWD** during normal playback.

Each press of **FWD** will increase the speed of the search

#### Review Playback

Press **REV** during normal playback.

◀◀ (x 2), ◀◀◀◀ (x 4), ◀◀◀◀◀◀ (x 8), ◀◀◀◀◀◀◀◀ (x 15).

(CD: ◀◀ (x 2), ◀◀◀◀ (x 4), ◀◀◀◀◀◀ (x 8), ◀◀◀◀◀◀◀◀ (x 20))

- To resume normal playback, press **PLAY**.
- The above figure shown in parentheses indicates the average speed multiplier.

#### Still Playback

Press **STILL/PAUSE** during normal playback to pause playback.

- To resume normal playback, press **PLAY**.



#### Frame Advance

Press **STILL/PAUSE** during still playback.

One frame is advanced each time you press **STILL/PAUSE**.

- To resume normal playback, press **PLAY**.

#### Slow-motion Playback

Press **SLOW** (▶|) or **SLOW** (◀|) during normal playback or still playback.

Each press of **SLOW** will change the speed of the slow x1/2, x1/4, x1/6, x1/7.

- To resume normal playback, press **PLAY**.
- To resume the still playback, press **STILL/PAUSE**.

#### Locating a chapter or track

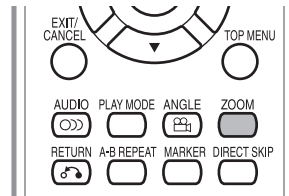
Press **SKIP** (▶▶) Forward or **SKIP** (◀◀) Reverse during playback to locate a chapter that you want to watch.

Each time you press the button, a chapter or track is skipped.

#### NOTE

The TV/DVD is capable of holding a still video image or On screen display image on your television screen indefinitely. If you leave the still video image or On screen display image displayed on your TV for an extended period of time, you risk permanent damage to your television screen.

### Zooming



This TV/DVD will allow you to zoom in on the frame image. You can then make selections by switching the position of the frame.

1

Press **ZOOM** during playback.

The center part of the image will be zoomed in.

Each press of **ZOOM** will change the ZOOM magnification Q<sub>1</sub> (x 1.3), Q<sub>2</sub> (x 1.5) and Q<sub>3</sub> (x 2.0).

2

Press **▲/▼/◀/▶** to view a different part of the frame.

You may move the frame from the center position UP, DOWN, LEFT or RIGHT.

3

In the zoom mode press **ZOOM** repeatedly to return to a 1:1 view (Q Off).

#### NOTE

- You can select the Still Playback or Fast Forward (Review) Playback in the zoom mode.
- Some discs may not respond to zoom feature.

### Locating desired scene

Use the title, chapter and time recorded on the disc to locate the desired point to playback.

Press **DIRECT SKIP** during playback.

Press **◀/▶** to select the "L" (Time), "T" (Title) or "C" (Chapter).

Press **Number buttons (0-9)** to input the number.

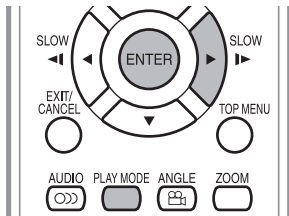
- If you input a wrong number, press **CANCEL**.
- Refer to the package supplied with the disc to check the numbers.

Press **ENTER**.

- Playback starts.
- When you change the title, playback starts from Chapter 1 of the selected title.
- Some discs may not work in the above operation.

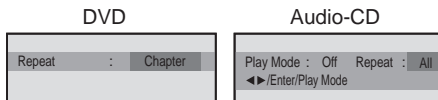

**1** Press **PLAY MODE** during playback or stop mode.

**2** Press **ENTER** to select "Chapter" or "Title".

- In case of Audio-CD, first press **▶** to select "Repeat" and then press **ENTER** to select "Track" or "All".

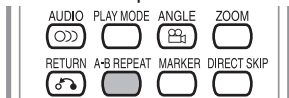

- To resume normal playback, select Repeat "Off".

## A-B Repeat playback

A-B repeat playback allows you to repeat material between two selected points.



**1** Press **A-B REPEAT** during playback. The start point is selected.

**2** Press **A-B REPEAT** again. The end point is selected. Playback starts at the point that you selected. Playback stops at the end point, returns to Point A automatically, then starts again.

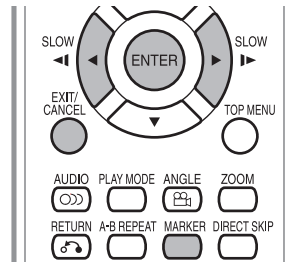
- To resume normal playback press **A-B REPEAT** again. "Off" appears on the screen.

### NOTE

- In A-B Repeat mode, subtitles near the A or B locations may not be displayed.
- You cannot set the A-B Repeat for the scenes that include multiple angles.
- You may not be able to set A-B Repeat during certain scenes of the DVD.
- A-B Repeat does not work with an interactive DVD, MP3/WMA/JPEG-CD.

## Marking desired scenes

The TV/DVD stores the points that you want to watch again up to 3 points. You can resume playback from each scene.



### Marking the scenes

**1** Press **MARKER** during playback.



**2** Select the blank Marker using **◀/▶**, then press **ENTER** at the desired scene.

- Up to 3 scenes can be selected.
- Repeat this procedure to set the other 2 scenes.

**3** Press **MARKER** to return to the normal screen.

### Returning to the scenes

**1** Press **MARKER** during playback or stop mode.

**2** Press **◀/▶** to select the Marker 1-3.

**3** Press **ENTER**. Playback starts from the marked scene.

### To cancel the Marker

Follow the above steps 1~2, then press **CANCEL**.

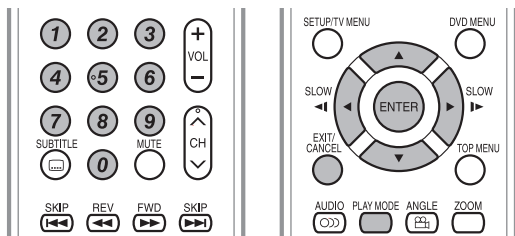

- Some discs may not work with the marking operation.
- The marking is cancelled when you eject the disc or turn the power off.
- Some subtitles recorded around the marker may fail to appear.

## Watching the DVD

### Program playback (only CD)

You can arrange the order of tracks on the disc.

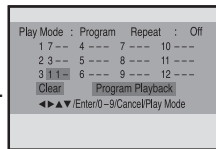


**1** Press **PLAY MODE** in the stop mode.

**2** Press **◀▶** to select "Play Mode", then press **ENTER** to select "Program".

**3** **Example:** In case you wish to program in order of 7, 3, 11: Enter as **7 ▼, 3 ▼, 11.**

- If you input a wrong number, press **CANCEL**.



**4** Press **▲/▼/◀▶** to select "Program Playback" and press **ENTER**. "Program Playback" will appear on the screen. The program you selected will begin to playback in the order set. To return to normal playback, select "Play Mode: Off" at step 2 above.

#### NOTE

- To cancel program play, select "Clear" at step 4 and press **ENTER**.
- The program is cancelled when you eject the disc or turn the power off.

### Random playback (only CD)

**1** Press **PLAY MODE** during playback or stop mode.

**2** Press **◀▶** to select "Play Mode", then press **ENTER** to select "Random".

**3** Press **PLAY**. "Random Play" will appear on the screen and Random playback will start. To return to normal playback, select "Play Mode : Off" at step 2 above.

#### NOTE

- Random playback cannot be combined with Repeat playback.

### Changing angles

When playing back a disc recorded with multi-angle facility, you can change the view angle.

**1** Press **ANGLE** during playback. The current angle will appear.



**2** Press **ANGLE** repeatedly until the desired angle is selected.

#### NOTE

- In case of JPEG-playback, the JPEG-image is rotated 90 degrees to the right.
- Depending on the DVD, you may not be able to change the angles even if multi-angles are recorded on the DVD.

### Title selection

Two or more titles are recorded on some discs. If the title menu is recorded on the disc, you can select the desired title.

**1** Press **TOP MENU** during playback. Title menu appears on the screen.

**2** Press **▲/▼/◀▶** to select the desired title.

**3** Press **ENTER** or **PLAY**. The playback of the selected title will start.

### DVD menu

Some DVDs allow you to select the disc contents using the menu.

When you play back these DVDs, you can select the subtitle language and soundtrack language, etc. using the DVD menu.

**1** Press **DVD MENU** during playback. The DVD menu appears on the screen.

- Press **DVD MENU** again to resume playback at the scene when you pressed **DVD MENU**.

**2** Press **▲/▼/◀▶** to select the desired item.

**3** Press **ENTER**. The menu continues to another screen. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to set additional items if any.

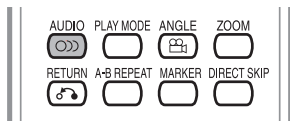
#### NOTE

- Depending on the DVD, you may not be able to select the title. Depending on the DVD, a "title menu" may simply be called a "menu" or "title" in the instructions supplied with the disc.

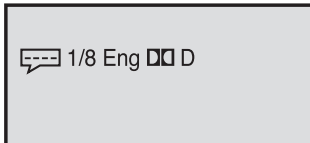

### Changing soundtrack language

You can select the language when you play a multilingual disc.



- 1 Press **AUDIO** during playback. The current soundtrack language will appear.



- 2 Press **AUDIO** repeatedly until the desired language is selected. The on-screen display will disappear after a few seconds.



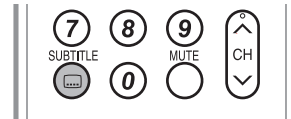

- If the desired language is not heard after pressing **AUDIO** several times, the language is not recorded on the disc.
- Changing soundtrack language is cancelled when you eject the disc. The initial default language or available language will be heard if the disc is played back again.

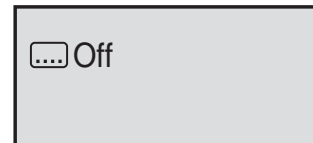

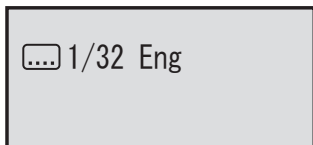
You can select the language when playing back a disc recorded with multi-lingual subtitles.



- 1 Press **SUBTITLE** repeatedly during playback until your desired language appears.



- 2 The on-screen display will disappear after a few seconds.



#### Turning the subtitles on and off

Press **SUBTITLE** during playback until "Off" appears.

#### NOTE

- Changing subtitle language is cancelled when you eject the disc.
- Some functions may not work on some DVDs. You may not be able to turn subtitles on or off or change subtitles. While playing the DVD, the subtitle may change when:
  - you eject or insert the disc.
  - you change the title.
- In some cases, the subtitle language is not changed to the selected one immediately.



# MP3/WMA/JPEG CD playback

This TV/DVD can playback the MP3/WMA/JPEG-data which has been recorded on CD-R or CD-RW. To produce the MP3/WMA/JPEG-data, you need a Windows-PC with CD-R/RW drive and a MP3/WMA/JPEG-encoding Software (not supplied).

The Apple-HFS-System cannot be played.

## NOTE

This TV/DVD requires discs/recordings to meet certain technical standards in order to achieve optimal playback quality. Pre-recorded DVDs are automatically set to these standards. There are many different types of recordable disc formats (including CD-R containing MP3/WMA files). Given the fact that technology in this area is still maturing, This unit cannot guarantee that all genre of recordable discs will produce optimal playback quality. The technical criteria set out in this owner's manual are meant as a guide only.

Please be advised that you must obtain permission from the applicable copyright owners to download copyrighted content, including music files, in any format, including the MP3 and WMA formats, prior to the downloading thereof.

## MP3/WMA /JPEG CD information

### Limitations on MP3/WMA/JPEG CD playback

- MP3/WMA/JPEG CD is the disc that is standardized by ISO9660, its file name must include 3-digits extension letters, "mp3", "wma", "jpg".
- MP3/WMA/JPEG CD must be correspond to the ISO standardized files.
- This TV/DVD can read 600 files per disc. If one directory has more than 600 files, it reads up to 600 files, the remaining files will be omitted.
- The unit is able to recognize up to a maximum of 50 directories per disc.
- MP3/WMA/JPEG CDs cannot be used for the purpose of recording.
- If the CD has both audio tracks and MP3/WMA/JPEG files, only audio tracks are played.
- It may take more than one minute for this unit to read MP3/WMA/JPEG files depending on its structure.
- Music recorded by "Joliet Recording Specification" can be played back, the file name is displayed (within 16 letters) on the screen. Long file names will be condensed.
- The music files recorded by "Hierarchical File System" (HFS) cannot be played.

### Limitations on display

- The maximum number for display is 16 letters.  
Available letters for display are the following: capital or small alphabets of A through Z, numbers of 0 through 9, and \_ (under score).
- Other letters than those above are replaced in hyphen.

### Notes on MP3/WMA/JPEG files

To playback MP3/WMA/JPEG CD in the recorded order,

1. Use MP3/WMA/JPEG software that records data alphabetically or numerically.
2. Name each file including two-digit or three-digit number (ex. "01" "02" or "001" "002").
3. Refrain from making too many sub-folders.

### CAUTION:

- Some MP3/WMA/JPEG CDs cannot be played back depending on the recording conditions.
- The CD-R/RW that has no music data or non MP3/WMA/JPEG files cannot be played back.

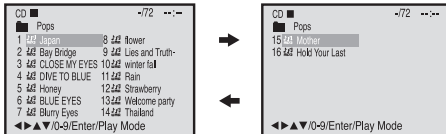

**MP3/WMA CD playback**

- 1 Load a disc on which MP3 or WMA files have been recorded in the disc slot.
- 2 "Reading" will appear on the TV screen. Reading time will depend on the number of files on the disc.
- 3 A file menu screen will appear on the TV screen. Press ◀▶ to select a folder.



- 4 Press ▲/▼/◀▶ or a **Number button (0-9)** to select the desired file.
  - In case the folder includes more than 15 files, press ◀▶ to display next file list.

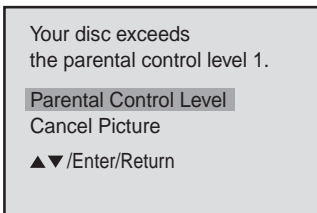


### Temporary disabling of rating level by DVD disc

Depending on the DVD disc, the disc may try to temporarily cancel the rating level that you have set. It is up to you to decide whether to cancel the rating level or not.

**1** Load a DVD disc. (See page 30.)

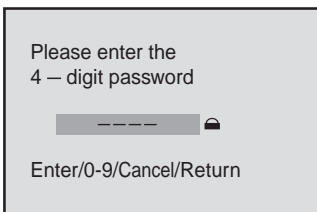
**2** If the DVD disc has been designed to temporarily cancel the rating level, the screen which follows the "Reading" screen will change, depending on which disc is played. If you select "YES" with pressing **ENTER**, "Your disc exceeds the parental control level 1." (e.g.) screen will then appear.



**3** If you wish to cancel the set rating level temporarily, select "Parental Control Level" with ▲/▼, then press **ENTER**. If the 4-digits password at step 5 on page 41 has been set, the password entering screen will appear as shown in step 4 below. Alternatively, if the password has not been set, playback will commence. If you don't know (or have forgotten) the password, select "Cancel Picture". The setting screen will disappear. Press **EJECT** to remove the disc.

**4** Enter the password with **Number buttons (0-9)**. Then press **ENTER**.

- If you interrupt the entering, press **RETURN**.



**5** Playback will commence if the entered password was correct.

#### NOTE

- This temporary cancellation of the rating level will be kept until the disc is ejected. When the disc is ejected, the original rating level will be set again automatically.

## Cautions regarding use in high and low temperature environments

- When the TV/DVD is used in a low temperature space (e.g. room, office), the picture may leave trails or appear slightly delayed. This is not a malfunction, and the TV/DVD will recover when the temperature returns to normal.
  - Do not leave the TV/DVD in a hot or cold location. Also, do not leave the TV/DVD in a location exposed to direct sunlight or near a heater, as this may cause the cabinet to deform and the Liquid Crystal panel to malfunction.
- Storage temperature: -4°F to +140°F (-20°C to +60°C)

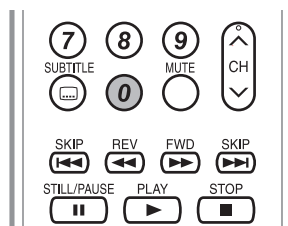
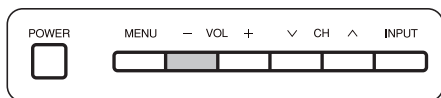

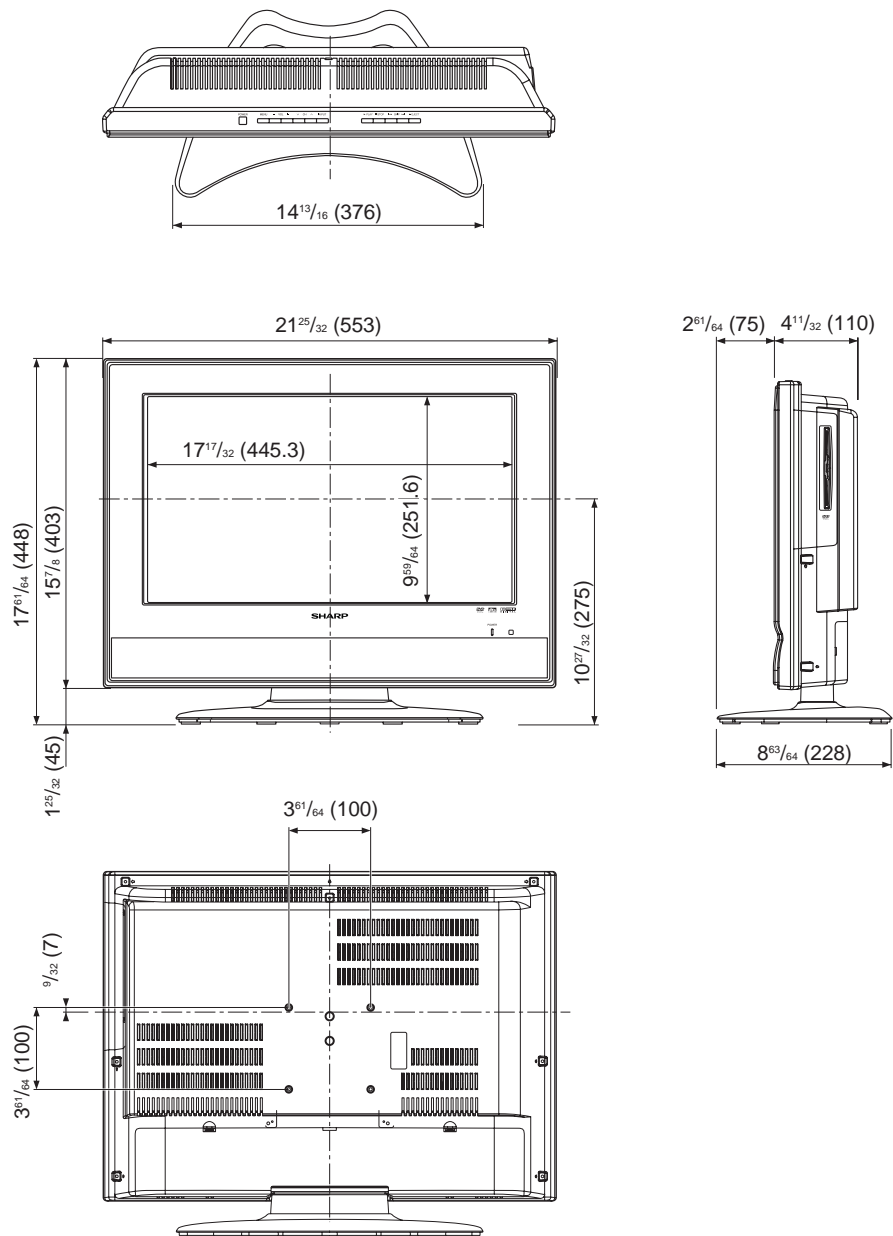
