Chapter 1. SETUP & PREPARATION BEFORE USE

Choosing a Suitable Place for Your Fax Machine

Use the following list as a guide to find a suitable place for your fax machine.

The Good Places...

Place your fax machine on a flat, stable surface, such as a desk.

Select a place that is free from vibration and shocks.

Locate it near a telephone socket and a standard, grounded power outlet.

And the Bad Places...

Avoid setting it up in a busy location.

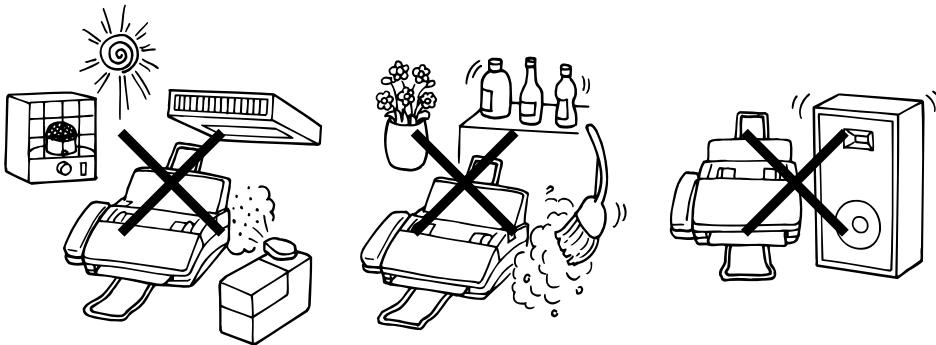
Avoid setting up the machine near heaters, air conditioners, water, chemicals, or refrigerators.

Do not select a place that exposes your fax machine to direct sunlight, excessive heat, moisture, or dust.

Do not connect your fax machine to electrical outlets controlled by wall switches or automatic timers. Disruption of power can wipe out information in the unit's memory.

Do not connect your fax machine to electrical outlets on the same circuit as large appliances or other equipment that might disturb the power supply.

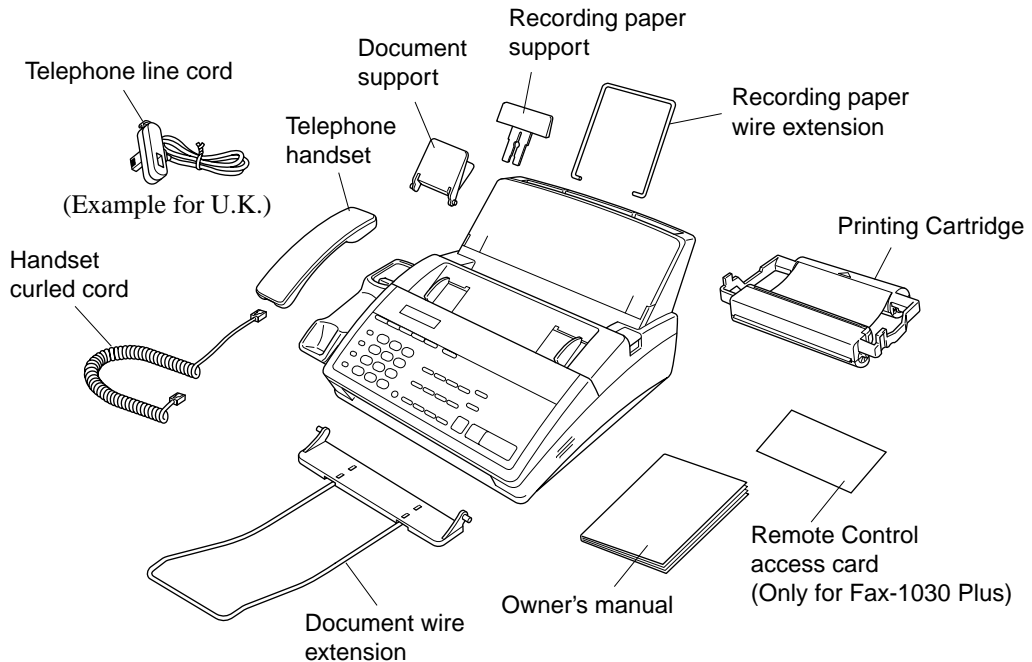
Avoid interference sources, such as speakers or the base units of cordless phones.

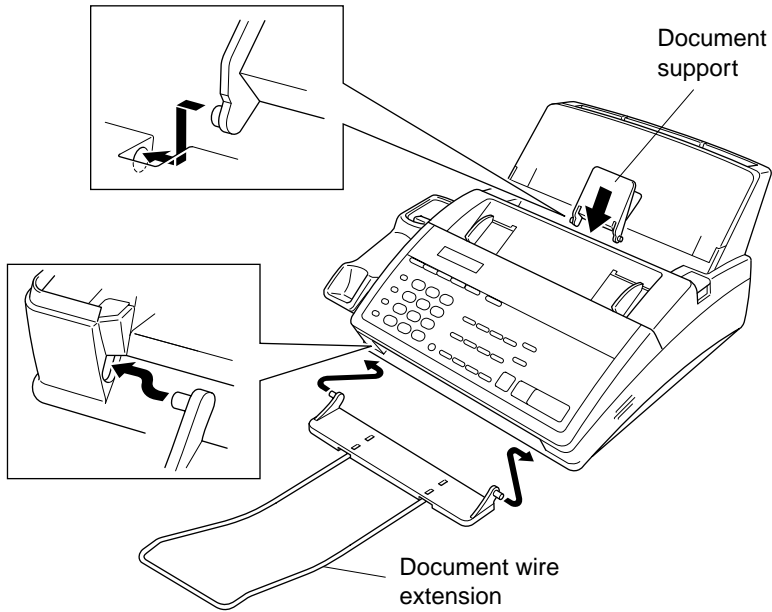

Setting up Your Fax Machine

Follow these steps to set up your fax machine.

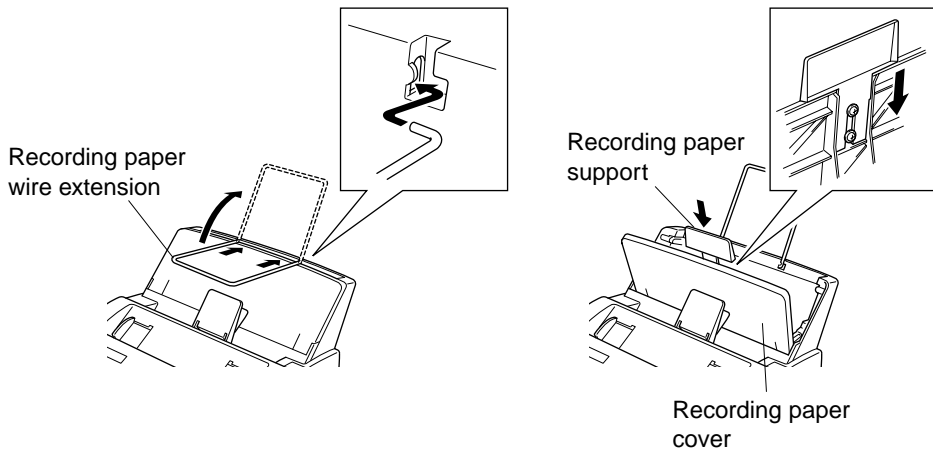
1. Attach the document supports.

- 1) Attach the document support.
- 2) Attach the document wire extension.



2. Attach the recording paper supports.

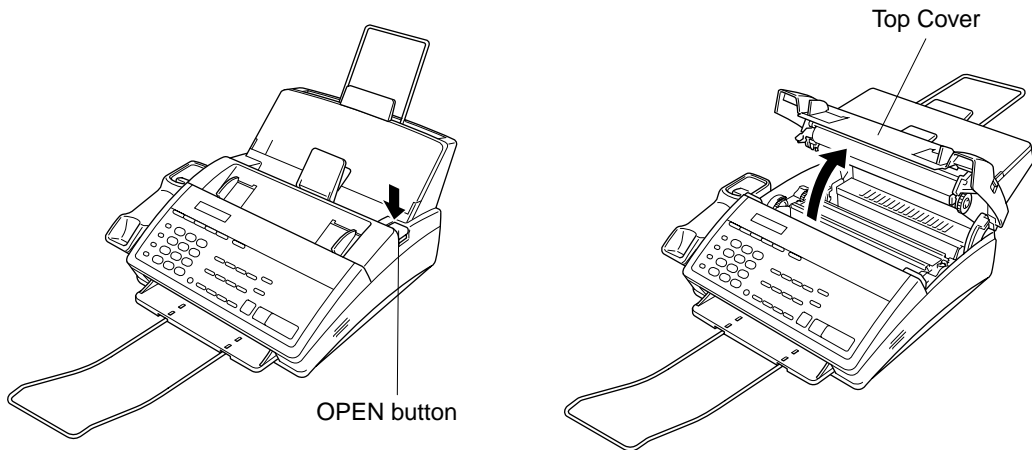
- 1) Attach the recording paper wire extension.
- 2) Open the recording paper cover. Using the groove in the cover, insert the recording paper support over the two screws are shown.



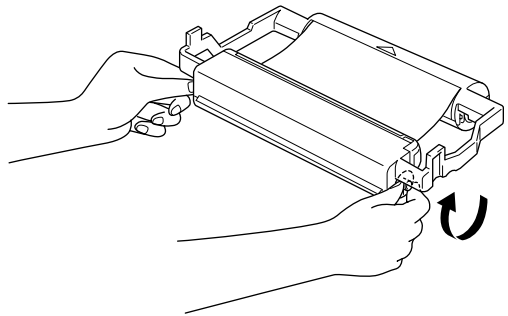

3. Install the printing cartridge.

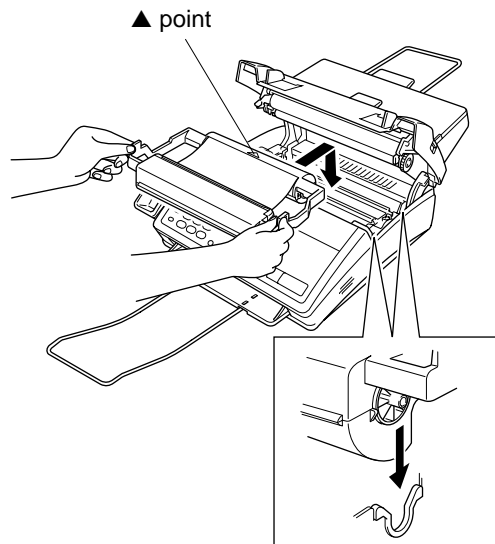
- 1) Push the OPEN button and open the top cover.



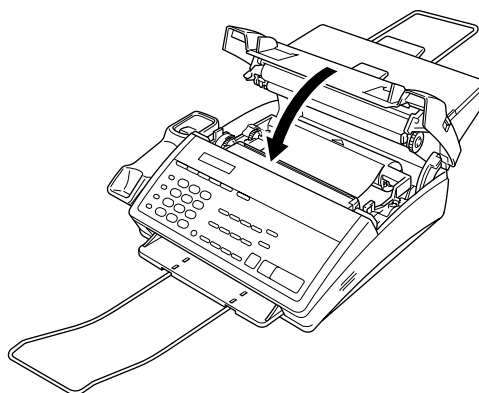
- 2) Remove the stopper for the printing cartridge. Turn the gear towards you and remove the slack in the ribbon in printing cartridge carefully.



- 3) Install the printing cartridge as shown in the illustration.



- 4) Close the cover and push down on both sides until it clicks.



4. Connect the power cord.

When you connect the power, the display will show “01/01 00:00 FAX”.

NOTE: As this machine has no power switch, it has power running to it whenever it is connected to the mains.

NOTICE

1. *This fax machine must be earthed via a 3 pin socket.*
2. *Since the machine is earthed through the power outlet, you can protect yourself from potentially hazardous electrical conditions on the telephone network by keeping the power to your fax machine on when you connect it to a telephone line.*
3. *Lightning and Power Surges can damage this product! We recommend that you use a quality Surge Protection Device on the AC power line as well as the telephone line or unplug the lines during a lightning storm.*

IMPORTANT:

(For U.K.)

If you need to remove the moulded mains plug in order to fit an appropriate type, you must discard the moulded plug immediately having cut it off, in order that it is not inadvertently inserted into a live socket, thus presenting a shock hazard. The wires in the mains lead of this appliance are coloured in accordance with the following code.

Green-and-yellow : Earth

Blue : Neutral

Brown : Live

As the wires in the mains lead of this apparatus may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:

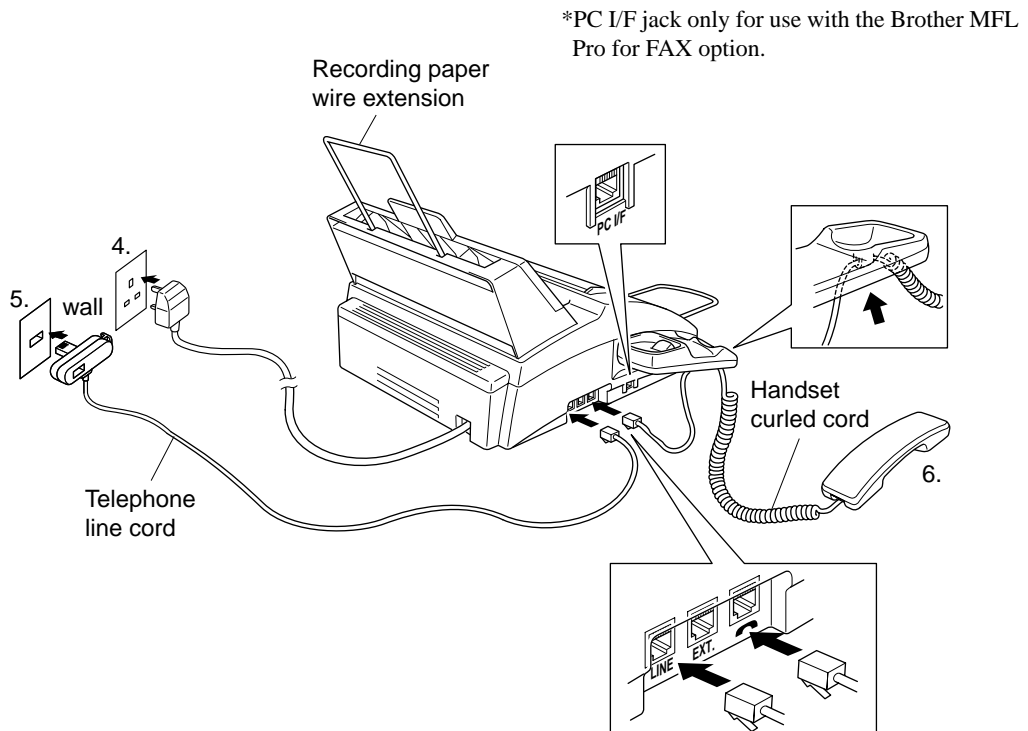
The wire which is coloured green-and-yellow must be connected to the terminal in the plug which is marked by the letter “E” or by the safety earth symbol \perp or coloured green or green-and-yellow.

The wire which is coloured blue must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter “N” or coloured black.

The wire which is coloured brown must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter “L” or coloured red.

5. Connect the telephone line.



IMPORTANT

(For U.K.)

The PC interface is a SELV (Safety Extra Low Voltage) port as defined in EN41003. It must only be connected with a SELV circuit; only the MFL Pro for Fax cable kit (available in an option pack), satisfies this requirement.

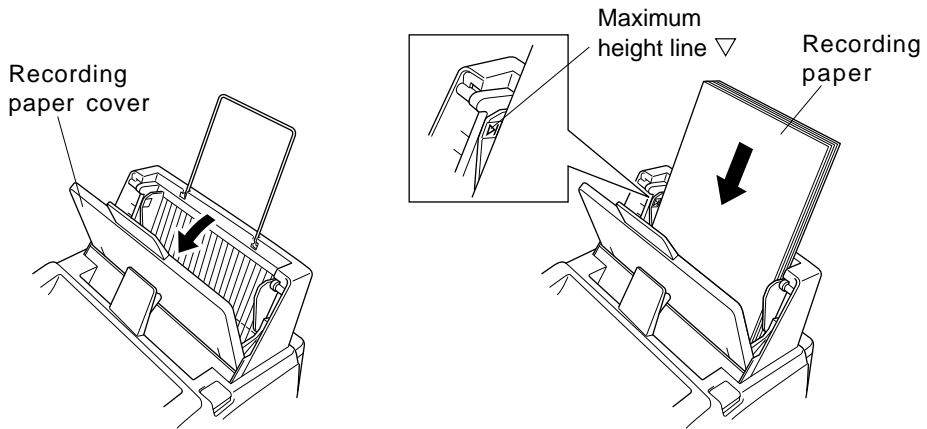
6. Connect the handset.

- 1) Connect the plug at the end of the handset cord to the socket on the side of the machine labelled with the telephone symbol.
- 2) Hook the curled cord to the handset holder.
- 3) Place the handset on the cradle.

7. Setting the recording paper.

- 1) Open the recording paper cover.
- 2) Place the paper (up to 200 sheets) into the recording paper sheet feeder.

NOTE: Make sure that you do not put so much paper in the sheet feeder that the Maximum height line is obscured. It is possible that paper may jam if there are too many sheets in the feeder.



- 3) Close the recording paper cover.

NOTE: If you only place a few sheets of paper in the feeder, please ensure that all the sheets are correctly aligned to prevent paper jams.

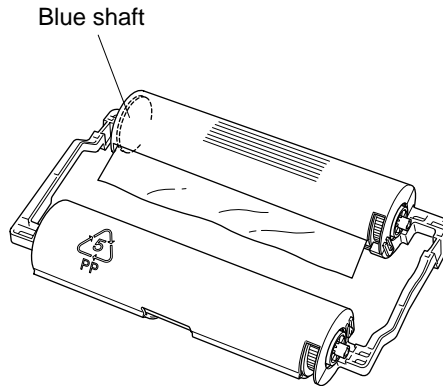

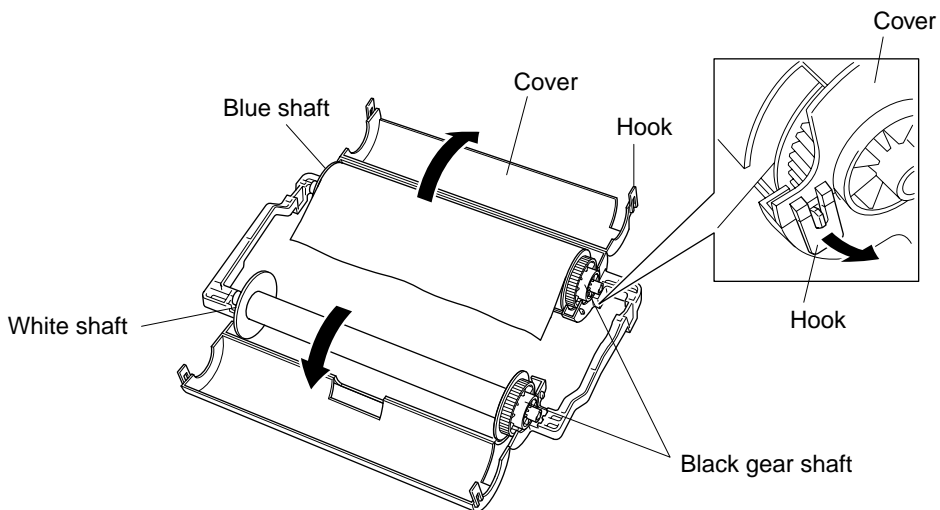

Changing the Ribbon

1. Remove the printing cartridge containing the used ribbon.
(See this chapter for removing and installing the printing cartridge.)

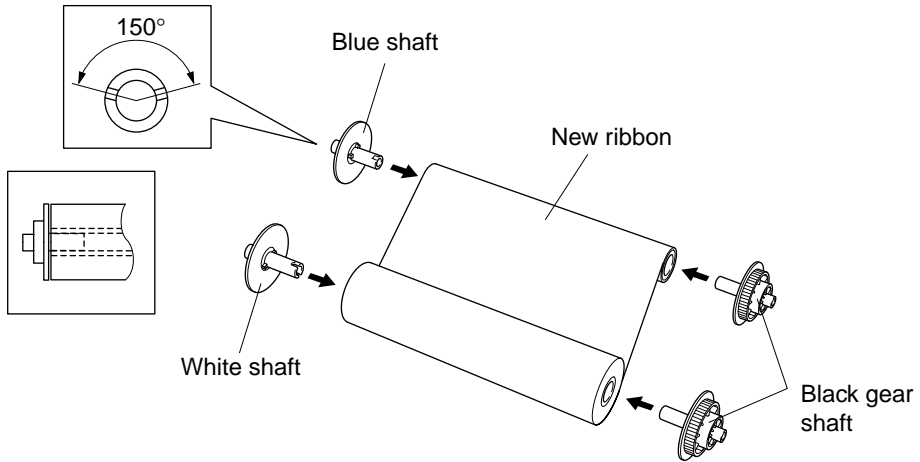


2. Position the printing cartridge (as shown in the illustration) paying special attention to the position of the blue shaft. Release the four hooks and open the cartridge covers.

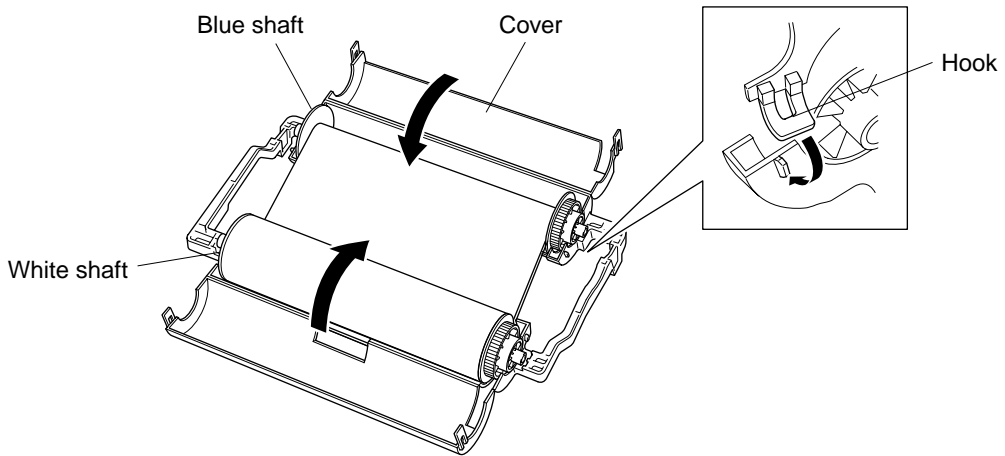


3. Take the ribbon out of the cartridge and remove the four shafts from the ends of the cardboard cores.

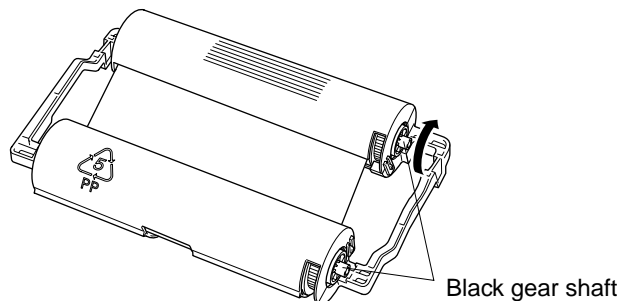
4. Install the blue, white and black shafts into the cardboard cores of the new ribbon. Pay special attention to the position of the ribbon as shown in the illustration.



5. Place the ribbon in the cartridge and close the covers, as shown in the illustration. If the shafts are not positioned correctly then the cover will not close.



6. Carefully, tighten the ribbon and put the cartridge back into the machine.



FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Multi Line Connections (PABXs)

Most offices use a central telephone system. While it is often relatively simple to connect the machine to a key system or a PABX (private automatic branch exchange), we suggest that you contact the company which installed your telephone system and ask them to connect the fax machine for you.

It is advisable to have a separate line for the fax machine. You can then leave the machine in FAX mode to receive faxes at any time of the day or night.

If the fax machine is to be connected to a multi-line system, ask your installer to connect the unit to the last line on the system. This will prevent the unit from being activated each time a telephone call is received.

Connecting to a Private Automatic Branch Exchange

The following points should be kept in mind if you are installing the machine to work as an extension to a private automatic branch exchange (PABX).

- 1) It is not guaranteed that the unit will operate correctly under all circumstances with PABXs. Any cases of difficulty should be reported first to the company that handles your PABX.*
- 2) If all incoming calls will be answered by a switchboard operator, it is recommended that the Answer Mode be set to be MANUAL; see chap. 7. All incoming calls should initially be regarded as telephone calls.*
- 3) The unit may be used with either pulse or tone dialling telephone lines.*

Ringer Equivalence Number (REN) (For U.K. only)

This equipment has a REN value of 1. A BT line has a "bell ringing" capacity, or REN, of 4. This means that adding downstream-connected extension telephones and/or extension bells to a total REN of greater than 4 may cause a reduction in the bell volume. In extreme cases, it may cause the auto-answer facility of the machine to fail.

Therefore, up to three additional extension telephones (each assuming a REN of 1), may be connected downstream of your machine. For an explanation of "downstream connection, read "Using extension telephones" which follows.

Unless otherwise marked, a telephone provided by BT may be assumed to have a REN value of 1.

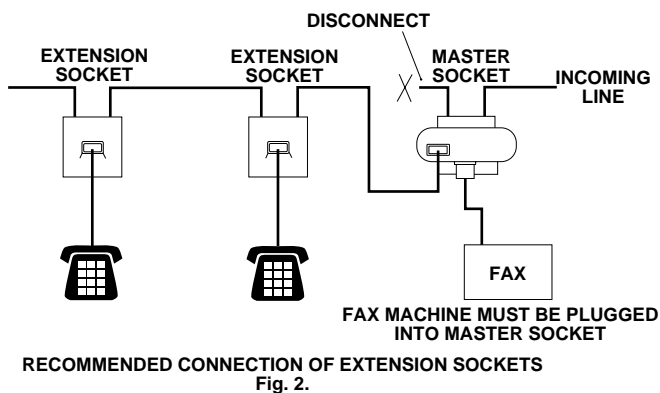
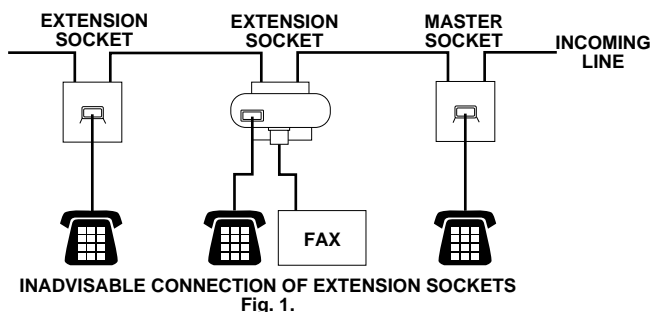
Using extension telephones

It may be that your premises are already wired with parallel extension telephones, or you intend to add extension telephones to your line, in addition to your machine. While the simplest arrangement is straightforward parallel connection, there are some reasons as to why this arrangement will cause unsatisfactory service, the most obvious of which is inadvertent interruption of a facsimile transmission by someone picking up an extension telephone in order to make an outgoing call. Additionally, remote activation may not operate reliably in such a simple configuration.

This machine may also be set to make a delayed transmission (i.e. a transmission at a pre-set time). This pre-set job may coincide with someone picking up an extension handset. Such problems can easily be eliminated however, if you arrange modification of your extension wiring circuit, such that extension devices are connected “downstream” of your machine, in a master/slave configuration. In such a configuration, this machine can always detect whether a telephone is in use, thus it will not attempt to seize the line during that time. This is known as “telephone off-hook detection.”

The inadvisable configuration is shown in figure 1 below, and the recommended master/slave configuration is shown in figure 2.

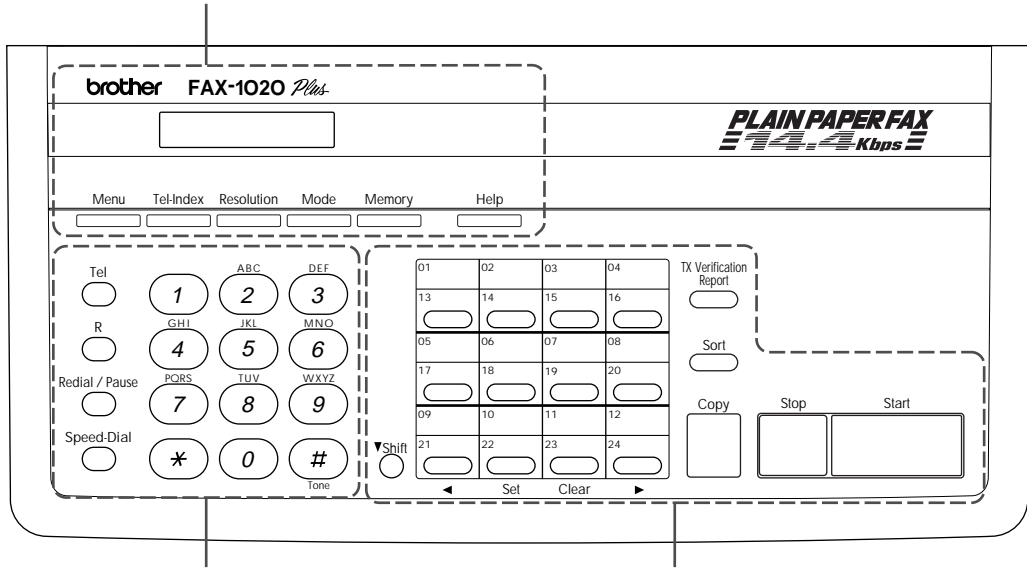
This new connection configuration can be arranged by your contacting BT, Kingston upon Hull Telecommunications, your PABX maintainer or a qualified telephone installation company as appropriate. Simply explained, the extension telephone circuit should be terminated on a normal modular plug (BT 431A style), which in turn should be inserted into the modular socket of the white “T”-shaped connector provided as part of the line cord assembly.

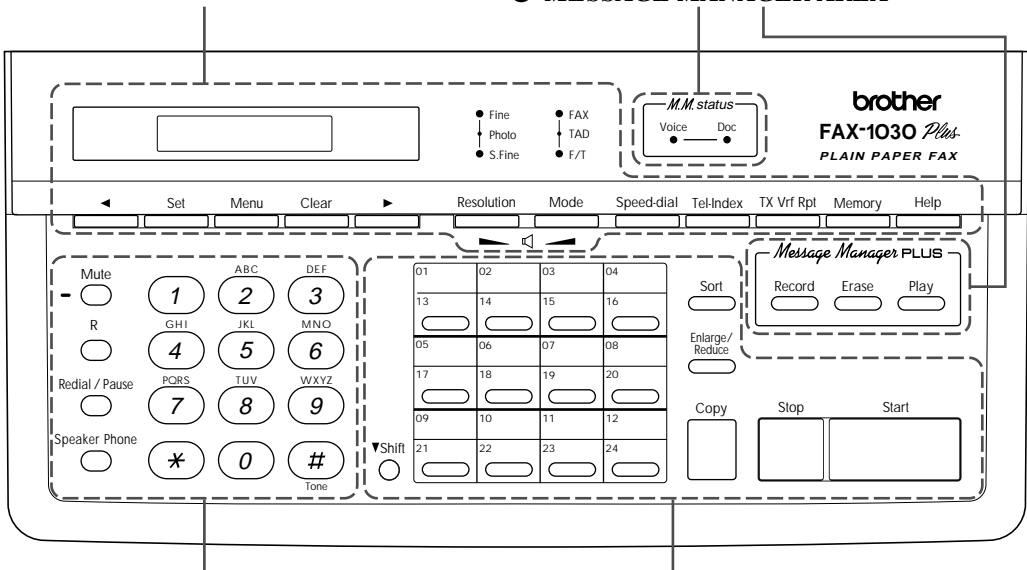

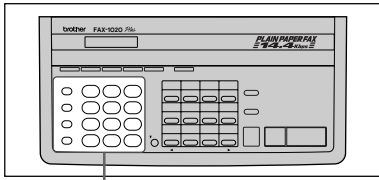

1. Tel

This key is used to have a telephone conversation having picked up the handset of an external telephone in F/T pseudo-ringing mode.

2. Number Keys

These twelve keys are used to dial phone and fax numbers (see chap. 5), and can also be used as an alphanumeric keyboard for entering information into the fax machine (see chap. 3).

3. R

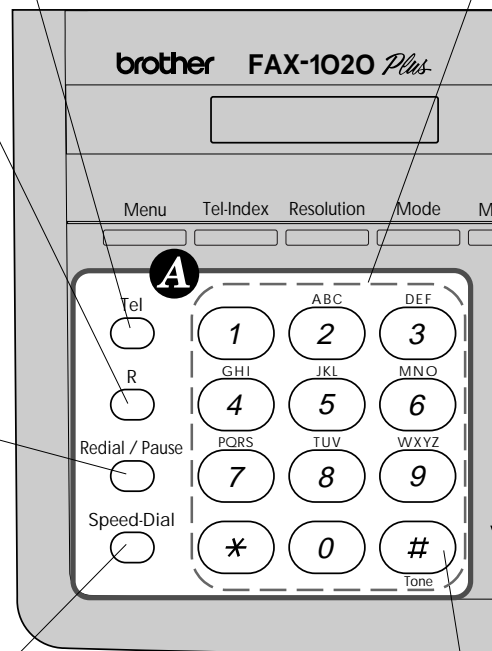
You can use this key to gain access to an outside line when FAX-1020Plus is connected to a Private Automatic Branch Exchange (PABX). It is used to recall the operator or transfer a call to another extension when it is connected to PABX; see chap. 4.

4. Redial/Pause

This key re-dials the last number called. (See chap. 6.) This key is also used to insert a pause in autodial numbers. (See chap. 4)

5. Speed-dial

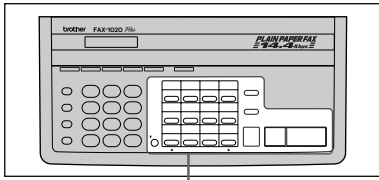
This key lets you access previously stored speed dial phone numbers with a two digit number. (See chap. 4, 5)



6. Tone

This key lets you switch the dialling type during a telephone call from "PULSE" to "TONE"; see chap. 4.

7. Shift

This key is used to access the “13” through “24” One-Touch keys. (See chap. 4.)

9. One-Touch Dial Keys

These 12 keys give you instant access to previously stored phone numbers. (See chap. 4, 5.)

11. TX Verification Report

This key is used to print the transmission verification report when you wish to confirm the last transmission is successful or not. If you want the report every time a fax message is sent, use function menu 3-7. (See chap. 13.)

8. Sort

This key is used to copy original multiple pages copied in order. (See chap. 12.)

10. Copy

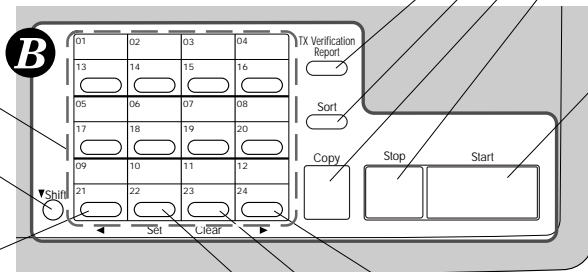
Press this key to make a copy. (See chap. 12.)

12. Stop

This key stops a fax, cancels an operation, or exits from function mode. (See chap. 3.)

13. Start

Use this key to start an operation, such as sending a fax. (See chap. 6.)



14. Set*

This key is used for storing a function setting into the fax machine. (See chap. 3.)

16. ◀ (Left Arrow)*

This key moves the LCD cursor to the left. It also allows you to back up one step when you are in function mode (see chap. 3) or Tel-Index. (See chap. 5.)

15. ▶ (Right Arrow)*

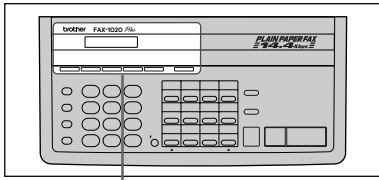
This key moves the LCD cursor to the right, and it also lets you advance one step when you are in function mode (see chap. 3) or Tel-Index. (See chap. 5.)

17. Clear*

This key deletes entered data or backs up one step in a function procedure. (See chap. 3.)

* The arrow, Set and Clear keys have a dual function and can also work as one-touch keys.

18. Menu

This key accesses the function and on screen programming mode (OSP), so you can alter various settings. (See chap. 3.)

20. Tel-Index

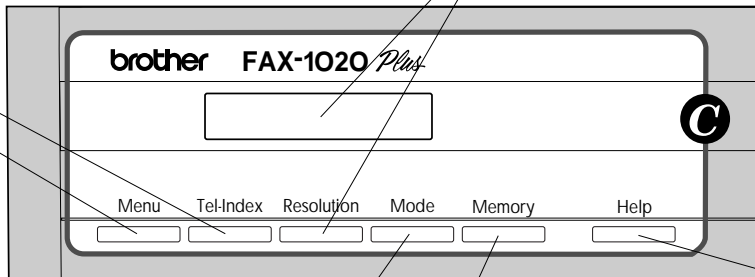
This key allows you to alphabetically look up numbers stored in the dialling memory. (See chap. 5.)

19. Liquid Crystal Display

The LCD displays messages that will help you set up and operate your fax machine. (On-Screen Programming) (See chap. 3.)

21. Resolution

This key is used to set the resolution requirements when sending a fax. (See chap. 6.)



22. Mode

This key is used to specify how the fax machine should handle incoming calls. (Answer Mode) (See chap. 7.)

24. Memory

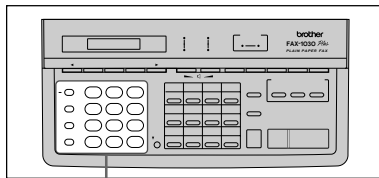
This key enables you to scan in your originals at twice the normal speed, by storing them in the memory before actual transmission. (See chap. 6.) When it is pressed, Broadcasting is available. (See chap. 6.) When it is pressed together with **Shift**, Multi Transmission is available. (See chap. 6.)

23. Help

Press this key whenever you want a quick reference Help List printed. This Help List will give you information on how to perform certain settings for a function, how to register information, or how to get some basic information for sending or receiving faxes. (See chap. 3.)

1. Mute

You can use this key to put a call on hold.

2. Microphone

When you speak to the other party using Speaker Phone or when you record an OGM or a memo, this microphone will record your voice. (See chap. 5, 11.)

4. R

You can use this key to gain access to an outside line when FAX-1030Plus is connected to a Private Automatic Branch Exchange (PABX). It is used to recall the operator or transfer a call to another extension when it is connected to PABX; see chap. 4.

5. Redial/Pause

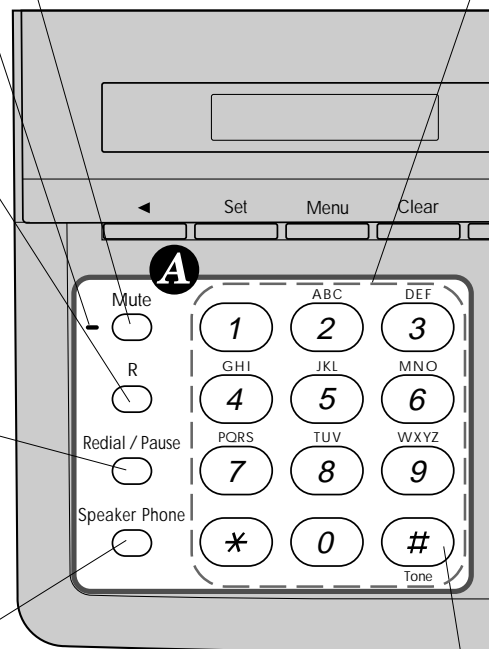
This key re-dials the last number called. (See chap. 6.) This key is also used to insert a pause in autodial numbers. (See chap. 4)

6. Speaker Phone

This key allows you to talk with the party at the other end without lifting the handset. It is also used to toggle the line between handset and speaker following establishment of an "on-hook" dialled call. (See chap. 5.)

3. Number Keys

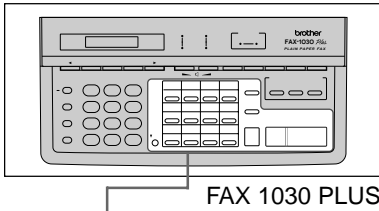
These twelve keys are used to dial phone and fax numbers (see chap. 5), and can also be used as an alphanumeric keyboard for entering information into the fax machine (see chap. 3).



7. Tone

This key lets you switch the dialling type during a telephone call from "PULSE" to "TONE"; see chap. 4.

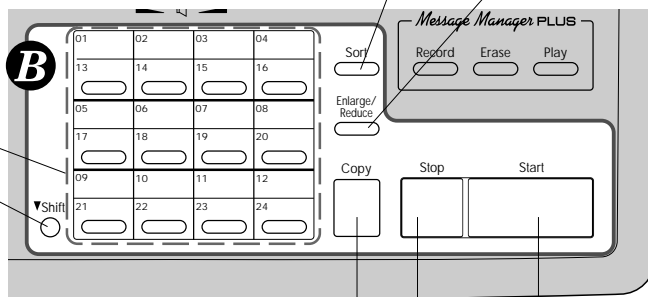

9. Enlarge/Reduce

This key is used for copying with reduction or enlargement. You can select one of the following ratios: 150%, 125%, 120%, 100%, 93%, 87%, 75%, and 50%. You can also use the Auto Reduction function to have the machine automatically calculate the reduction ratio to fit to the size of your recording paper. (See chap. 12.)



12. Copy

Press this key to make a copy. (See chap. 12.)

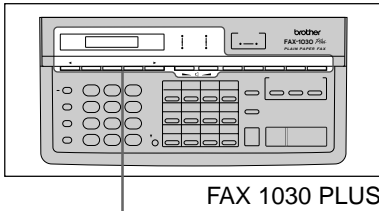

13. Start

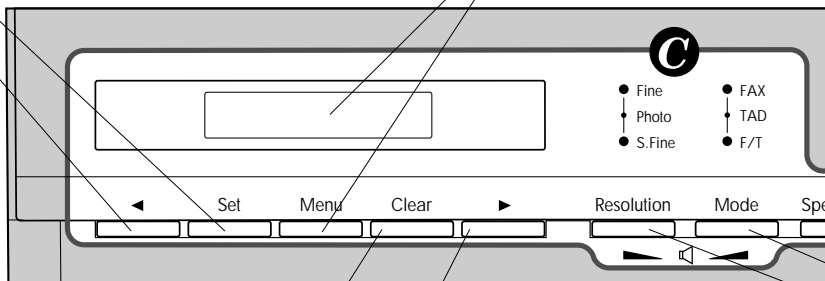

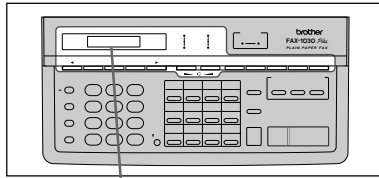

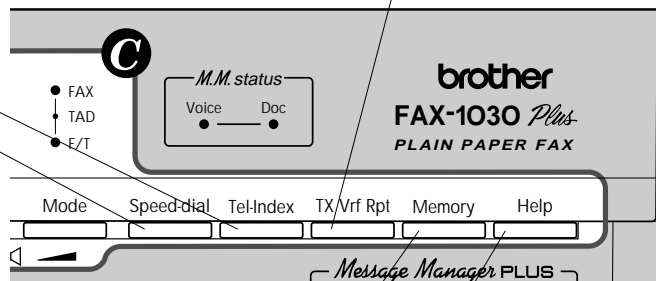

This key is used to print the Transmission Verification Report when you wish to confirm the last transmission is successful or not. If you want the report every time a fax message is sent, use function menu 3-7. (See chap. 13.)



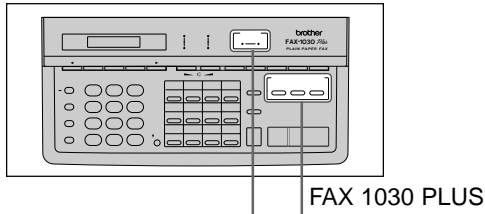
26. Memory

This key enables you to scan in your originals at twice the normal speed, by storing them in the memory before actual transmission. (See chap. 6.) When it is pressed, Broadcasting is available. 27. Help

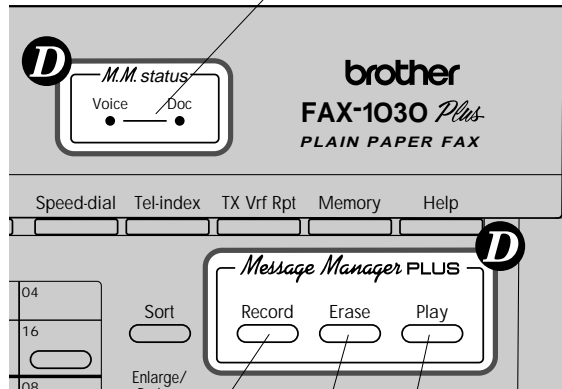

28. Voice and Document Indicator Lights

These lights tell you whether voice or document messages are stored in the memory. (See chap. 10.)



29. Record

Use this key to record outgoing voice messages, memos and memo manager messages into your fax machine. You can also record voice information for the Voice-on-Demand feature. (See chap. 10.)

31. Erase

This key erases voice or fax messages stored in your fax machine. You can also erase voice information for the Voice-on-Demand feature. (See chap. 10.)

30. Play

Use this key to listen to incoming voice messages, outgoing voice messages, memos and memo manager messages and also to print fax messages stored in the machine. You can also play the voice information stored for the Voice-on-Demand feature. (See chap. 10.)

Chapter 3. HOW TO USE ON-SCREEN PROGRAMMING (OSP) AND HELP KEY

User-friendly Programming

We have designed your fax machine with on-screen programming and a **Help** key. This user-friendly programming helps you take advantage of all the functions your fax machine has to offer.

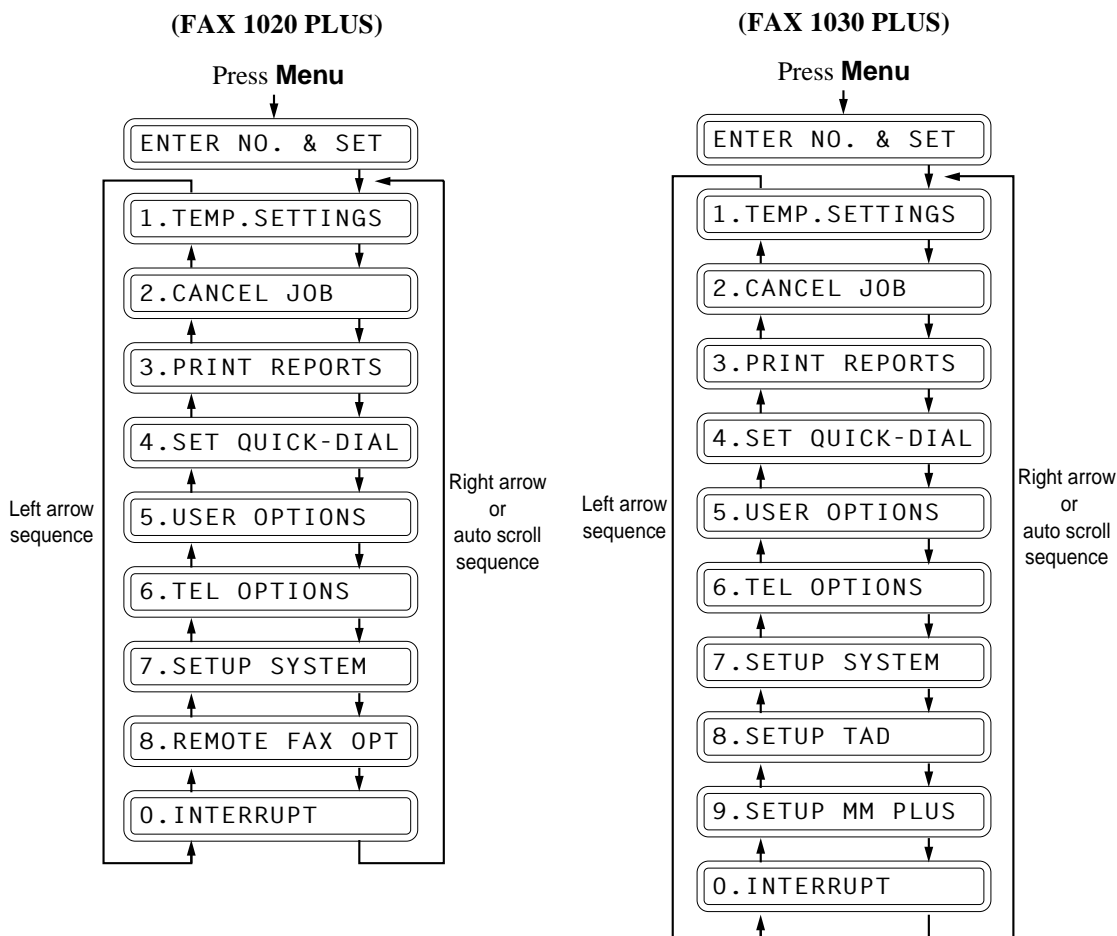
On-screen Programming (OSP)

Since your fax programming is done on the LCD, we have created step-by-step on-screen prompt messages to help you program your fax machine. All you need to do is follow the prompt instructions as they guide you through the function menu selections, programming options and settings.

Using the Function Mode to Access On-screen Programming (OSP)

You can access the function mode by pressing **Menu**, found on your fax Control Panel. (See chap. 2.)

When you enter function mode, your fax machine will display a list of Level One Functions to choose from, as seen below.



These function options will appear one after the other on the display. You can then choose one of these options by pressing **Set** when the option you want appears on the LCD.

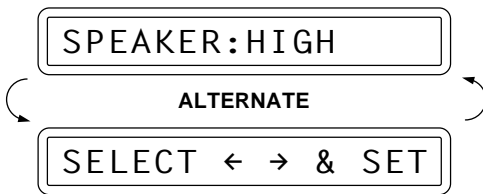
You can also move through the function menu options at a faster rate by pressing **▶** (right arrow). (See chap. 2 to locate this key on your Control Panel.) When you find the option you want, press **Set**.

Instead of pressing **Set**, you can simply press the Level One Function number associated with each option.

Helpful Hints

The Stop key lets you exit from the function menu and takes you back to the date and time status.

Alternating Displays for On-screen Programming (OSP)



When you see alternating displays, the LCD will usually alternate between the currently selected option, and a help message giving brief instructions on how to proceed. The example shows the current speaker volume is high and prompts you to use **◀** (left arrow) and **▶** (right arrow) to change the setting, and then to press **Set** to store it.

Help Key

Press this key whenever you need a quick reference Help List printed. This Help List will give you information on how to perform settings for a function, how to register information, or how to get basic information for sending or receiving faxes.

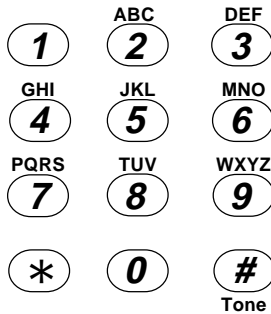
How to Print a Help List

Press **Help** to get a printout of the Help List. Use it when you need information about how to register or set one of the functions, or how to send or receive faxes. You can request a printout whenever the machine meets the following conditions:

- while the LCD displays the date and time.
- while the machine is timer waiting.
- while the machine is polled/polling waiting.
- while the machine is at level one or two of the function menu.
- while you are using the phone.

How to Enter Text in Function Mode

Each number key has three or four letters printed above them. The following keys “0”, “#” and “*” have no printed letters because they have special characters.



By pressing the appropriate number key the correct number of times, you can access the character you want. When you are making certain settings, such as One-Touch dial, you need to enter text into your fax machine.

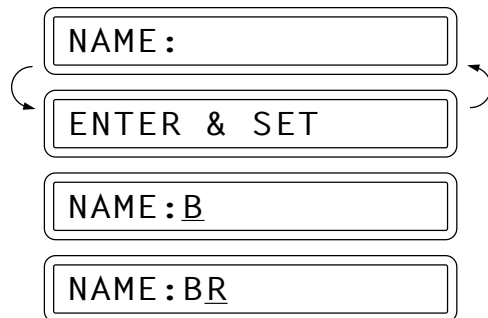

Chapter 4. FUNCTION SETTINGS

There are some settings, such as the date and time, you should enter into your fax machine before you begin using it. Once entered, these settings will remain in the machine until you change them. You can begin customising the settings by pressing **Menu** on the control panel. This activates the function mode and On - Screen Programming prompts. You can complete a variety of settings in this mode.

Setting the Dialling Mode (Tone/Pulse)

Your fax machine supports both tone (or multi-frequency or DTMF) and pulse (or loop/disconnect) dialling. It is initially set to TONE, so you do not need to change the setting if you are connected to that kind of line. If you are using a pulse dial line, you can change the setting to PULSE by following the steps below:

PABX and TRANSFER

Your fax machine is initially set to be connected with PSTN (Public Switched Telephone Network) lines. However many offices use a central telephone system or Private Automatic Branch Exchange (PABX). Your fax can be connected to most types of PABX; it has an “R” key on the control panel, which helps to make certain PABX operations easier.

Also, you can transfer a call to another external by pressing **R** and you can easily gain access to the outside line from your fax connected to PABX by just pressing **R**.

Setting PABX

If your fax machine is connected to a PABX system, set PABX: ON. If not, set OFF.

Setting the Station ID

As well as setting the local date and time, you **MUST** also correctly set your station ID for identification purposes. Station IDs, if correctly set, can enhance the confidence of fax users in ensuring that fax messages are sent and received to and from the intended parties. Your fax machine can store your name, fax number and telephone number. Your machine transmits this information as part of the electronic Cover Page and of every fax page you send, both by normal and by polled transmission. The fax number part of your station ID will also appear on the display of most receiving fax machines during fax communication.

It is important that you enter the fax and telephone numbers in the internationally standardised format, i.e. in accordance with the following strict sequence:

- The “+” (plus) character (to enter the “+”, press “*” once)
- Your Country Code (e.g. “44” for the United Kingdom, “41” for Switzerland)
- Your local area code minus any leading “0” (“9” in Spain)
- A space
- Your number on the local exchange, using spaces to aid readability as appropriate.

As an example, your fax machine is installed in the United Kingdom, is to be used for both fax and voice calls, and your national telephone number is 0555 5444, then you must set the fax and telephone number parts of your station ID as:

+44 555 5444

Finally, please remember to change the number part of your station ID if you move the machine to another location with a different number.

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Menu**.
2. Press **7**.
3. Press **4**.
You will then be prompted to enter your fax number.
4. Enter your fax number (up to 20 digits). (For a reminder on how to enter details, see page 3-8)
Example: **+44 555 5444**.

1. The telephone number which you stored above is only used for the Call Back Message and the Cover Page features.

Storing One-Touch Dial Numbers

You can dial numbers automatically by storing telephone or fax numbers as One-Touch dial numbers. You can also store names with the numbers so that when you call, you can verify the destination on the display. You can store a maximum of 24 numbers. To use 13 to 24, you need to press **Shift**. For example, One-Touch location "13" is accessed by pressing **Shift**+One-Touch "01" simultaneously. Here is how to store a telephone number as a One-Touch dial number (See chap. 2 for the location of the one-touch dial buttons) :

If your fax machine is connected to a PABX, you may need to insert an additional number prefix (e.g. "9") and a "pause" before each fax or telephone number, in order to gain access to the outside line. When you press **Redial/Pause**, a dash "-" will appear on the display. By storing a pause, you can create a delay of 3.5 seconds.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Types of Numbers

When you store a number as a One-Touch or as a Speed-Dial number, you have a choice of choosing the type of number. There are 3 options:

1. *FAX* (A fax number).
2. *TEL* (A telephone number).
3. *F/T* (Both a fax number and a telephone number)

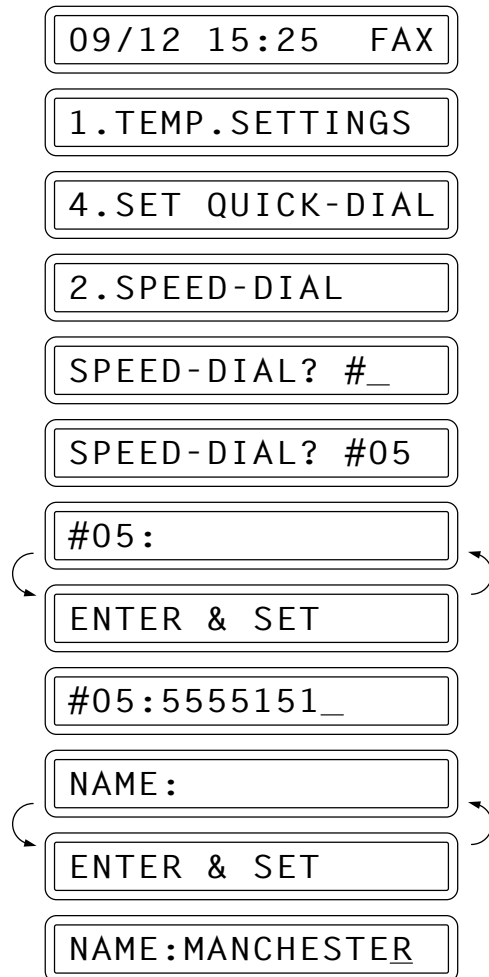
Storing Speed-Dial Numbers

When you store a phone or fax number as a Speed-Dial number, you need to enter a **two-digit number**, from 01 to 36 for FAX 1020 Plus, from 01 to 00 for FAX 1030 Plus using the number keys. For example, you cannot enter “5”. You need to enter “05”. You can store as many as 36 numbers for FAX 1020 Plus or 100 numbers for FAX 1030 Plus as Speed-Dial numbers.

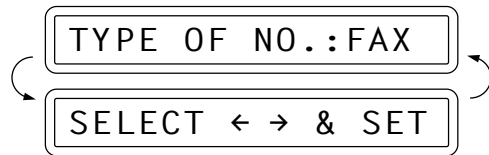

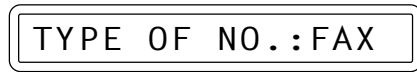

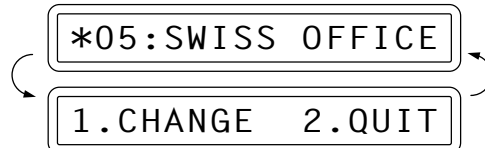
Helpful Hints

1. *IMPORTANT! Please take great care in ensuring that One-Touch and Speed-Dial numbers are stored correctly. Incorrectly dialled numbers cause unnecessary inconvenience to others, network congestion and cost to you.*
2. *Print out the Quick-Dial List to make sure you have stored the correct numbers; see chap. 13. This list will indicate the type of number: FAX, TEL or F/T.*
3. *Even if there should be a loss of electrical power to your fax machine, the telephone and fax numbers you have stored will not be lost.*

FOR YOUR INFORMATION**When You Wish to Change the Stored One-Touch and Speed-Dial Numbers**

When you access the function for a One-Touch key or Speed-Dial number, that is already in use, you will be asked if you wish to change it or to exit and select a different One-Touch or Speed-Dial number. This display does not appear if the One-Touch key or Speed-Dial number you chose is not assigned.

1. Press **1** to assign a new number to the One-Touch key or Speed-Dial number, or press **2** to choose a different One-Touch key or Speed-Dial number.



2. If you are replacing an existing number with a new one, the old number and name will appear in the display. Press **Clear** to erase the old number and name. Then, enter the new number and name and press **Set** to store the entry.

Memory Storage

Your fax machine is equipped with an internal battery that will keep the date and time information for up to 15 hours after power has been cut off. After that time, the date and time will be lost and you will have to re-enter the information. All other settings in the **SET QUICK DIAL**, **USER OPTIONS** and **SETUP SYSTEM** functions are stored permanently and will be retained even in the event of a power failure. The data stored in the memory such as **Out-of-Paper Reception** and **Memory Transmission** will be lost after the power is disconnected.

Helpful Hints

If your fax machine is connected to a PABX, you may need to insert an additional number (e.g. '9') before each fax or telephone number to gain access to an outside line.

Setting Up Number Groups

Number Groups allow you to send the same fax message to many fax numbers by pressing only one One-Touch key (Broadcasting). You must store each fax number first as a One-Touch or Speed-Dial number. Then you can combine them into a Group.

You can have up to 6 smaller Groups (each group uses a One-Touch key) or can assign up to 59 numbers on FAX 1020 Plus and 123 numbers on FAX 1030 Plus for each Group. They can have a name up to 15 characters long. If more groups are required than the amount of numbers that can be stored is reduced in accordance with the amount of groups.

Using Memory Security (Only for FAX 1020 Plus)

This feature allows you to prevent unauthorised access to the fax machine. You must use a password to switch Memory Security ON and OFF.

When switched ON, Memory Security prohibits most functions . The following functions listed are available while Memory Security is switched ON.

- Receiving faxes into memory [limited by Memory Capacity]
- Scheduled Delayed Transmission. *
- Polling *
- Fax Forwarding *
- Remote Retrieval

* Provided it was set before Memory Security was switched ON.

Chapter 5. USING THE UNIT AS A TELEPHONE

Your fax machine can be used to make normal telephone calls. You can dial numbers manually, by pressing the number keys, or by using One-Touch or Speed-Dialling.

Number-Key Dialling

Pick up the handset, and when you hear a dial tone, press number keys. You may now speak to the person at the other end.

One-Touch Dialling

Pick up the handset, and when you hear the dial tone, press the **One-Touch** key. If you try to use a One-Touch number that has not been assigned, you will hear a warning beep and the display will carry a message reading "NOT ASSIGNED". The display will return to normal after 2 seconds.

Speed Dialling

Pick up the handset, and when you hear the dial tone, press **Speed-dial** and then the two-digit Speed Dial number.

Mute (Only for FAX 1030 Plus)

- 1 Press **Verify/Mute** to put a call on hold.
 - 2 You can put down the handset without disconnecting the call.
 - 3 Pick up the machine's handset or press **Speaker Phone** to release the call from hold.
- If you press **Verify/Mute** without lifting the handset or pressing **Speaker Phone**, this key works as the Verify key and prints Transmission Verification Report.

Pause

Press **Redial/Pause** to insert a pause between digits to be dialled.

If your fax machine is connected to a PABX, you may need to insert an additional number prefix (e.g. "9") and a "pause" before each fax or telephone number to gain access to the outside line. When you press **Redial/Pause**, a dash "-" will appear on the display. By storing a pause, you can create a delay of 3.5 seconds.

Tone/Pulse

If you have pulse dialling service, but need to send tone signals (for telephone banking, for example), follow the directions below. If you have touch tone service, you do not need this feature to send tone signals.

- 1 Lift the handset.
- 2 Press #. Any digits dialled after this sends tone signals.
- 3 When you hang up, the machine returns to pulse dialling service.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Using Control Panel Keys during Telephone Calls

- Use **Redial/Pause** for putting a pause between digits to be dialled.
- Use **#** to switch the dialling type to “tone” if you are connected to a “pulse” exchange. Certain services are operated by tone commands, such as those offered by banks, credit card companies, or paging services. There is also a growing number of “voice mail” document services which require touch-tone telephone commands for their operation. Using this key enables tone transmission from the number keys after the call is connected. After the handset is replaced, your machine will revert to “pulse” dialling.

Tel-Index

Once you have registered a name and number as a One-Touch number or as a Speed-Dial number, you can search for that name alphabetically using the Tel-Index. You can also dial a number directly from the Tel-Index.

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Tel-Index**.
2. Use the number keys to input the first character of the stored name, and press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) to find the name.
3. Press **Start** to begin dialling.
4. Pick up the handset.
 - Return the handset to its cradle to cancel the call.

Call Reservation

You can send a fax and then talk to the recipient using the Call Reservation feature. After your fax has been printed on the receiving end, the receiving fax machine will ring as if it were receiving a telephone call. If the recipient picks up the handset, your fax machine will ring. Then you can pick up your handset and start a conversation.

For further information on how to use this function, see chap. 6.

The F/T Switch (F/T Mode)

When you share one line for your telephone and fax machine, in the F/T switch mode, the fax machine can determine whether an incoming call is a fax or a telephone call.

For further information on how to use this function, see chap. 7.

Tel Key (Only for FAX 1020 Plus)

This key is used to enter into a telephone conversation having picked up the handset of an external telephone in F/T pseudo-ringing mode.

For further information, see chap. 2.

On Hook Dialling

1. Dial the number by pressing the number keys or Quick Dial keys.
2. The number you are dialling, or the name you have stored for One-Touch or **Speed-dial** is displayed on the LCD.
3. Press **Start**. You can listen to the other end of the line from the monitor speaker.
4. Pick up the handset when you hear the other end from the monitor speaker. If you press **Tel** before lifting the handset, the call will be disconnected. (Only for FAX 1020 Plus). On FAX 1030 Plus, you can speak immediately to the party at the other end without lifting the handset. Press **Speaker Phone** when you finish the conversation.

Answering Calls with the Speakerphone (Only for FAX 1030 Plus)

When the machine rings, instead of lifting the handset, press **Speaker Phone**. Speak clearly, toward the microphone. To end the call, press **Speaker Phone**.

If you have a bad telephone line connection, the other party might hear your voice echoed during the call. Hang up and try the call again—**OR**—Pick up the handset.

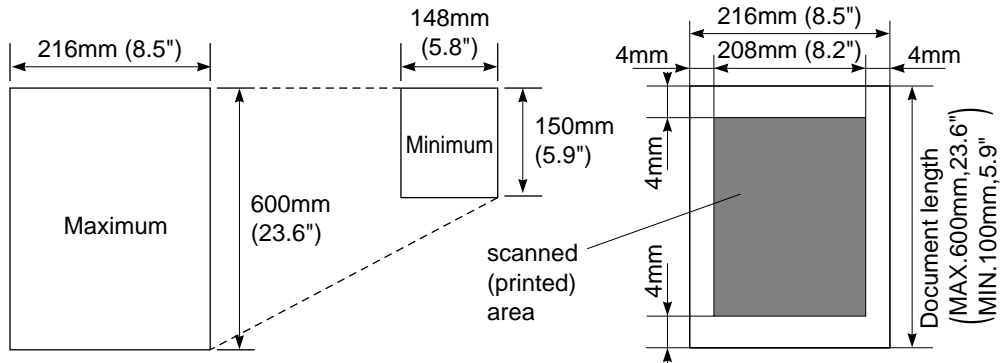
Tel Key

This key is used to enter into a telephone conversation once you have picked up the handset of an external telephone during the F/T pseudo-ring. If you press the **Tel** key and then replace the handset, then you will be listening through the monitor speaker, but the other party will not be able to hear you.

Chapter 6. SENDING FAXES

A) DOCUMENT BASICS

The Size of Your Documents



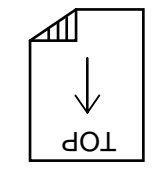
The size of the documents you want to send by fax should not be larger (or smaller) than your fax machine can accommodate. The documents should each be between 148 and 216 mm (5.8 and 8.5 inches) wide and between 150 and 600 mm (5.9 and 23.6 inches) long. There is generally a gap of 4 mm adjacent to each vertical and horizontal edge of the original page to be transmitted, where no image can be scanned. Please therefore ensure that no image data are present within these 4 mm “dead zones”.

The maximum width of the scanned area is 208 mm (8.2 inches).

How to Insert the Document

To send a fax, first insert the document you wish to send, face down, in the document feeder. The top edge of the document should go in first, or the fax will be received upside-down.

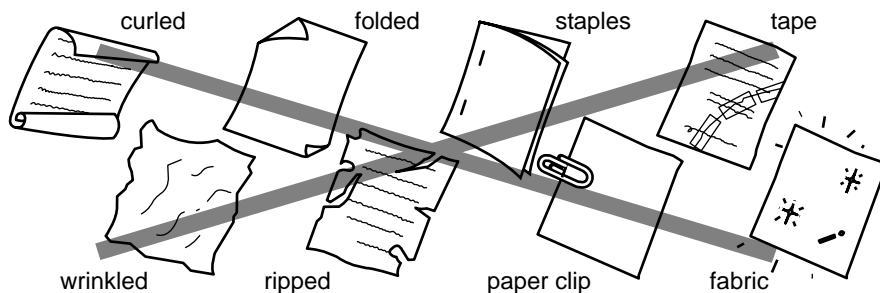
To prevent the document from feeding in crooked, adjust the paper guides to fit the width of the document.



NOTICE

About the Documents You Send...

Do not use documents that are curled, wrinkled, folded, ripped, or that contain staples, paper clips, paste, correction fluid or tape. Also, do not use cardboard, newspaper, or fabric.



The Auto Document Feeder (ADF)

The Auto Document Feeder (ADF) automatically feeds documents (**up to 20 pages**) into the fax machine, one at a time. The thickness and weight of the documents should fall into the following categories:

Thickness: For one sheet: 0.07 to 0.12 mm (2.8×10^{-3} to 4.7×10^{-3} inches).
For multiple sheets: 0.07 to 0.10 mm (2.8×10^{-3} to 3.9×10^{-3} inches).

Weight: For one sheet: 52 to 85 g/m² (0.07×10^{-3} to 0.121×10^{-3} lbs/inch²).
For multiple sheets: 52 to 80 g/m² (0.07×10^{-3} to 0.114×10^{-3} lbs/inch²).

Before inserting documents into the document feeder, fan the sheets of paper to make sure the documents are not stuck together. Then tap the leading edge on a table so that all the pages are even when placed in the feeder. Make sure you always put the documents in face down.

Getting Ready to Send a Fax


SETTING THE RESOLUTION

You can choose a setting (STANDARD, FINE, SUPERFINE, or PHOTO) for the resolution any time before you press **Start** or **Copy**. You can choose a setting by pressing the **Resolution** key. The current status of the setting will be displayed on the LCD or Resolution lights when you press the **Resolution** key.

You can easily check the current setting of resolution by looking at the resolution lights: ● means light off . ◉ means light on.

Resolution lights are available only on FAX 1030 Plus.


STANDARD



The STANDARD resolution can be used for most typewritten text. Transmission speed is normal.

When the STANDARD setting is on, both lights are off.


FINE



The FINE resolution is an ideal setting to use if you want to send documents that have small print. Transmission speed is slower than STANDARD.

When the FINE setting is on, the FINE light will be lit.


SUPERFINE



The SUPERFINE resolution is a good setting to use for documents with very small print or artwork. Transmission speed is slower than FINE.

When the SUPERFINE setting is on, the S. FINE light will be lit.

PHOTO



The PHOTO resolution is ideal for sending documents that have varying shades of gray, such as photographs. Transmission speed is slower than FINE.

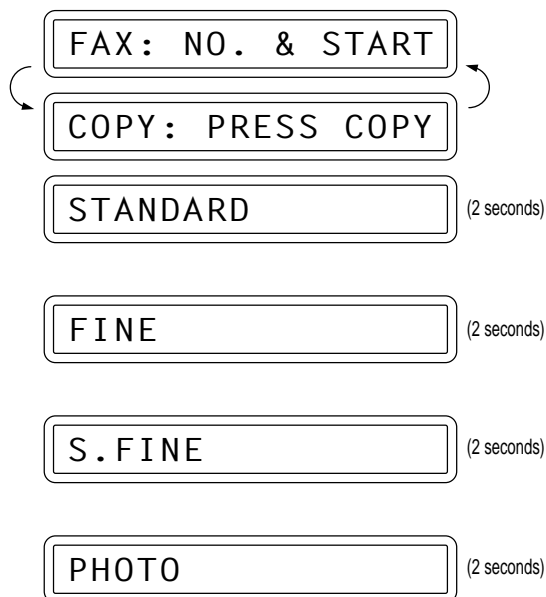
The PHOTO setting is on when both lights are lit.

SENDING FAXES

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Place the document to be sent into the feeder.
2. Press **Resolution** key.
 - * LCD will show the current setting for 2 seconds (Fax 1020 Plus).
For FAX 1030 Plus, Resolution lights will show the current setting.
 - * If you press **Resolution** key during displaying the current setting, you can change the setting.
 - * If you press **Resolution** key once more during displaying the setting, you can get the next resolution.
 - * Display the desired mode by pressing **Resolution** key continuously.
Example: PHOTO mode.

To set different resolutions for each page of a multi page document, refer to “Multiple Resolution Transmission”.

SETTING THE CONTRAST

The fax machine has an automatic contrast control, but if you need to send or to copy a document that is very light or very dark, you may want to set the contrast yourself.

Use **LIGHT** to send a very light document.

Use **DARK** to send a very dark document.

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Insert the documents face down into the feeder.
2. Press **Menu**.
3. Press **1**.
4. Press **4**.
The LCD will alternate messages.
5. Use ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) to select one of the settings, **AUTO**, **LIGHT**, or **DARK**.
Example: **LIGHT**.
6. Press **Set**.
7. Press **Stop** to exit.

B) BASIC FAX TRANSMISSIONS**FOR YOUR INFORMATION**

Sending a Fax

There are 3 basic ways of sending a fax:

1) *Automatic transmission:*

a. *Number-key Dialling*

You can send a fax by pressing the number keys and then pressing **Start**.

b. *One-Touch Dialling*

Press one of the *One-Touch* keys. (The numbers must be stored beforehand. See chap. 4.) Then press **Start**.

c. *Speed-Dialling*

Press **Speed-dial**, then use the number keys to enter a two-digit number.

For example, press "05" for 5. (The numbers must be stored beforehand. See chap. 4.) Then press **Start**.

d. *Tel-Index*

You can use the *Tel-Index* to make telephone or fax calls. (See chap. 5.)

2) *Delayed transmission:*

It is possible to send documents at a later time by using the *TIMER* function.

3) *Manual transmission:*

You can talk or listen to the other party before you send a fax by picking up the handset and dialling the number. After the other party has finished talking and has pushed their **Start** button, you will be able to send your fax by pressing your **Start** key and putting the handset back down in its cradle. (If you call and all you hear is the chirping sound of a fax machine, you can go ahead and press your **Start** key, and then put down the handset.)

NOTE: *Talking to the Other Party When Sending a Fax*

When you are sending a fax manually and you hear the recipient's voice instead of fax tones, you can use the handset to have a conversation. When or if you want to then send a fax, ask the person on the other line to press **Start** on his/her fax machine and when you hear fax tones you can press **Start** to begin sending your fax.





Automatic and Manual Re-dialling

If a number you have dialled is busy or your call did not go through for some other reason, you can re-dial that number. There are two ways to re-dial, “automatic” and “manual.” Automatic redialling can only be used for faxes that were sent using automatic transmission—not for telephone calls. The fax machine will automatically re-dial the number 4 times at 2 minutes intervals (for the U.K.), 3 times at 2 minutes intervals (for Ireland), before giving up. It will re-dial the last dialled number when you press **Redial/Pause** (manual re-dialling).

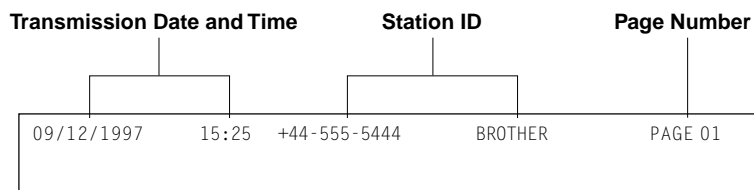

Printing Page Headers

Your fax machine can print a page header on top of every document you send. It is printed on the receiving party's fax paper. It contains the date and time of transmission, your fax number and name (Station ID), and page number. Of course you need to register your Station ID beforehand for that information to be available.



C) ADVANCED FAX TRANSMISSIONS

Sending a Fax by Using Memory

If you are faxing a set of documents that are confidential in nature or you just need your original documents back right away, you don't have to stand at the machine and wait for the transmission of each page to be completed. You can use **Memory** in order to get your original documents back before transmission.

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Insert the documents into the feeder.
2. Press **Memory**.
The display indicates how much memory is available.
3. Enter the fax number. You can use number-keys dialling, One-Touch dialling, Speed dialling, or Tel-Index.
4. Press **Start** to begin scanning the documents into memory. Once completed, the fax machine will dial the destination.

In the unlikely event of the memory becomes full when scanning page one, the display shows "PRESS STOP KEY", then press **Stop** to abort the job.

If the memory becomes full on page 2 or more of a multi-page document, you will be prompted to press **Start** to send the portion already scanned, or **Stop** to abort the job.

Delayed Transmission

You can set the timer to send documents at a later time (up to 24 hours later). Your fax machine will also produce a report, the "Delayed Sending Report", after the fax is sent. You can set up to three different documents for delayed transmission.

Broadcasting

By using the numbers you have stored for One-Touch dialling, Speed-Dialling, or group dialling, you can automatically send faxes to a maximum of 60 locations (FAX 1020 Plus) and 124 locations (FAX 1030 Plus) at once. If more groups are used then the amount of numbers that can be stored is reduced in accordance with the amount of groups used. You cannot broadcast to a number that has not been stored into memory.

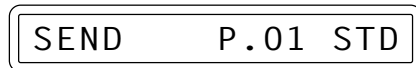
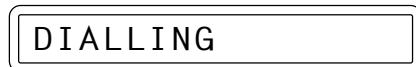
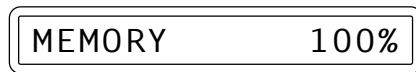

Getting Familiar with the Broadcasting Function

1. To stop the broadcast in progress, press **Stop**.
2. If the line is busy or for some other reason a connection could not be made during broadcasting, the fax machine will automatically re-dial the number.
3. If the memory is full, press **Stop** to abort the job or press **Start** to send the portion that is in the memory (if more than one page has been scanned.)

Helpful Hints

- * Use the Tel-Index to help you choose the numbers you want to broadcast to. (See chap. 5.)
- * After transmission is completed, a Broadcast Report will be printed automatically to let you know the result of the transmission.

Sending by Multi-Transmission

Use multi-transmission for sending several different faxes to several destinations at once. For example, you can automatically fax "Document A" to one destination and "Document B" to another destination.

This is not to be confused with Broadcasting, which is sending a document to many destinations.

If you wish, you can combine this function with broadcasting so that you can fax different documents to different lists of people at the same time. To do this, store various sets of documents in memory. Then automatically your machine will fax "Document A" to one list of people and "Document B" to another list of people. You can preset 3 different documents including timer transmission in memory.

SENDING FAXES

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Insert "Document A" into the feeder.
2. Press **Shift + Memory** together to send by multiple transmission. The display shows remaining memory.
3. Enter the fax number. (Or a series of numbers if you are broadcasting.)
4. Press **Start** to start scanning documents.
5. Insert "Document B" within 30 seconds after "Document A" has been scanned. (If you wait more than 30 seconds to scan another document, the machine will begin to send the document(s) it has in memory.)
6. Repeat the step 2, 3, 4.
7. Insert document "C" within 30 seconds of document "B" being scanned. (If, after 30 seconds there are no further pages, your fax machine starts sending documents "A" and "B").
8. Repeat steps 2, 3 and 4.
9. After 30 seconds, your fax machine will start sending the documents in scanned order.

1. If you press only **Memory** instead of **Shift + Memory** for the last document, your fax machine will start dialling without waiting for 30 seconds.
2. Multi-transmission is available for up to three destinations, however the total number includes Timer transmissions. If you set one timer transmission, multi transmission is only available for two destinations.

Interrupting the Timer and Polled Job

You can send a fax without cancelling the timer or polled waiting (see chap. 8) with documents in the feeder by “interrupting” it. When you interrupt the timer to send a “new” set of documents, the fax machine does not automatically re-dial the number if it is busy. Also, you cannot use the function mode when you are interrupting the timer or polled waiting.

Example: TIMER WAITING with a document in the feeder.

Use the cancel job function to permanently remove scheduled tasks such as polling or polled job (see chap. 8) and timer job (delayed sending) from your fax machine.

5. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) to switch to ON.
6. Press **Set**.

Setting Your Fax Machine for Multiple Resolution Transmission

This is a temporary setting for the current transmission job only.

You can set the resolution of the documents you send by pressing **Resolution**. Once you set the resolution, all the pages will be sent at the same resolution. However, there may be times when you want to send some pages at one resolution, such as “standard”, and other pages in another resolution, such as “photo.” If you send all pages in photo resolution, for instance, it would take a great deal of time. It is better to specify the resolution for each page to minimise transmission time. This is made possible by using the 1.TEMP. SETTINGS function.

ECM (Error Correction Mode)

The Error Correction Mode (ECM) is a way for the machine to check the integrity of a fax transmission while it is in progress. ECM transmissions are possible only between machines that both have the ECM feature. If they do, you may send and receive fax messages that are continually checked for their integrity.

Sufficient memory must be available in your machine for this feature to work.

Error Re-Transmission

Error Re-Transmission is helpful when the receiving machine does not have ECM. Even though your machine cannot check the integrity of the message, it will resend the page(s) effected after an error has been caused by accidental noise.

2. Press **5**.
3. Press **4**.
4. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) to choose either ON or OFF.

Next-FAX Reservation

You can use Next-FAX Reservation for sending a fax when the fax machine is busy receiving or transmitting from memory. This function saves you from having to wait until the incoming fax has printed or the fax stored in the memory has finished transmission. To use the Next-FAX Reservation feature insert the documents as you normally would and follow a few other simple steps.

1. *Next-FAX Reservation cannot be used when there are documents in the document feeder awaiting timer transmission or polled waiting or when the interrupt function is in use.*
2. *When you are making a call using Next-FAX Reservation, you can dial manually, or use One-Touch, Speed-Dial, or Redial. However, when you use One-Touch dialling, the screen will only display the number of the One-Touch number you are using, such as “*01” and not the name of the person you are calling. Similarly, if you use Speed-dialling, the screen will show you only the Speed-Dial number, such as “#02”.*
3. *You can set the resolution for Next-FAX Reservation by pressing **Resolution**, but you cannot change any settings using the **Menu** key. (For example you cannot change a setting for multiple resolution transmission by using function mode.)*
4. *To cancel a Next-FAX Reservation, remove the documents and press **Stop**.*








A) BASIC SETUP TO RECEIVE FAXES

Selecting an Answer Mode

There are 4 answer modes for your fax machine. You can choose one by pressing **Mode** repeatedly until you find the mode you want.

Choose one that suits your needs.

(The indicator lights are available only on the FAX 1030 Plus: ● means light off. ☉ means light on. On the Fax 1020 Plus the receive mode is shown on the display.)

Answer Mode	LCD	For
<p>1. FAX</p> 		<p>Dedicated fax use. Telephone line and fax line are separate.</p> <p>If you use your telephone line exclusively for sending and receiving faxes, you may want to use FAX mode. In this mode, you can receive all your incoming faxes automatically.</p>
<p>2. F/T</p> 		<p>Both fax and telephone use. When you share one line for your telephone and fax machine.</p> <p>If you want to use your telephone line for both fax and telephone, you may want to choose F/T mode. In F/T mode, your fax machine will answer incoming faxes automatically.</p>

Automatic Fax Only Reception (FAX Mode)

You can automatically receive all your faxes in Automatic Fax Reception mode (FAX light is ON). Select this mode by pressing **Mode**.

Manual Reception (MANUAL Mode)

When you set the Answer Mode to manual, you must answer each incoming call yourself. Here is what you should do when using MANUAL Mode:

If You Get a...	Then You Should...
1. Phone call	Talk as you normally would.
2. Phone call and request to send a fax	Press Start when finished talking, and replace the handset. Note: Sender must also press Start .
3. Fax tone...	Press Start , and replace the handset.

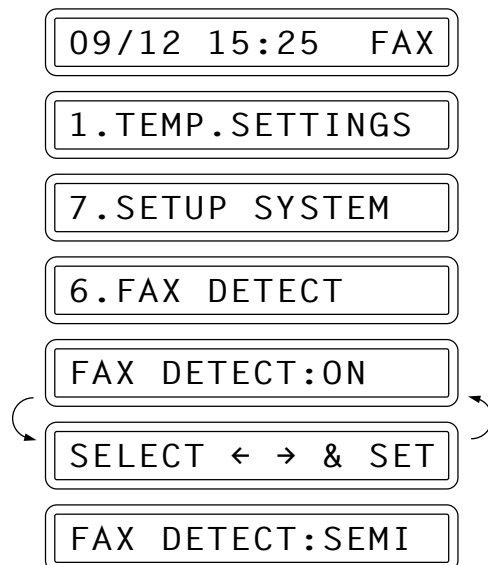
Fax Detect

When you use this feature, you don't have to press **Start**, but need to wait for several seconds quietly, when you answer a fax call. Just replace the handset after your fax machine begins to receive the fax. Selecting "ON" allows the machine to receive fax calls automatically, even if you lift the handset of an extension. Selecting "SEMI" lets the fax machine receive the call only if you've answered it at the fax machine. Selecting "OFF" means you'll have to activate the fax machine yourself by pressing **Start** or entering the remote activation code from an extension phone.

2. Press **7**.
3. Press **6**.
4. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) to choose ON, SEMI or OFF.
Example: SEMI.

- If you have a fax modem which is connected in parallel to the same line as the fax machine, the machine may wrongly detect the fax calling tone (CNG tone) that the fax modem sends to the line as incoming fax call and go into the receiving mode. In this case it is recommended to set FAX DETECT to SEMI or OFF.
- Sometimes your fax machine may detect your voice and/or your caller's voice as a CNG tone by mistake. If it occurs often on your fax, set the Fax Detect 'OFF'.
- In cases where Fax Detect does not work, even after you have kept quiet for several seconds, you should activate the machinery manually by pressing the **Start** button or entering the remote activation code.

Note: For an explanation of the differences between external and extension telephones, please see page 7-12.

Setting the Ring Delay

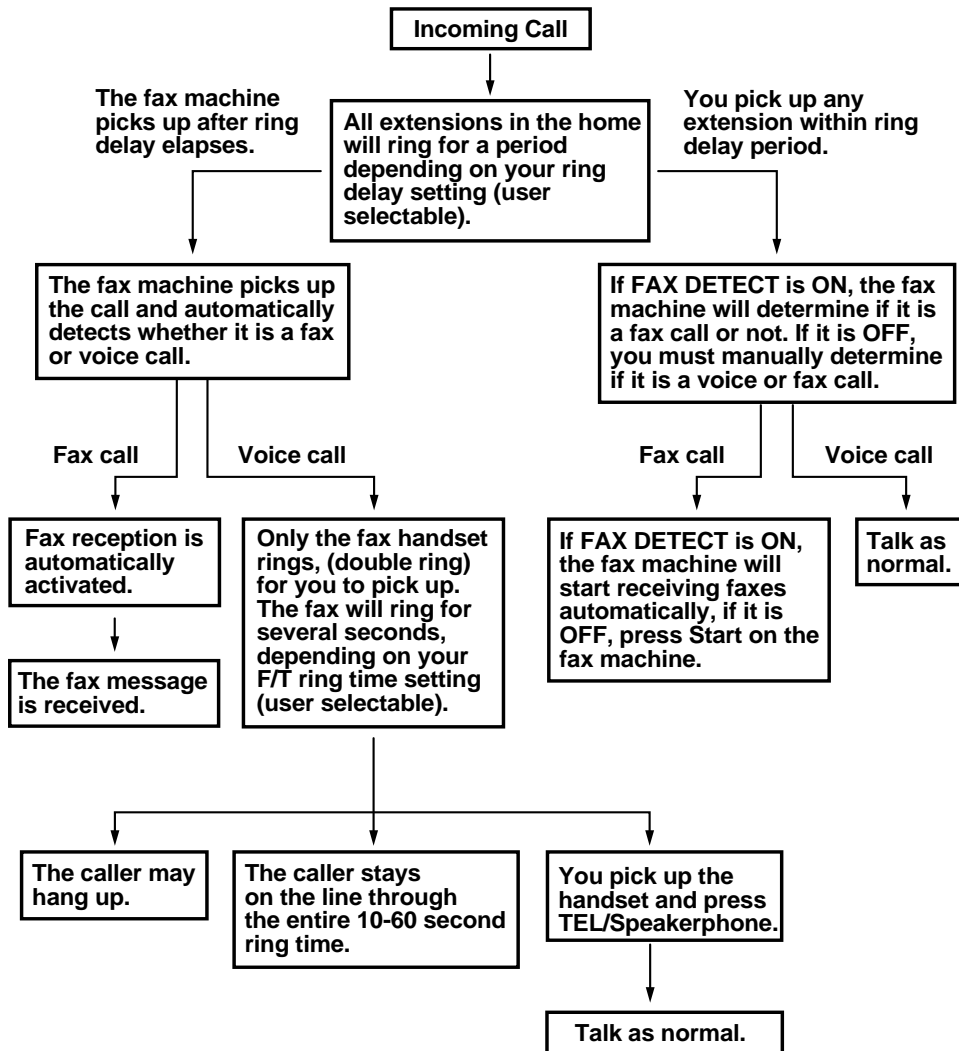

The F/T Switch (F/T Mode)

When you share one line for your telephone and fax machine, in the F/T switch mode, the fax machine can determine whether an incoming call is a fax or a telephone call. (See diagram below.)



Please note that some faxes cannot be received automatically in F/T mode, because some fax machines do not send the standard Group 3 calling tone (“CNG”).

IMPORTANT! This machine does not re-generate ringing conditions to any extension telephones. Any such extension telephones will only ring during the time set on the ring delay period. After the period has expired, only the fax machine will ring. The fax machine will ring depending on the F/T ring time you have selected.

Setting the F/T Ring Time

Once the fax machine has answered the call and has determined that it is a voice call, you can specify the amount of time that it will ring before a fax tone is finally generated. This period can be 10, 20, 30, or 60 (for U.K.) or 10, 20, 30 or 45 (for Ireland) seconds.

It is not necessary to have an outgoing message. The F/T mode will work fine without one. It is only to help the caller understand the status of your machine.

Smoothing

The smoothing feature enhances the appearance of incoming faxes by making jagged edges smooth and takes no additional time. This function does not apply to outgoing faxes, or to lists or reports you print. The initial setting is ON.

Printing a Reduced Size Copy of the Incoming Document

You can avoid separating data even if the document is longer than the recording paper by using this function to print a reduction of the document. There are two types of reduction: Auto Reduction and Fixed Reduction.

Using Auto Reduction Ratio

Depending on the size of the original incoming document pages, the machine will attempt to reduce each incoming page onto one page of recording paper. The machine will automatically calculate the reduction ratio by taking into account the size of the incoming document and the size of the recording paper.

Fixed Reduction

The incoming document will be reduced at a fixed reduction ratio regardless of the size of the recording paper. The reduction ratios can be selected from among four choices: 100%, 93%, 87% or 75%.

- When you use Auto Reduction to reduce incoming documents to fit on one page of recording paper, you can do so only as long as the original document is not longer than 35 cm (legal size). If the original is longer than legal size, the data will not be reduced and will carry over to print on a second page.
- When you use Auto Reduction and you receive an incoming document that is smaller than your recording paper, no reduction will take place, and you will get the same size recorded.

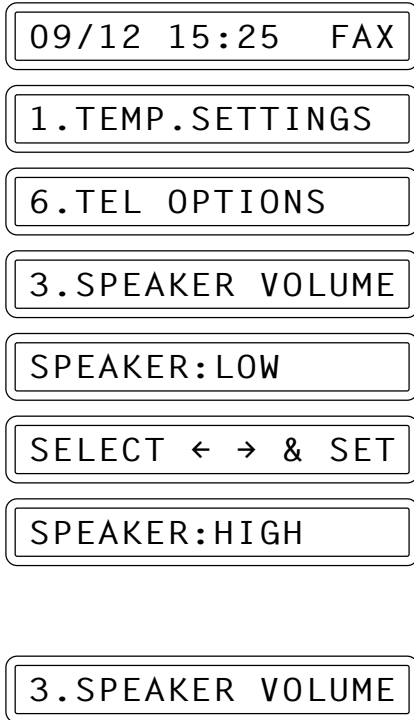
Speaker Volume

There are three settings available for the speaker volume, OFF, LOW, MEDIUM, or HIGH. This setting controls the volume of the fax machine's speaker, which is connected to the phone line. The initial setting is LOW.

KEYS TO PRESS

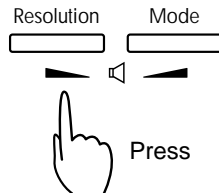

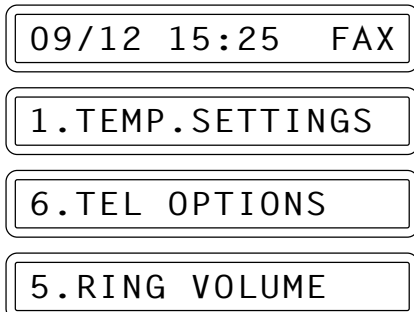

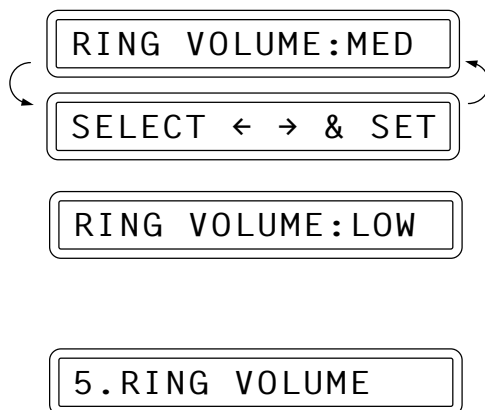

If the MEMORY RECEPTION switch is ON at this time...

The current fax reception will continue, with the remaining page(s) being stored in memory, subject to available memory. Subsequent incoming faxes will also be stored into memory until the memory is full, following which no further incoming fax calls will be automatically answered; all data will be printed as soon as fresh paper is put in the paper cassette.

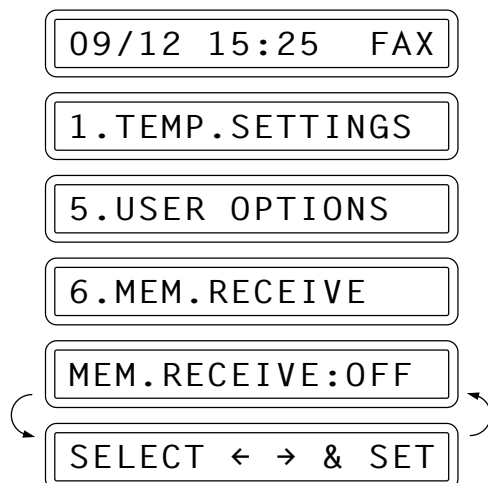
If the MEMORY RECEPTION switch is OFF at this time...

The current fax reception will continue, with the remaining page(s) being stored in memory, subject to available memory. Subsequent incoming fax calls will not be automatically answered until fresh paper is put in the paper cassette. The last fax received will be printed as soon as fresh paper is put in the cassette.

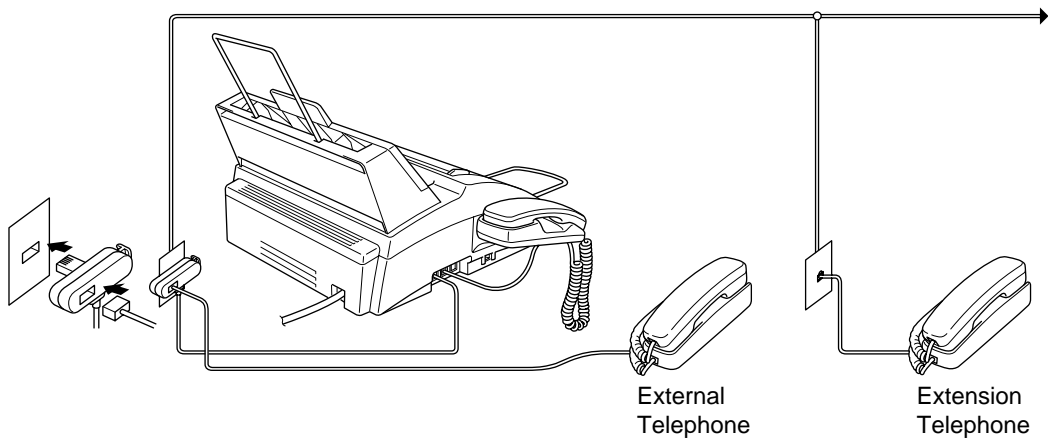
What is Remote Activation?

You can remotely activate your machine to go to fax receiving mode from an external phone (a phone connected downstream of your fax machine), provided the phone has touch-tone dialling capability.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Connecting an External or Extension Telephone to the Unit

You may connect an external telephone to your fax machine, as shown below. An extension phone is a telephone that is plugged into a separate wall jack on the same line.



Operation from an External or Extension Telephone

If you answer a fax call on an external or extension phone, you can make your machine take over by using the Activation Code. When you press the Activation Code * **5 1**, the machine starts to receive a fax.

If the machine answers a voice call and double-rings for you to take over, use the Deactivation Code # **5 1** to take the call at an extension phone. The Deactivation Code is used only in F/T mode.

If you answer a call, and no one is on the line, assume you're receiving a fax. At the machine phone, press **Start**, then hang up. At an extension phone, press * **5 1**, wait for fax receiving tones (chirps), then hang up. At an external phone, press * **5 1** and wait for the phone to be disconnected (the screen displays **RECEIVE**) before you hang up. (Your caller will have to press **Start** to send the fax.)

If you accidentally pick up an extension phone when a fax message is being received, you may disrupt the transmission or render some portions unreadable.

Extension telephones are not permitted in some countries, in such a case the deactivation code will not work.

The Remote Activation Code also can be used by your callers. When you are using an external TAD, your outgoing message (OGM) should end with the statement "to send a fax, press * **5 1**".

For F/T (Fax/Tel) Mode Only

When the machine is in F/T mode, it will use the F/T Ring Time (F/T pseudo-ringing) to alert you to a voice call. If you're at the machine, you can lift the handset to answer.

If you're at an extension phone, you'll need to lift the handset during the F/T Ring Time and press # **5 1** between the F/T pseudo-rings. If no one is on the line, or if someone wants to send you a fax, send the call back to the machine by pressing * **5 1**.

Troubleshooting

Sometimes other equipment on your phone line reserves a key that is in the Activation or Deactivation code. (Some answering machines reserve the “*” key.) If the code you use to retrieve messages from your answering machine causes the line to be disconnected, try changing the Remote Codes. Change *51 to ### and #51 to 111. The Remote Activation and Deactivation Codes may not work with some telephone systems or telephone sets.

NOTE: If you accidentally pick up an extension phone when a fax message is being received, you may disrupt the transmission or render some portions unreadable.

Changing and Registering Remote Codes

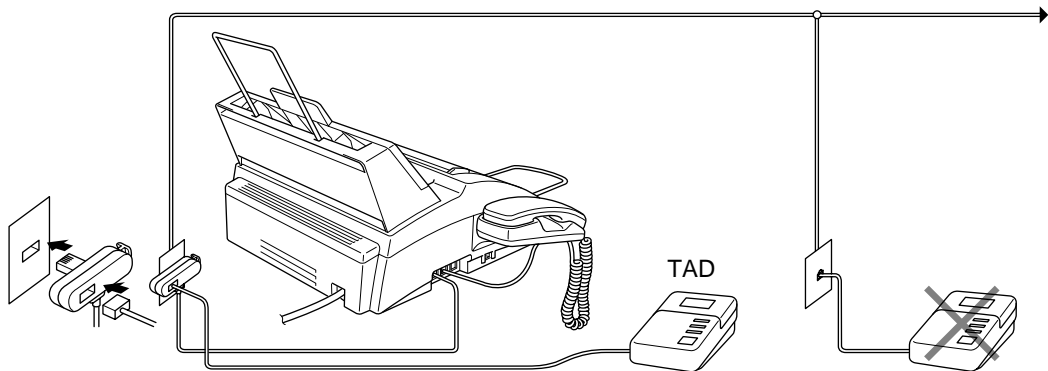
How to Use External TAD with the Unit (The TAD Mode)

When you leave your fax machine set in TAD mode, phone calls will be answered by the externally connected telephone answering device; fax calls will subsequently be received automatically provided they come from a machine which sends standard group 3 fax Calling tone (CNG).

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Connecting an External TAD to the Unit

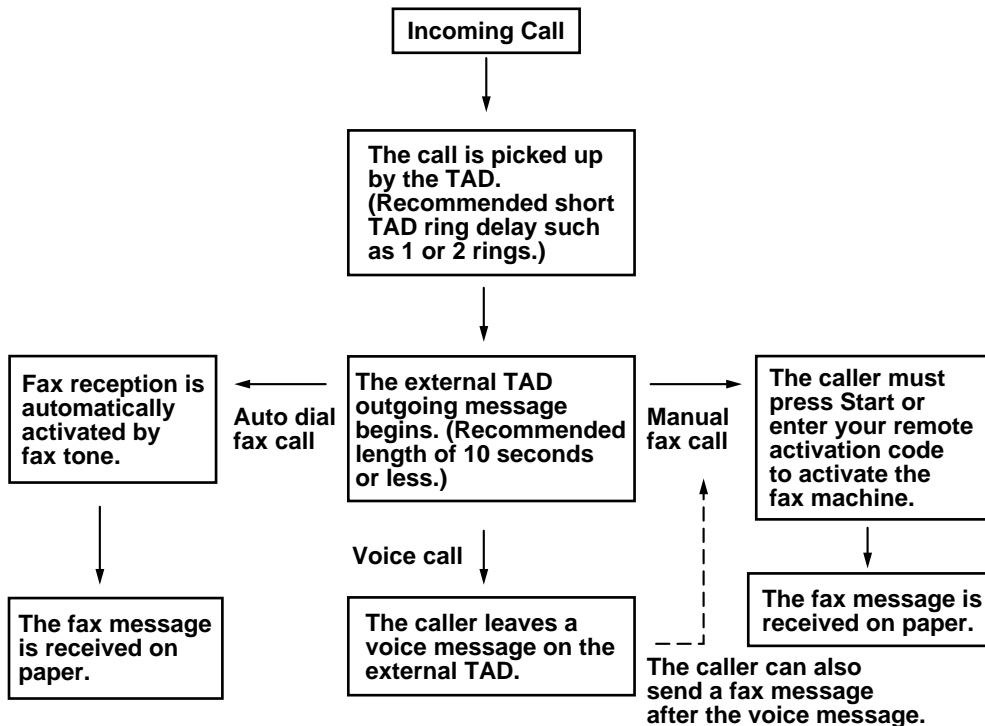
You may connect an external TAD to your fax machine, as shown below.



Helpful Hints

When You Use TAD Mode

- 1. You can inform callers beforehand that if they call manually and get your telephone answering device when they want to send a fax, all they have to do is press their START or FAX key.*
- 2. Another alternative is to record a TAD outgoing message that says, for example, "This answering machine is connected to a fax unit. If you wish to leave a voice message, please speak after beep. If you wish to send a fax message, please press your start key or enter (remote activation code) on your touch tone dial and press Start key. Thank you."*
- 3. You need to erase the incoming messages on your external telephone answering device when it's full, or the TAD will not answer any calls, faxes or otherwise.*
- 4. If you have a FAX 1030 Plus, set Message Store (function menu 8-1) to VOICE: EXT mode (see chapter 10).*

FOR YOUR INFORMATION*Sequence of External TAD Reception (TAD mode)***Telephone Answering Device**

1. Set the telephone answering device so that it is ready to record incoming telephone calls.
2. Set the number of rings to **one or two** on your telephone answering device.
3. Try to record the shortest possible message on your telephone answering device (**less than 10 seconds**). We recommend 4 seconds of silence at the start of the message.

Please note that some faxes that are sent manually cannot be received automatically because some fax machines do not send a fax tone in manual mode.

In these cases you must inform callers that they must enter the remote activation code to send a fax.

D) CALLER ID

What is Caller ID? (Caller IDentification)

Caller ID is a telephone service that allows the subscriber to see a display of the caller's phone number as the telephone rings. It is a fast way to screen your calls. You can respond quickly to calls you missed, because Caller IDs are received and stored in your machine's memory. In addition to the standard Caller ID features, you can select a Caller ID and have your machine dial the number for you.

NOTICE

To get the Caller ID Service: apply for the Caller ID service at your local telephone company, if available.

To PABX Users :

Calling line identification signals are not generally delivered to your Brother fax machine if it is connected behind a private branch exchange (PBX) system or other call routing device.

Advantages of Caller ID

For Business

All businesses profit from a quicker response to customer calls. Businesses that provide mail order services, money-lending services or provide confidential information, can protect themselves from false orders or acceptance of false identification.

At Home

Residential customers can protect themselves from unwanted calls.

How Does the Caller ID Work?

The Caller ID Appears on the Display When Your Telephone Rings

As your telephone rings, the display shows you the caller's phone number. Once you pick up the handset, the caller's ID disappears. You will see up to the first 16 characters of the number on the display.

Helpful Hints

- *If "# UNAVAILABLE" appears on the display, it means that the call came from outside your caller ID service area. **
- *If "# WITHHELD" appears on the display, it means the caller intentionally blocked the transmission of his/her ID. **
- *If no caller ID was transmitted to your fax machine, "PICK UP PHONE" will remain on the display.*

* Depends on network Function.

The Caller ID is Stored in Your Machine's Memory

The machine can store a maximum of the last 30 incoming caller IDs in the memory, along with the time and date of reception. The 31st call will cause the oldest ID to be erased.

The Caller ID information stored in the memory can be used for the following.

- **Selecting a Caller ID from the Memory for Call Reply.**
You can scroll through the Caller IDs on the display and select one for your machine to dial.
- **Printing the Caller ID List.**
You can review calls you received by checking the Caller IDs in memory. This report will list the Date, Time, Phone Number (Caller ID), and type of call (Comment).

NOTE: Please set up the number of rings to more than 02 in the Ring Delay (see chap. 7) before you use the Caller ID. If you set up the number of rings to 01, you cannot receive the Caller ID.

Set the Caller ID to ON

If you have the Caller ID on your line, then this function should be set to ON to display the caller's phone number on the fax LCD as the telephone rings.

Selecting a Caller ID from the Memory for Call Reply

You can display the caller IDs that are stored in the memory and select the caller you want your machine to dial. Call Reply is a convenient feature whereby your Brother fax can dial back a voice/fax call “on-hook” to the opposite party associated with a Caller ID number which has been captured into memory. This saves you from having to copy and dial back to that number manually. (You can skip to Step 4 below by Pressing the **Shift** and **Tel-Index** simultaneously.)

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Menu**.
2. Press **6**.
3. Press **7**.
(Press **7** on U.K. FAX 1020 Plus.)
4. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) to select “DISPLAY ID”.

 - If no ID is stored, the beeper will sound and “NO CALLER ID” will appear on the display.

To Activate Certain Network Services When Using Call Reply

It may be desired (in order to activate certain network services), to insert a special prefix to be dialled in front of the Caller ID number when using the Call Reply feature. Some examples of such network services are :

* Your outgoing Caller ID withheld

The required prefix, typically three to six digits (including # and * symbols) in length, may be inserted after displaying the desired Caller ID in step 6 on the previous page. (You can enter the prefix up to 20 digits on the machine.) The complete number string including the prefix will then be dialled by pressing **Start**.

(Previous page Step 6.) Select the desired Caller ID, wait 2 seconds until you see the date and time the caller ID was received.

- The display will be cleared when you press any of the number keys .
- To cancel the prefix (such as when you entered the wrong number), simply press **Stop**.

- Any problems or queries in using network services should be raised in the first instance with your network operator(s).
- With Call Reply, automatic redial does not function in cases where the called party is busy or doesn't answer.

Call Reply to DDI numbers via Caller ID

Calls derived from a caller ID number to destinations connected to a "Direct Dial Inward (DDI)" private exchange system may fail to connect, or may be answered in the first instance by the called premises' main switchboard rather than by the intended extension. Brother is not liable for any call charges thus incurred.

Clearing the Caller ID Stored in Memory

For the effective use of the memory, it is recommended that you should clear the Caller ID stored into memory by pressing **Clear** when the display shows the number.

Printing the Caller ID List

You can print a listing of the Caller IDs for the last 30 calls received. Both telephone and fax calls will be listed.

This machine feature lets you use the BT Call Sign subscriber service which allows you to have at least two separate telephone number on one phone line. Each phone number has its own distinctive ringing pattern, so you know which phone number is ringing. This is one way you can have a separate phone number for your machine.

Your machine has a BT Call Sign compatible distinctive ringing function, allowing you to dedicate a second phone number (on the same phone line) just for receiving faxes.

You can switch it off temporarily, then turn it back on. When you get a new fax number, make sure you reset this function.

NOTE

- To have your external TAD answer only the main number, the machine must be in Manual Mode.
- In FAX/TEL or FAX ONLY mode, the machine will answer all numbers on the phone line.

Chapter 8. POLLING

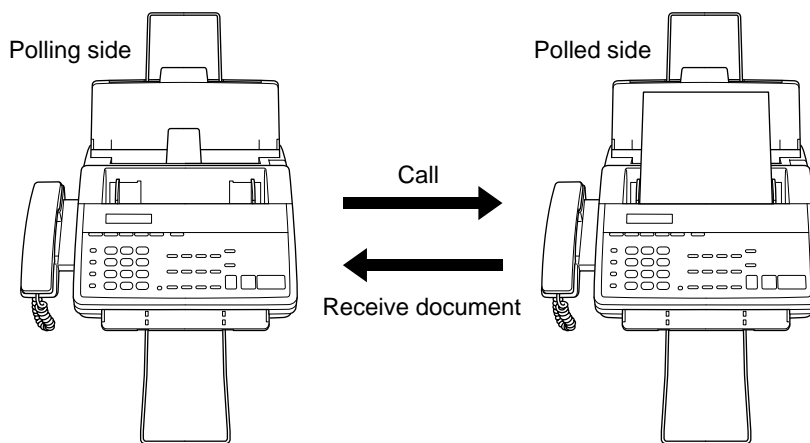
FOR YOUR INFORMATION

What Is Polling?

Polling is the process of **retrieving** faxes from another fax machine. You may use your machine to “poll” other machines, or you may ask someone to poll your machine. The party who polls pays for the cost of the call.

How Does It Work?

First two parties set up their fax machines so that they can accommodate polling. Then one party leaves documents in the fax machine so that the other party can call up and have the documents transmitted to them during the same call.



When to Use Polling?

Use polling to control the cost of who pays for sending a fax.

1. If **you** want to pay for the cost of the call: Send out faxes to other parties as normal, and if another party has documents to send you, ask whether you can poll for it.
2. If you want **others** to pay for the cost of the call: ask them to poll your fax machine for the document they want, and have them fax any documents that you want.

* There are some fax machines that will not respond to the polling function.

Helpful Hints

Using Polling Effectively (Examples)

Problem No. 1: You want another party to send you a long fax, but they do not want to pay for the call.

Solution: Ask them to leave the document in their fax machine so you can poll for it.

Problem No. 2: Sales representatives have difficulty sending in faxes to the head office's fax machine because it is busy so much of the time.

Solution: Head office can poll the sales representatives' fax machines.

Problem No. 3: Because of the time or location, it is cheaper for someone else to call you than it is for you to make the call.

Solution: Ask the other party to poll for the documents and offer to pay for the call at their lower rate.

Polling Another Fax Machine (Calling)

Once you have set up polling, as described below, and the other party has set their fax machine to "POLLED WAITING", you can automatically receive their documents.

Secure Polling

Secure Polling is a way to keep your documents and others' from falling into unauthorised hands while the fax machines are set up for polling. You can use Secure Polling only with another Brother fax machine. Your four-digit ID number must be entered on the fax machine that polls for your documents.

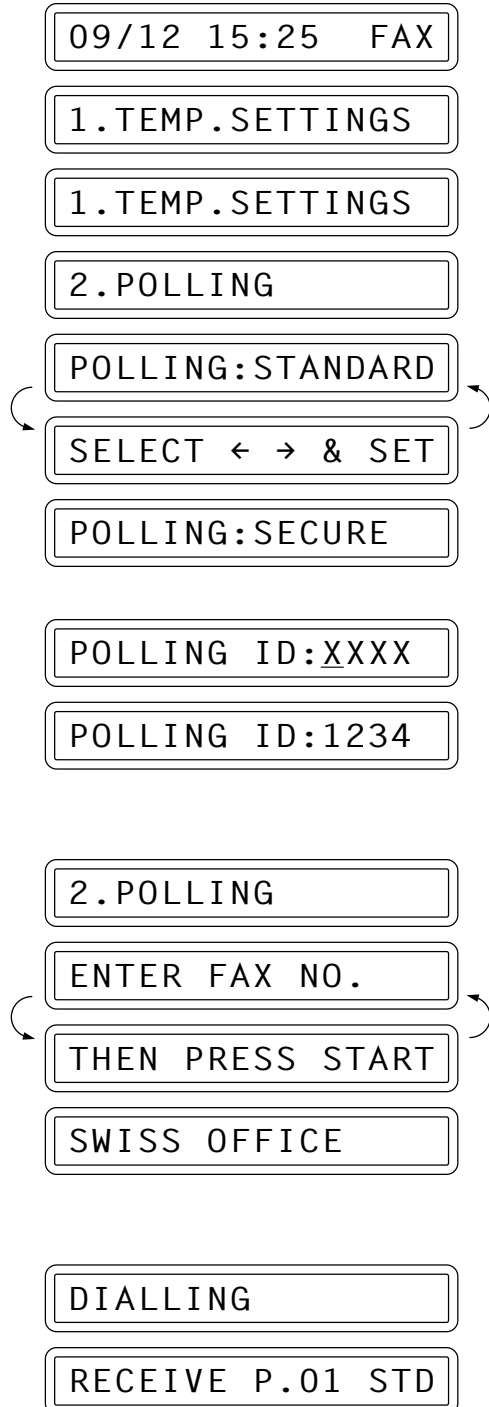

Setting up Polled Waiting with Memory

Sequential Polling

This function is the reverse of Broadcasting, in which your machine sends a document to several destinations. In a sequential polling operation, your machine will request documents from several fax units by making several polling calls in a single operation.

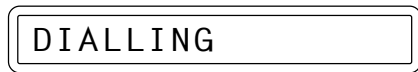

8. Specify the destination fax machines, which you wish to poll by using One-touch, speed-dial, or group number.



9. Press **Start**. Your machine polls each number or group member in turn for documents.



NOTICE

After all the polling operations are finished, a Sequential Polling Report will be printed automatically.

Chapter 9. REMOTE FAX OPTIONS (Only for FAX 1020 Plus)

Since the machine can store incoming data as well as record it, you can use the convenient FAX Forwarding, and Remote Retrieval functions.

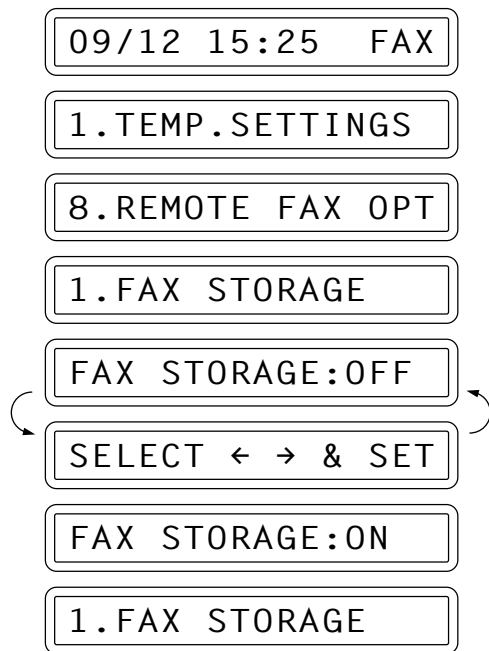
Setting the Fax Storage

Set this function to “ON” if you want the incoming data to be stored in the memory. Since the data can be stored in the memory, you can use the Fax Forwarding and Remote Retrieval functions. It is a good idea to set the Fax Storage function to “ON” when you go out. The initial setting is OFF.

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Menu**.
2. Press **8**.
3. Press **1**.
4. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) to select ON or OFF.
Example: ON
5. Press **Set**.
6. Press **Stop** to exit.

NOTICE

When the memory receive function is set to OFF (menu 5–6), you cannot use the fax storage feature, even if you enable it. Memory receive must be turned ON first.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

- When you have FAX STORAGE:ON, your incoming faxes will be stored in the memory and the LCD will show the number of incoming calls:

FAX IN MEMORY : 01

- When you want to change the Fax Storage setting from ON to OFF and there is fax data still in the memory, you will get the following message after you select OFF:

ERASE ALL DOC. ?

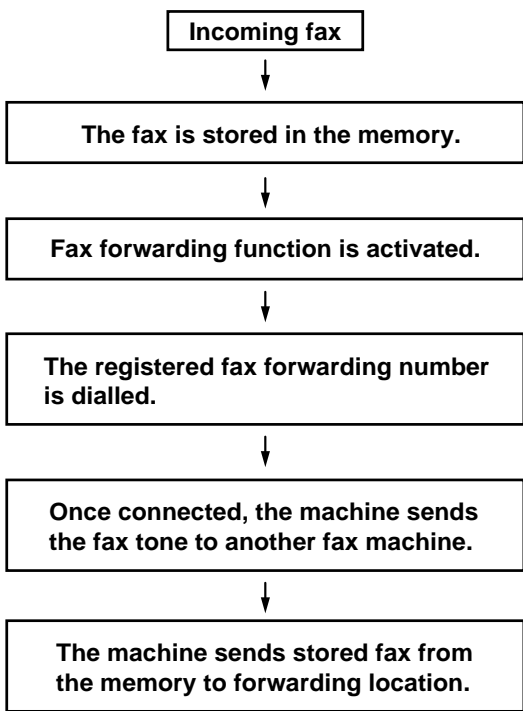
1. YES 2. NO

If you select 1 you will erase all the fax data in the memory and the function will be set to OFF. Before it erases them from the memory, your fax machine will print automatically any fax messages that have not been printed. If you press 2, the data will not be erased, and the setting will remain ON.

Fax Forwarding

When you set the Fax Storage function in Function menu 8-1 to ON, you have an additional option of fax forwarding, when your fax machine receives a fax message into memory.

What Is Remote Control Access?

When you leave your home or office, you will turn on your FAX STORAGE to receive fax messages. But if you would like to activate this FAX STORAGE feature, you can control and program your fax by remote control. You can call your fax from any touch tone phone, enter your remote access code, followed by programming commands. See page 9-6 for programming remote control commands.

Setting the Remote Access Code

The initial setting for the remote access code on your new fax is “159*”.

You may change this code if you wish to.

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Menu**.
2. Press **8**.
3. Press **3**.
4. Enter a three digit number **000** to **998**. The last digit, an asterisk, can not be changed.
Example: **160***.
Enter a three digit number 000 to 998.

Helpful Hints

Change the remote control code frequently and use it as a “secret password” to limit access to your REMOTE FAX OPT.

*When you use the Remote Access Code, you must press all four keys (three-digit number plus *).*

How to Use Remote Access and Control Codes

1. Call from a touch tone phone.
2. Enter your fax machine's number.
3. Enter your Remote Access Code immediately after your fax machine answers with a beep.
4. If you hear a long beep, it means your machine has received fax message(s).
If you do not hear a long beep, it means your fax machine did not receive message(s).
5. Next you will hear a series of two short beeps, during which you can enter a Remote Control Command.
6. Enter your Remote Control Command.
7. After finishing one command, you can enter the next command during the next series of two short beeps.
8. Press **90** to exit remote control.

If you perform an incorrect operation, you will hear three short beeps.

If you wait more than 30 seconds during the series of two short beeps, your machine will disconnect the line.

Remote Fax Retrieval

If you have set your FAX STORAGE: ON to store incoming fax messages, you have the ability to retrieve these fax messages from any remote group 3 facsimile machine.

Remote fax retrieval is accomplished via remote control access commands, which are described in the remainder of this chapter.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

When to Enter the Remote Access Code

Just after the line is connected, you should enter the remote access code from any touch tone phone. Make sure that you enter the remote access code while you do NOT hear any chirping sound of a fax machine. If the fax machine is set to MANUAL mode, it will answer the call within 40 rings (about 100seconds). You will have 30 seconds to press the remote access code or the line will be disconnected.

How to Receive the Memory Status List and Retrieve a Fax Message at a Remote Fax Location

You can check the Memory Status List first to see if you have any stored fax messages to retrieve. Then you can retrieve them from your fax machine remotely.

1. Pick up the handset of a remote fax machine.
2. Dial your fax machine's number.
3. Enter your four-digit Remote Access Code (159*) when your fax machine answers.
4. Press **961** during a series of two short beeps.
5. Press **Start** after you hear the fax tone and hold the handset.
 - If you wish to receive only the MEMORY STATUS LIST, replace the handset after pressing **Start**.
6. Now you will receive a "MEMORY STATUS LIST". (See chap. 11.)
7. When the MEMORY STATUS LIST is printed, you will hear a series of two short beeps.
8. Press **96 2** during continuous two short beeps.
9. You should enter two-digit message numbers (ex. **01**) and then press **00**.
 - ex.) To receive NO. 1 and NO. 2 messages, press **96 2 01 02 00**.
 - If you want to retrieve all messages, simply press **00**.
 - ex.) To retrieve all fax messages, press **96 2 00**.
10. Press **Start** after you hear the fax tone.
11. Replace the handset. Now your fax messages will be printed.

How to Change and Confirm Fax Forwarding Number via a Remote Fax Machine

1. Pick up the handset of a remote fax machine.
2. Dial your fax machine's number.
3. Enter your four-digit Remote Access Code (159*) when your fax machine answers.
4. Press **954** during a series of two short beeps.
5. Enter new Fax Forwarding number by using number keys (up to 20 digits).
 - You cannot register "*" and "#" as dial numbers. Use "#" at the beginning of the dial number to get PABX access. Use a "#" to make a pause between the dial numbers.
6. Press **##** after entering new Fax Forwarding number.
7. Press **961** during a series of two short beeps.
8. Press **Start** after you hear the fax tone and hold the handset.
9. Now you can receive "MEMORY STATUS LIST". (See chap. 11.)
 - Look at the LIST, and make sure the new Fax Forwarding number you registered in Step 5 is correct.
10. If the new number is correct, press **955** to confirm the number when a series of two short beeps starts sounding.
 - If it is incorrect, press **954** during a series of two short beeps and enter a correct number again (back to Step 5).

11. Press **90** to exit remote control.
12. Replace the handset. Now your fax machine is ready to activate Fax Forwarding.

WARNING

It makes economic sense to receive any messages in your fax machine memory immediately after receiving the MEMORY STATUS LIST, during the same remote retrieval call. However, please note that there are some fax machines which, having received the MEMORY STATUS LIST from your fax machine, will give an audible “HANDSET UP” or similar alarm, if you keep the line held in readiness for the next command.

*In such cases, it may be possible to clear the alarm and enter the next command (e.g. “962...” for the RECEIVE), by pressing the **Stop** key once or twice on the receiving machine during the alarm beeping time. If this doesn’t work, simply replace the handset, pause, and redial the call, using then the “962...” command after your fax machine answers and accepts your remote access code.*

Printing a Fax Message

You can print a fax message that is stored in the memory.

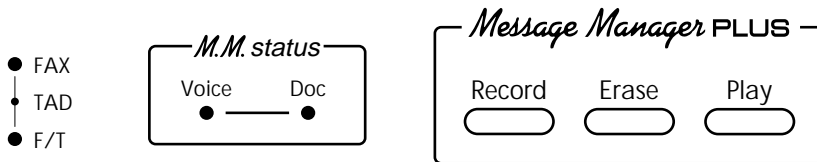

Chapter 10. MESSAGE MANAGER MODE SETTINGS (Only for FAX 1030 Plus)

The Message Manager Memory has two modes for different uses: the Message Manager Mode and the Message Manager Plus Mode. The Message Manager Mode allows you to store the incoming fax/voice messages into a flexible memory. Fax retrieval, Paging and Fax Forwarding features are available in this mode. The Message Manager Plus Mode is an additional enhancement to the Message Manager Mode, and provides Voice-on-Demand and Personal Mailbox features. This chapter explains how the standard Message Manager Mode performs. (The Message Manager Plus Mode is explained in chapter 11.)

The FAX and F/T lights must be lit to turn on either Message Manager Mode or Message



Manager Plus Mode.

NOTE: The TAD Outgoing Message (TAD OGM) must be recorded before you can activate the Message Manager Mode (TAD mode).

A) GETTING STARTED

What Is the Message Manager Mode?

The Message Manager is a large flexible memory to effectively manage your voice and fax messages, while you are out.

This flexible memory can be used for voice messages, fax messages or a combination that stores both types on a “first come first served” basis. Any fax or voice message that is stored in the memory can be retrieved from a remote location.

What Do I Want the Message Manager to Do?

There are six ways to allocate the flexible Message Manager memory, depending upon which best fits your needs.

You may need to use only one mode on a regular basis, but periodically change modes to meet high or low message days. The six modes are as follows:

The factory setting is DOC.: OFF/VOICE: ON.

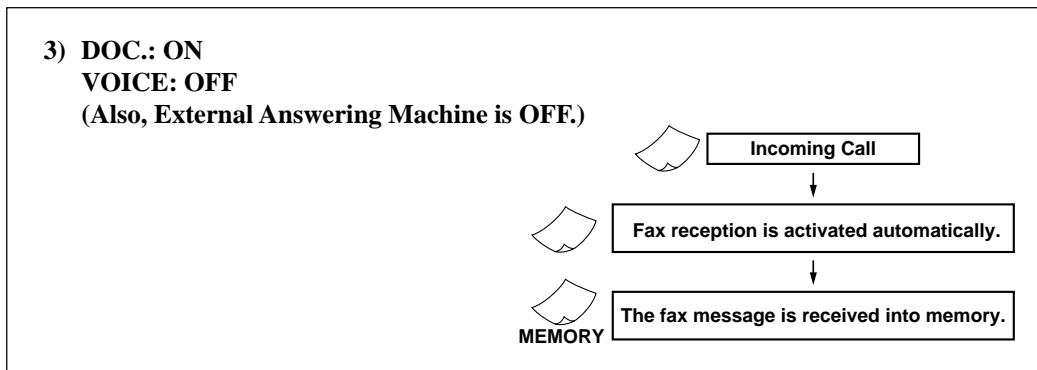
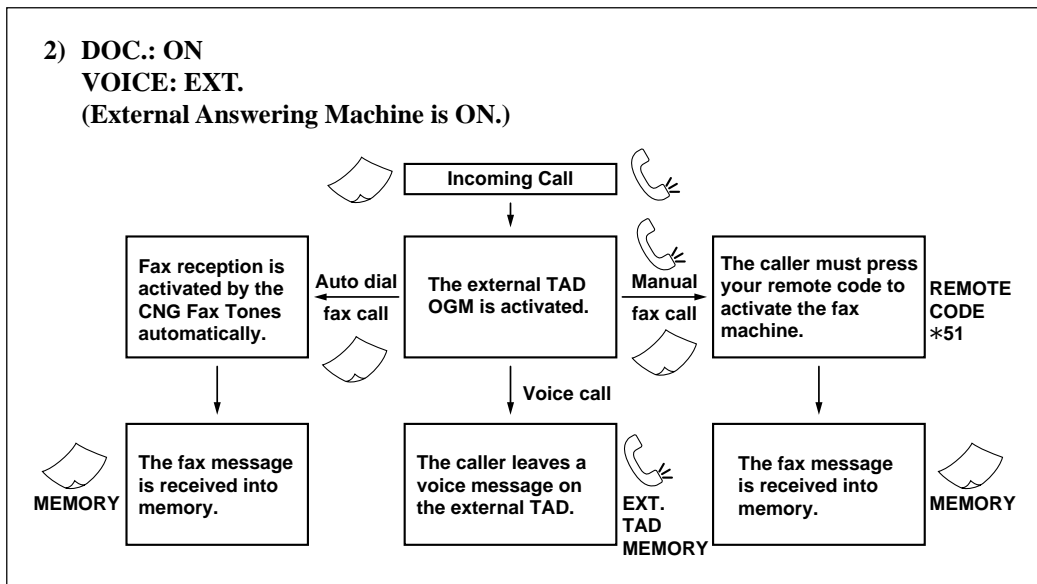
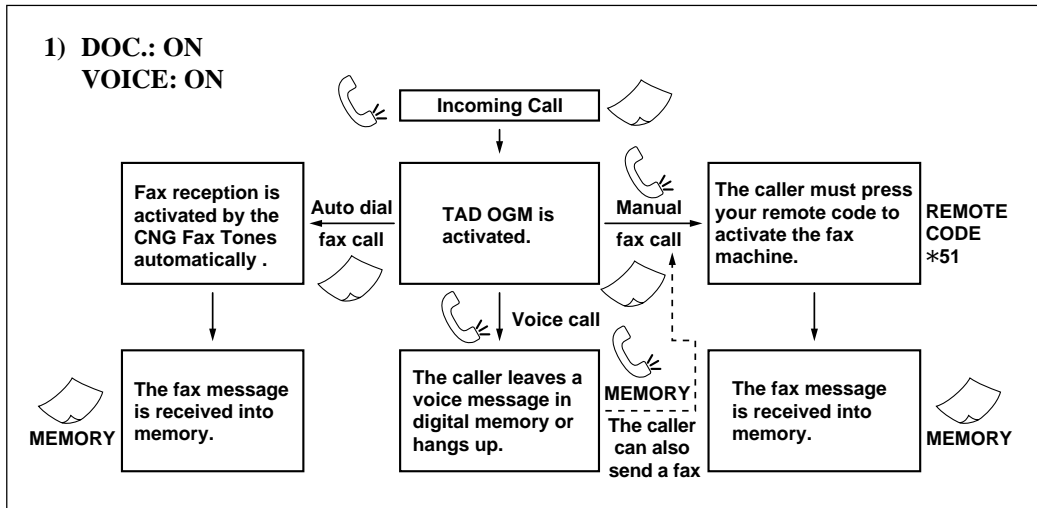

Use this mode if you wish to retrieve voice messages from a remote location, but can wait until you are at the fax machine to get your fax messages.
5) DOC.: OFF VOICE: EXT. (External Answering Machine is ON.)	Fax messages will be received only on paper, but will not be stored in the memory. Voice calls will not be stored unless an external TAD is connected to your fax machine. (See page 7-15)	Use this mode if you need more voice memory than is available in the Message Manager or if you prefer the sound quality of a tape recorder.
6) DOC.: OFF VOICE: OFF	Fax messages will be received only on paper, but will not be stored in the memory. Voice calls will not be stored in the memory either.	Use this mode if you do not want to use the Message Manager memory for receiving fax/voice messages, or if you want to use only Message Manager Plus mode.

* Use 2) DOC.: ON, VOICE: EXT. and 3) DOC.: ON, VOICE: OFF mode when you want all available memory to be used to store fax messages (for Fax Forwarding or Paging and Remote Retrieval). Keep Backup Printing turned ON to get a printed copy.

* Even when you set DOC.: OFF mode (4), (6), you can use **Memory** key and Broadcasting as usual.

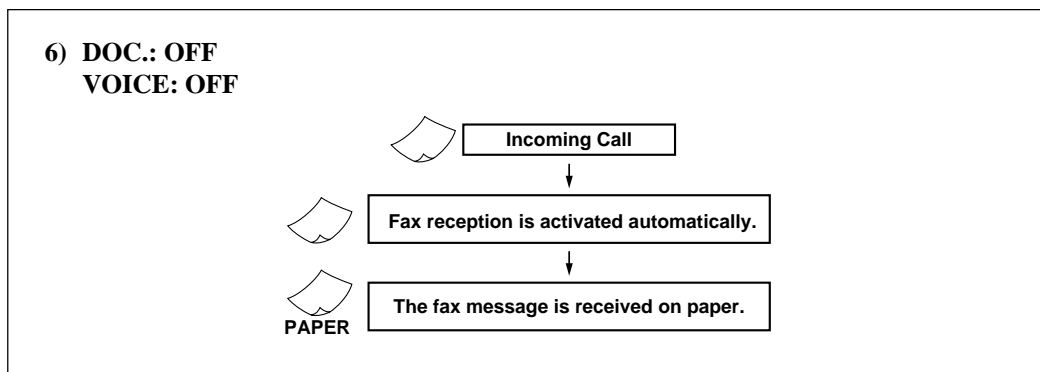
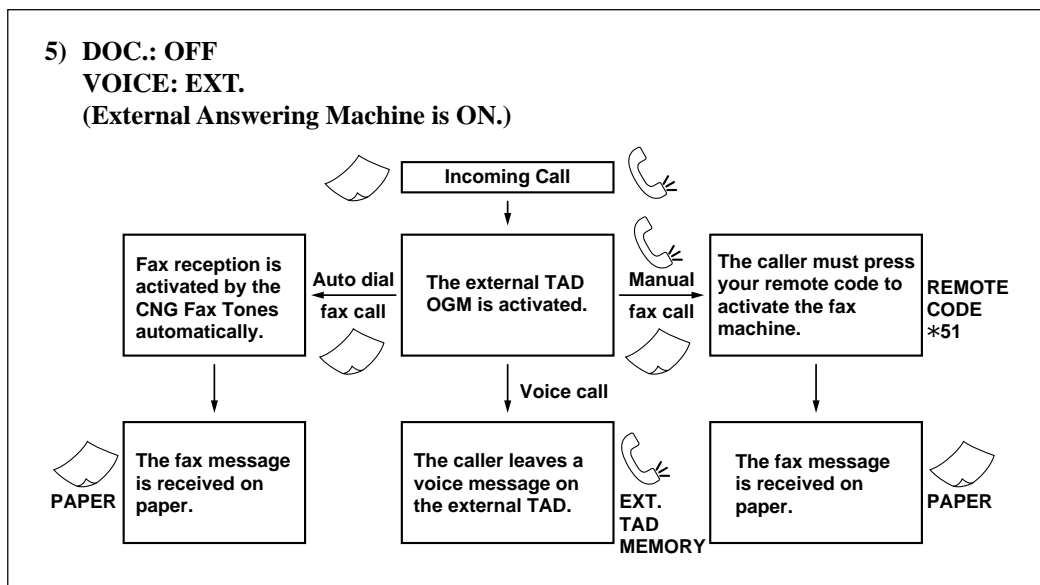
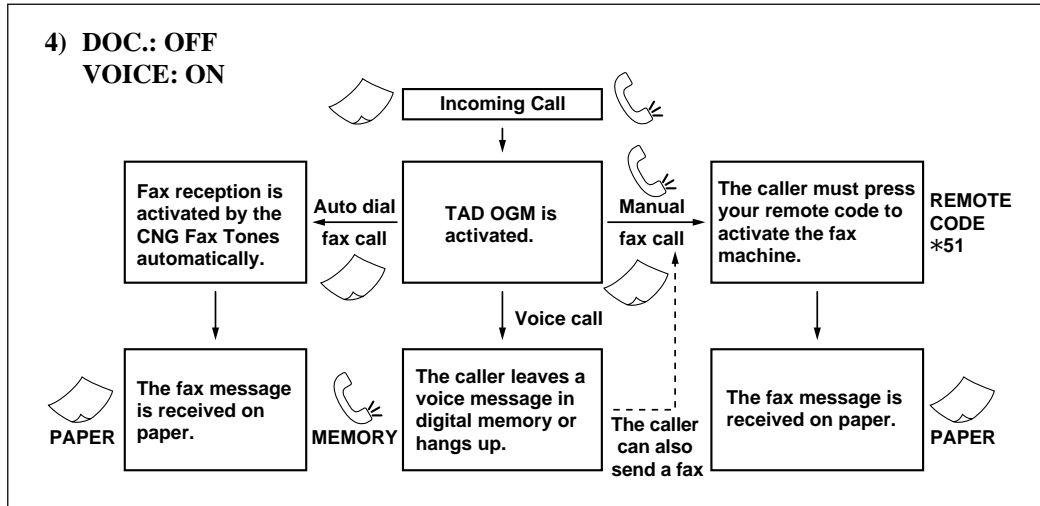
Flowchart Sequence of an Incoming Call

The 3 Basic Steps to Turn the Message Manager Mode On

You can ensure you receive messages by following these three steps.

1. Setting the Message Store.
2. Recording the Outgoing Message (TAD OGM).
3. Activating the Message Manager Mode.

Setting the Message Store

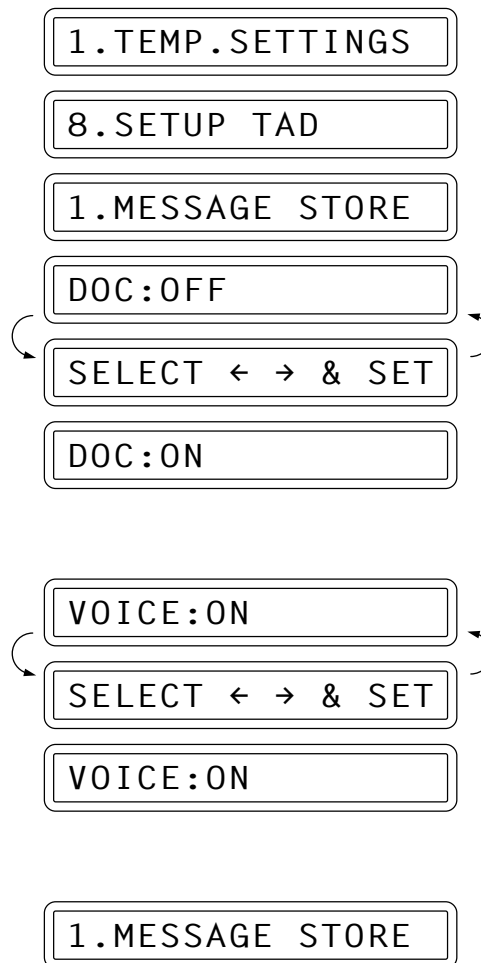
Setting the Message Store is the first step in turning on the Message Manager Mode.

Before you set the Message Store, make sure you carefully read the “Mode Settings at a Glance”. If you are using the Voice-on-Demand option, it is a good idea to set VOICE mode to ON. Then, if a caller does not enter a command during the Message Manager Plus OGM, the caller’s message will still be stored in the flexible memory for VOICE messages. Once you decide the mode that best suits your needs, follow the steps below.

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Menu**.
2. Press **8**.
3. Press **1**.
4. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) repeatedly to select ON or OFF.
Example: DOC:ON.
5. Press **Set**.
6. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) repeatedly to select ON, OFF or EXT.
Example: VOICE:ON.
7. Press **Set**.
8. Press **Stop** to exit.

Recording the TAD Outgoing Message (TAD OGM)

Recording your TAD OGM is the second step in turning on the Message Manager Mode. After you have set the Message Store, record your TAD OGM (DOC.: ON, VOICE: ON and DOC.: OFF, VOICE: ON modes). The type of OGM you select depends upon the Answer Mode you have chosen. For the Message Manager Mode, you must select TAD OGM in Step 4 (not F/T OGM). You will not be able to turn on the Message Manager Mode (both FAX and F/T lights lit) until you have recorded an outgoing message for TAD OGM. For the best recording quality, speak with the microphone approximately 2 to 3 inches from your mouth (at slight angle). This will avoid recording feedback. Keep your outgoing message **under 20 seconds**. If you have more to say and need a short instruction, end with:

“After the beep, please leave a message or send a fax, by pressing *51.”

If callers tell you the *51 code does not work, find out if they waited to hear your fax machine respond with chirping tones before they pressed the **Start** key. If many of your callers have a problem sending to you and you have time within the 20 seconds, record a longer OGM:

“Hi, this is _____. I can’t take your call right now. So after the beep, please leave a message or send a fax. To send a fax, press *51, wait for fax tones, then press Start.”

NOTE: You can record a message to be played in the F/T (FAX/TEL) Mode telling callers how to send a fax. Of course, callers can not leave you a message in F/T mode, so don’t ask them to leave a voice message. To record a message for F/T mode you must select F/T OGM in Step 4. For example: “I can’t take your call right now. Please call again. To send a fax message, after the beep press *51.”

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Menu**.
2. Press **8**.
3. Press **6**.
4. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) repeatedly until you get the TAD MSG.
5. Press **Set**.
6. Press **Record** and then pick up the handset.

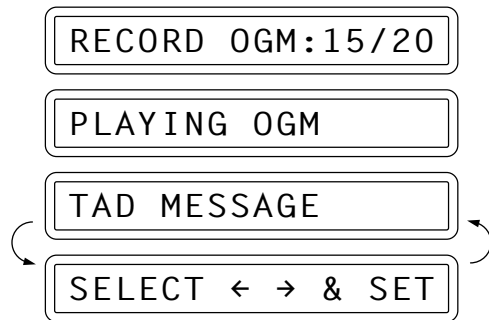

Activating the Message Manager Mode

Now that you have selected the type of message store you need and recorded your outgoing message, you are ready to turn your Message Manager Mode on, when you leave your home or office.

To activate Message Manager



Press **Mode** on the control panel until both the “FAX” and “F/T” lights are on.

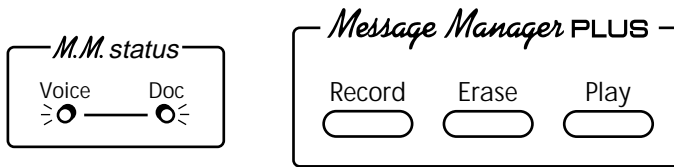
...then you can easily identify the current Message Manager mode by viewing the TAD indicator lights.

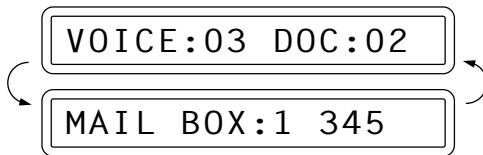
How Will I Know Messages Have Been Received?

Once you return home or to the office you can easily and quickly see if any voice or fax messages have been stored in the Message Manager. There are two ways to determine if messages are stored.

- (1) If the Voice and /or Doc indicator lights are flashing, there is a new message stored. (◯ ≡ means flashing.) Once a new voice message is played, the Voice indicator light stops flashing and stays on. And once a new fax message is printed, the Doc indicator light goes out.



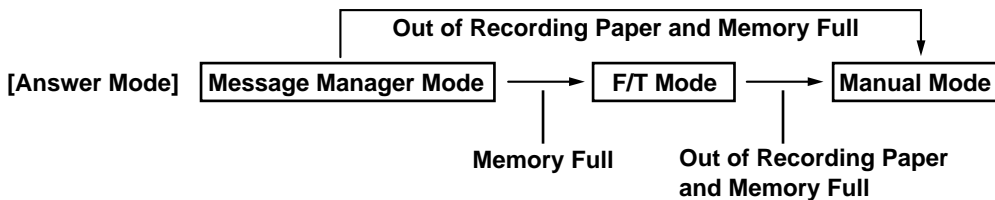
- (2) The LCD display will indicate the total number of Voice and/or Doc messages and MEMO stored in Message Manager.



FOR YOUR INFORMATION

What Happens When the Memory Is Full...

If the memory becomes full when you have set your fax machine to Message Manager mode or Message Manager Plus mode, the machine will change to F/T mode automatically. (LED lights do not change.) In this mode, the fax machine can accept incoming faxes automatically. Voice-on-Demand is still available for callers, but they cannot gain access to Personal Mailboxes. Then, if your fax machine should run out of paper, the answer mode will shift automatically to manual mode. In manual mode the call is not answered, so your caller will know to try again later.



To make the most effective use of the memory, print out the Memory Status List (see chapter 13) and select items which you no longer need to keep. These will be cleared, releasing the memory.

Setting the ICM (Incoming Message) Recording Monitor Volume

You can set the monitoring volume of incoming voice messages which are being recorded in Message Manager to OFF, LOW, MEDIUM or HIGH. The initial setting is LOW.

Playing an Incoming Voice Message (ICM) and Recorded Memo (or Memo Manager) / Printing an Incoming Fax Message

KEYS TO PRESS

 - The machine will play first the ICM, then the Memo continuously from the oldest one in ICM/MEMO.
 - During the first second that the message plays, display shows the current message number/total number of messages.
For one second, the machine will beep and the caller ID will flash on the display if it is received.
 - The ICM will start playing and the date and time it was recorded will appear on the display.
 - You can use ◀ (left arrow) to play the message again. If you press the arrow during the beeping before the message, the previous message will be played.
 - You can use ▶ (right arrow) to skip to the next message.
2. After playing all the ICM, the machine will ask you whether or not you wish to print any stored fax messages.
If users enter neither 1 or 2 here, the machine will not print fax messages.
Example: 1.YES
3. The machine will start printing fax messages stored in the Message Manager memory.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Erasing and Printing FAX Messages

1. It is not possible to erase a single fax message, you can only erase all of them. (“All in One Erasing” in this chapter.)
2. If you choose to erase all the fax messages, your fax machine will automatically print messages which have not yet been printed.

Back-up Printing Option

When you choose DOC.: ON in the Message Manager Mode, all incoming fax messages are stored into available memory. The factory setting for the “Back-up printing option” is set to ON, so you will also get a printed copy. If you change the back-up printing option to OFF as follows, the faxes are stored without a back-up copy:

Calling Your Message Manager for Messages (See Remote Retrieval)

If you have set your Message Manager to store incoming fax messages (via DOC.: ON mode), you have the ability to retrieve these fax messages from any remote group 3 facsimile machine.

Of course you can also remotely retrieve your voice messages as well from any touch tone phone. (See this chapter for more information.)

C) ERASING YOUR MESSAGES

Erasing Incoming Voice Messages, Fax Messages and Recorded Memo (or Memo Manager)

There are two ways to erase voice messages and recorded memos: One by One Erasing and All in One Erasing.

Fax messages can not be erased one at a time.

One by One Erasing

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Play**.
(Press **Menu** and then **Play** for Memo Manager.)
The machine starts to play.
2. Press **Erase** when you hear 2 short beeps, which means the end of the ICM.
* Be careful not to press **Erase** while the machine beeps to start playing next ICM, which will erase the next ICM before playing it.
3. Press **1** to erase this message or **2** to exit the function.

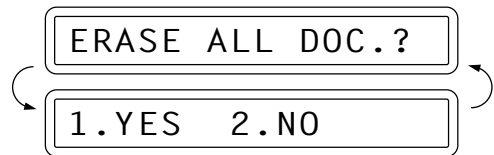

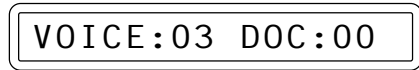

E) MORE FEATURES

Setting the Toll Saver

Toll saver allows you to call your fax machine and hang up without paying for the call if you have no messages. The Message Manager will answer after only 2 rings if you **do** have incoming messages, and after 4 rings if you **do not** have messages. So, if it rings three times when you call for messages, hang up and avoid a call charge.

The factory default setting for the Toll Saver feature is OFF. This feature will override your current Ring Delay setting if you set it to ON.

If you want your Message Manager to answer within the number of rings you set in the Ring Delay function, turn Toll Saver OFF.

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Menu**.
2. Press **8**.
3. Press **8**.
4. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) to select ON or OFF.
Example: ON.
5. Press **Set**.

Setting the Maximum Time for Incoming Messages (ICM MAX. TIME)

Although the initial setting on your fax machine for the maximum length of incoming voice messages is 35 seconds, you can adjust it. You have a choice of setting it from 35 seconds to 60 seconds, at 5 second intervals. This time is also used for max. time of Personal Mailbox ICM, Memo and Memo Manager recording.

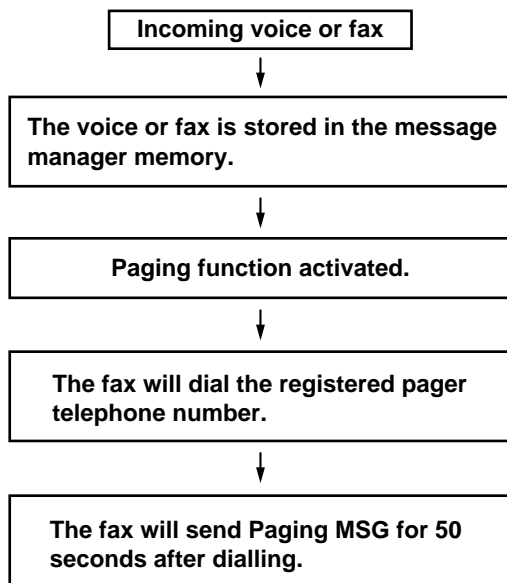

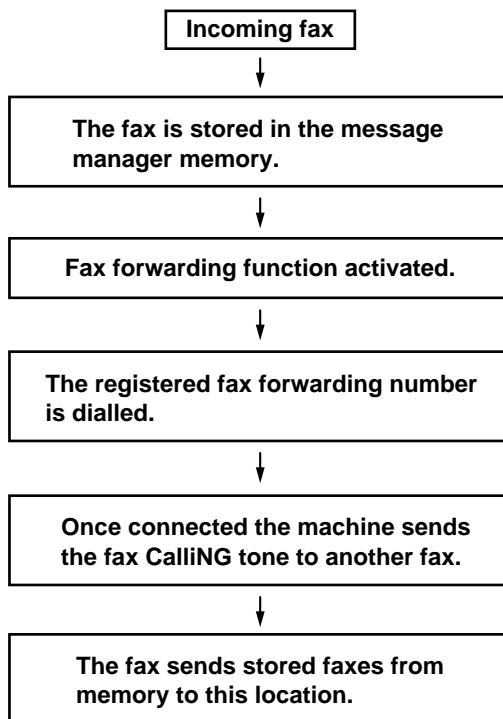
Paging/Fax Forwarding

Message Manager mode provides the additional option of either Paging or Fax Forwarding after voice and fax messages have been received into the memory.

NOTICE

- 1. You can only activate either paging or fax forwarding; they are very similar features and cannot be used simultaneously.*
- 2. The paging feature cannot be used in two modes of the Message Manager; DOC:OFF/VOICE:EXT, and DOC:OFF/VOICE:OFF.*
- 3. If paging is ON, you will be paged every time a voice or fax message is received into memory.*

Memory Back-up of Message Manager Memory

After you plug in the electrical cord, it will take a few days to charge the battery for memory backup of the Message Manager memory. It will retain memory for several hours at full charge after a power interruption occurs.

G) REMOTE RETRIEVAL

What Is Remote Control Access?

When you leave your home or office, you can turn on your Message Manager to receive voice and/or fax messages. But if you would like to deactivate the Message Manager or activate certain Message Manager features you can control and program your fax by remote control. You can call your fax from any touch tone phone, enter your remote control code, followed by programming commands.

Setting the Remote Access Code

The initial setting for the remote control code on your new fax is "159*".

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Menu**.
2. Press **8**.
3. Press **4**.
4. Enter a three digit number **000** to **998**. The last digit, an asterisk, can not be changed.
Example: **160***.
The three digit number must not be the same as the remote activation code. (See chap. 7.)
5. Wait for two seconds.
6. Press **Stop** to exit.

Helpful Hints

Change the remote control code and use it as a "secret password" to limit access to your Message Manager. (Avoid using the same number as your emergency services).

*When you use the Remote Access Code, you must press all four keys (three-digit number plus *).*

How to Use Remote Access and Control Codes

1. Call from a touch tone phone or pocket tone dialler.
2. Enter your fax machine's number.
3. Enter your Remote Access Code immediately after your fax machine answers with a beep and before any OGM is played.
4. If you hear a long beep, it means your machine has received messages:
 - One long beep: Received FAX message(s).
 - Two long beeps: Received TAD message(s).
 - Three long beeps: Received both FAX and TAD message(s).If you do not hear any long beeps, it means your fax machine did not receive message(s).
5. Next you will hear a series of two short beeps, during which you can enter a Remote Control Command.
6. Enter a Remote Control Command.
7. After finishing one command, you can enter the next command during another series of two short beeps.
8. Press **90** to exit remote control.

If you perform a wrong operation, you will hear three short beeps.

If you wait more than 30 seconds during the series of two short beeps, your machine will disconnect the line.

Remote Retrieval

If you have set your Message Manager to store incoming fax messages (via DOC.: ON mode), you have the ability to retrieve these fax messages from any remote group 3 facsimile machine.

Of course you can also remotely retrieve your voice messages as well from any touch tone phone or from any phone if you use a pocket tone dialler.

Remote fax and voice retrieval is accomplished via remote control access commands, which are described in the remainder of this chapter.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

When to Press the Remote Access Code

At the point just after the line has connected and you hear a beep, you should enter the remote activation access code from a touch-tone phone. In the MANUAL mode, you can still connect by waiting for about 100 seconds, and then pressing the Remote Access code within 30 seconds.

Remote Control Commands

You can control your fax machine by remote control command.

How to Receive the Memory Status List and Retrieve a Fax Message Remotely

You can check if you have any stored fax messages to retrieve in the Memory Status List first. Then you can retrieve them from your fax machine remotely.

1. Pick up the handset of a remote fax machine.
2. Dial your fax machine's number.
3. Enter your four-digit Remote Access Code (e.g. 159*) when your fax machine answers with a beep.
4. Press **961** during a series of two short beeps.
5. Press **Start** after you hear the tone and hold the handset.
 - If you wish to receive only the MEMORY STATUS LIST, replace the handset after pressing **Start**.
6. Now you will receive a "MEMORY STATUS LIST" (see chap. 13).
7. When the MEMORY STATUS LIST is printed, you will hear a series of two short beeps.
8. Press **96 2** as soon as you hear two (2) short beeps.

After **96 2**, enter the two-digit message numbers from the Memory Status List (ex. **01**) and end by pressing **00**.

ex.) To receive NO.1 and NO.2 messages, press **96 2 01 02 00**.

If you want to retrieve all messages, simply press **00**.

ex.) To retrieve all fax messages, press **96 2 00**.

9. Press **Start** after you hear the tone.
10. Replace the handset. Now your fax messages will be printed.

How to Change Fax Forwarding Number Remotely

1. Pick up the handset of a remote fax machine.
2. Dial your fax machine's number.
3. Enter your four-digit remote control access code (e.g. 159*) when your fax machine answers.
4. Press **954** during a series of two short beeps.
5. Enter new Fax Forwarding number by using number keys (up to 20 digits).
 - You cannot register * and # as dial numbers. Use # to make a pause between the dial numbers.
6. Press **##** after entering new Fax Forwarding number.
7. Press **961** during a series of two short beeps.
8. Press **Start** after you hear the fax tone and hold the handset.
9. Now you can receive "MEMORY STATUS LIST" (see chap. 13). Look at the LIST, and make sure the new Fax Forwarding number you registered in Step 5 is correct.
10. If the new number is correct, press **955** to confirm the number when a series of two short beeps starts sounding.
 - If it is incorrect, press **954** during a series of 2 short beeps and enter a correct number again (back to Step 4).
11. Replace the handset. Now your fax machine is ready to activate Fax Forwarding.

WARNING!

There are some fax machines which, having completely received the MEMORY STATUS LIST from your fax machine, will give an audible "HANDSET UP" or similar alarm, if you keep the line held in readiness for the next command.

*In such cases, it may be possible to clear the alarm and enter the next command (e.g. "962" for the RETRIEVE), by pressing the **Stop** once or twice on the receiving machine during the alarm beeping time. If this doesn't work, simply replace the handset, pause, and redial the call, using then the "962" command after your fax machine answers and accepts your remote access code.*

H) MEMO MANAGER**Memo Manager**

This function can help you manage your work schedule. With this function, you can record your schedule of events for the following week on your fax machine and have your fax machine alert you at scheduled times. The fax machine will play a recorded voice message (which you store) to remind you of your appointment or schedule. For each appointment reminder, you record a voice message and key in the date and time you wish the message to be played. When the set time comes you will hear the message played back on the fax machine. It's a great tool for keeping important appointments.

Setting the Memo Manager

You can start setting your Memo Manager by pressing **Menu** and **Record**. You need to enter 3 pieces of information for setting the Memo Manager : 1) day, 2) time, and 3) voice message. To record a voice message, speak into the microphone. You can set up to one week's worth of Memo Manager messages.

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Press **Menu**.
2. Press **Record** when the LCD shows:
"ENTER NO. & SET".
3. Wait for 2 seconds.

THE DISPLAY WILL SHOW:

4. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) to select a day.

Example: If today is Wednesday, you can choose from: TODAY, TOMORROW, FRIDAY, SATURDAY, SUNDAY, MONDAY, TUESDAY.

Example: SAT.

SET DAY=SAT

5. Press **Set**.
The current time will be displayed.

SET TIME=15:25

6. Enter the time in 24-hour format.
Example: **20:00** (8:00 P.M.)

SET TIME=20:00

7. Wait for 2 seconds

PRESS RECORD KEY

8. Press **Record** and then pick up the handset.

Helpful Hints

You can record Memo Manager Messages to help you manage your workload even when your memory is not set for "VOICE: ON" in Message store.

NOTICE

- If you press **Clear** while you are recording a voice message, the voice message being recorded will be cancelled. Also, the entire entry including the day and time will be deleted.
- If you don't press **Record** within 2 seconds (i.e. while the LCD displays "ENTER NO. & SET") after you press **Menu**, you will not be able to enter the schedule.
- The number of entries in your schedule will not be counted in the total of incoming calls on your TAD. Consequently, the LCD will display the date and time after you enter the schedule.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Recording Voice Messages for the Memo Manager

- You can set the maximum recording length for a voice message, from 35-60 seconds. Use Function menu 8-5. This setting also applies to incoming messages, and memos.
- You can enter up to 99 entries of Memo Manager messages, and a combined total of 99 entries of incoming messages and memos.

Examples of Memo Manager messages:

“ There’s a meeting in the conference room on 7th Nov. at 1:30 PM”

“ Call Mr. Johnson at ABC Trading Co. on 8th Nov. at 2:00 PM”

“ Dentist Appointment on 9th Nov. at 10:00 AM”

“ Mr. Brown, could you please attend the sales meeting in the conference room on 10 Nov., at 4:00 PM?”

When you call your fax machine from a remote location to play back your schedule of events, you will not be able to see the display for the dates and times in the Memo Manager, so it’s a good idea to mention the dates and times when you record the voice messages.

How Will the Memo Manager Perform When the Set Time Comes...

If you have the Memo Manager set at Monday, 15:26, the following will happen:

KEYS TO PRESS

1. The set time appears, a beep follows and you will hear the voice message played once.
2. The playback of the voice message finishes.
3. If you want to hear the voice message again, press **1**, if not, press **2**.

Example: Press **2** key.

- If you don’t press 1 or 2 after 10 seconds, the machine will simply return to its normal idle position and display the date and time.

NOTICE

- *If you want to stop the beeping or stop playing a Memo Manager message, press **Stop**.*
 - *The Memo Manager message will not be played when you are sending or receiving a fax, using the phone, receiving a fax into the memory or when one of the Message Manager functions is operating. However, the voice message will be played once these activities are finished.*
 - *The Memo Manager message will not automatically be cleared after it has been activated/played. If the machine discovers that you have a Memo Manager message with a time earlier than the present due to the change of the current date and time, it will immediately play the schedule once and then erase it.*
 - *If you have two entries in your schedule with the same date and time, they will play one after the other.*
-

Using the Memo Manager: Playing entries, Erasing entries one by one, Erasing all at once

Once you press **Menu**, be ready to press **Play**, or **Erase** immediately, depending upon whether you want to play an entry or erase everything. For instructions on how to play and how to erase, refer to the instructions in the ICM, Memo section. When you play an entry, the display will show you the date and time of your scheduled entries. You can delete entries one by one, the same way you would do so for incoming messages or memos: press **Erase** while playing an entry.

NOTICE

- *If you don't press **Play** or **Erase** within 2 seconds (i.e. while the LCD displays "ENTER NO. & SET") after you press **Menu**, you will not be able to play back or delete entries.*
 - *If you don't press **Menu**, and just press **Play**, you will only be able to hear incoming messages and memos. You won't be able to hear the Memo Manager messages.*
 - *If you don't press **Menu**, and just press **Erase**, you will only be able to delete incoming messages and memos. Memo Manager messages will not be deleted.*
-

Remote Control of the Memo Manager

When you are on the road, you can call your fax machine and play back your Memo Manager messages. (See the list for Remote Control Commands)

NOTICE

- *You cannot set the Memo Manager by remote control.*
 - *Also, note that you will only be able to hear the recorded Memo Manager message. You will not be able to see the dates and times of the schedule on the display, so it's a good idea to record important dates and times as part of your Memo Manager messages when you first record them.*

Chapter 11. MESSAGE MANAGER PLUS SETTINGS (Only for FAX 1030 Plus)

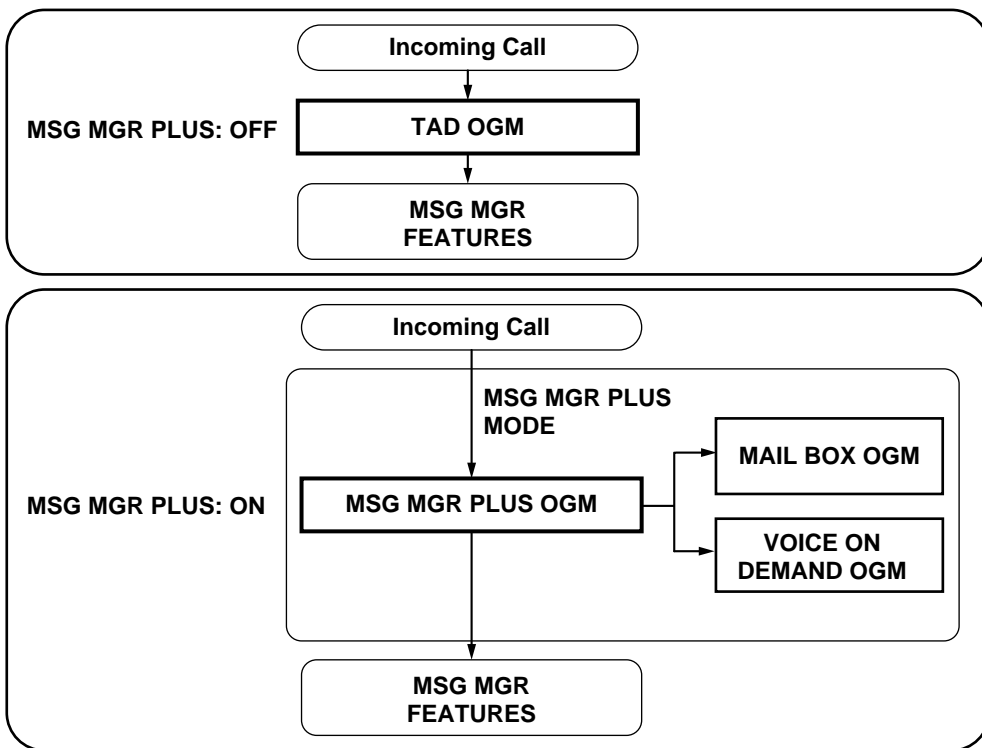
A) GETTING STARTED

What is Message Manager Plus?

As an additional enhancement of the Message Manager, the Message Manager Plus provides you with the Personal Mailbox & Voice-on-Demand features.

You can easily set up all of the above functions in the Menu as well as turning the Message Manager Plus on or off.

Using the Message Manager Plus will have no effect on the standard Message Manager functions.



What Voice-on-Demand Does

The Voice-on-Demand allows you to store voice messages into the memory boxes, respectively. People calling to your fax machine can gain selective access to certain messages.

This fax machine has up to 50 Voice-on-Demand memory boxes. You can use the memory boxes to provide callers with more information automatically and effectively, without answering the call yourself.

NOTICE

Your Message Manager Plus and Standard Message Manager combined have a total capacity of 30 minutes of voice messages or up to 50 pages of fax messages. The memory is a flexible dynamic memory, so when you use a combination of Voice-on-Demand and Personal Mailbox, the memory will be used on a first come, first served basis. Although the Voice-on-Demand function allows you to enter message numbers from 01 to 50, you are still limited by the 30 minutes or up to 50 page total capacity. The flexibility of numbers will let you categorise your messages with a numbering system. For example: 01: "directions to your office", 10 - 19: "product information", 20 - 24: "price lists", 30 - 33: "sale events", etc..

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Application examples of Voice-on-Demand feature

For smaller-scale business stores or offices:

Using the Voice-on-Demand, you can store

- *your new product news in memory box 01,*
- *your price information in memory box 02,*
- *your shipment schedule in memory box 03, and*
- *the lineup of all your product family in memory box 04.*

To set up Voice-on-Demand, verbally record the Guidance OGM 1 and Guidance OGM 2 and turn on the Message Manager Plus.

When customers call you, the recorded Guidance OGM 1 and 2 will allow them access to the memory boxes containing the information they want. The customers can extract information as a voice message, even if no one is present in your office. It means that the fax machine automatically answers your customers' calls.

What the Personal Mailbox Does

The personal mailbox feature allows callers to enter a confidential fax or voice message into the selected one out of five personal mailboxes (compartments).

Each of those personal mailboxes can be accessed only with a pre-determined password, so that even if the fax machine is used by more than one person, this feature helps protect the privacy of the users.

You must use the password to extract a confidential fax or voice message from your mailbox when you call from a remote fax machine.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Application Examples of Personal Mailbox

For smaller-scale business stores or offices:

In a business office where sales persons work out of the office, assign personal mailbox 01 to Mr. A, 02 to Mrs. B, 03 to Ms. C, ... Customers with orders or inquiries can gain direct access to the appropriate person for a quicker response.

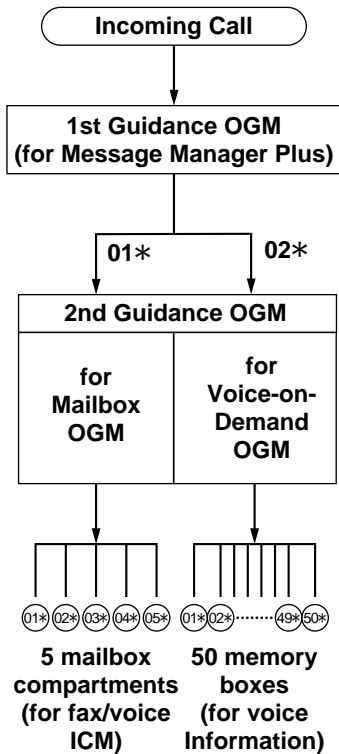
For residential users:

At home, assign personal mailbox 01 to Father, 02 to Mother, 03 to Daughter, 04 to Son, That way, all family member's messages will be organised in a group for each person, for quick and easy retrieval.

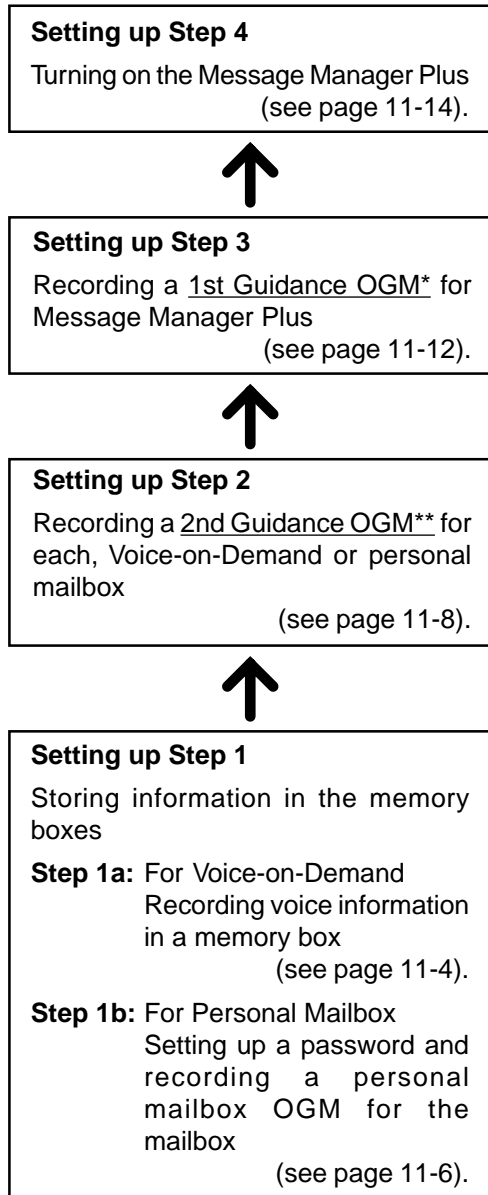
How the Caller Gains Access to the Voice-on-Demand Memory Boxes or Personal Mailboxes

Callers can easily gain access to Voice-on-Demand memory box or Personal Mailbox while being guided by the 1st and 2nd Guidance OGMs below.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

*** 1st Guidance OGM: (Message Manager Plus Outgoing Message)**

When the call is connected to your fax machine, the 1st Guidance OGM will tell the caller that he/she should press 01* or 02* for access to the 2nd Guidance OGM for Voice-on-Demand or mailbox, after the OGM.

The OGM also will tell that callers can leave voice messages or fax messages by pressing the remote activation code after the OGM.

**** 2nd Guidance OGM: (Voice-on-Demand, Mailbox Outgoing Message)**

Next, the 2nd Guidance OGM will tell the caller the titles of information stored and their memory box numbers. For the mailbox, it will tell the assigned persons' names and mailbox numbers.

Access to the Target Memory Box:

The caller can gain access to a memory box following the instructions of the 2nd Guidance OGM. For the mailbox, the caller can record his/her fax or voice message into the target mailbox after checking the name of the person assigned to that mailbox by the personal mailbox OGM.

B) SETTING UP THE VOICE-ON-DEMAND

Setting up Step 1a: for Voice-on-Demand

Recording/Erasing/Playing Voice Information in a Memory Box

Recording Voice Information in a Memory Box

“Voice information” is the outgoing voice message you are recording in a memory box as a selection available for your callers to hear.

Setting up Step 2: Recording/Erasing/Playing the 2nd Guidance OGM for each Voice-on-Demand and Personal Mailbox

The 2nd Guidance OGM is the second outgoing message your callers will hear after they have chosen either voice-on-demand or personal mailbox. It must list the access numbers and identifying name of each compartment within that group (for example, within the voice-on-demand group.).

It also must tell callers that he/she can retrieve several voice-on-demand files at once during the same call by entering the two-digit box number continuously with * at the end of the commands.

Recording an OGM

Have you stored or recorded the messages you want for your callers? If you have, then, record a 2nd Guidance OGM for each voice-on-demand or personal mailbox you have already set up.

D) LISTENING TO ICMs (Incoming Messages)

Listening to the ICMs in the Personal Mailboxes

Look at the display to check whether your machine has received any ICMs. If the display shows the current date and time, no ICM (no voice or fax message) has been received.

If the display shows these alternately:

MAIL BOX:1 345

VOICE:02 DOC:09

This means that mailboxes 1, 3, 4, and 5 contain personal ICMs.

The second line shows that the standard Message Manager has stored two voice messages and nine fax messages in total.

To listen to the ICMs recorded in your personal mailbox, you will need to enter your pre-registered password.

If the ICM you have is a fax message, it will be printed; if the ICM you have is a voice message, it will be played back.

KEYS TO PRESS

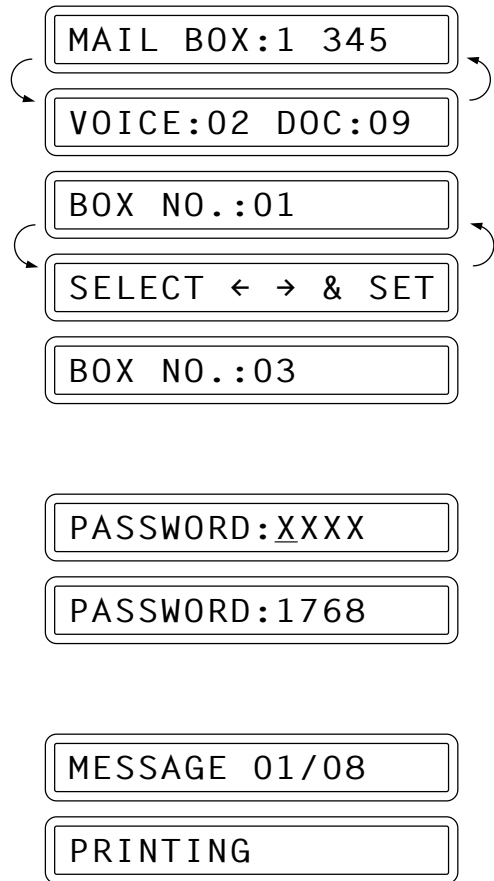
1. While holding down **Shift**, press **Play**.
2. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) key to select your own personal mail box number.
Example: 03.
3. Press **Set**.
4. Use the number keys to enter your pre-determined 4-digit password.
(See Setting up Step 1c.)
Example: 1768.
5. Press **Set** or wait 2 seconds.

The machine will start playing the recorded voice ICMs in the order they were received. After playing all of them it will print the faxes you received.

In the example shown on the right, 08 means that mailbox 03 contains eight ICMs and 01 means that the first voice ICM is being played back now.

To go to the next ICM or to return to the previous ICM during playback, press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) key, respectively.

Retrieving the ICMs (Incoming Messages) in the Personal Mailbox Remotely

You can retrieve the voice/fax ICMs (incoming messages) remotely:

1. Pick up the handset of a remote touch tone fax machine.
2. Dial your fax machine's number.
3. When your fax machine answers with a Message Manager Plus OGM, immediately enter the access command 01* to access the Personal Mailbox.
4. When you hear the general Personal Mailbox OGM, enter your Personal Mailbox number.
Example: 03*
5. When you hear your Personal Mailbox OGM, enter your 4-digit Password number.
Example: 1768

If no fax/voice ICM is stored in the mailbox, the line will be disconnected automatically.

6. You will hear the recorded voice ICMs through the handset of your remote fax machine, in the order they were received.
7. After playing all the voice ICMs, you may hear your fax machine through the handset responding with a fax tone. Then press **Start**.
8. Replace the handset.
9. Your remote fax machine will print the fax messages.

Recording a Memo in Personal Mailbox on the Machine

You can record a Personal Mailbox incoming message on the fax machine by pressing **Shift** and **Record**. Do the following steps to leave a message for a family member or colleague in their personal mailbox.

1. While holding down **Shift**, press **Record**.
2. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) key to select the target personal mailbox number.
Example: 02.
3. Press **Set**.
4. Speak into the microphone and record a message up to 20 seconds.

Chapter 12. HOW TO USE THE COPY FUNCTION

Making a Single Copy

Use this function to make a single copy. (Only for FAX 1020 Plus)

Select Auto Reduction (AUTO) if you want to reduce the size of the original, regardless of its size, to the size of the recording paper. To enlarge or reduce a document, select one of the enlargement/reduction ratios: 150%, 125%, 120%, 93%, 87%, 75% or 50%. If you want to reproduce the same size, select 100%.

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Insert the documents face down into the feeder.
2. Press **Copy**.
3. Press **Set** or just wait for 5 seconds.
If you don't want to enlarge or reduce, go to Step 5.
(Only for FAX 1020 Plus)
4. Press ◀ (left arrow) or ▶ (right arrow) to choose the setting.
 - If you want Auto Reduction, select "AUTO".
 - If you want to reproduce the same size, choose 100%.
 - For Fixed Enlargement or Reduction, choose one of the following settings: 150%, 125%, 120%, 93%, 87%, 75% or 50%.
Example: 93%
5. Press **Copy**.

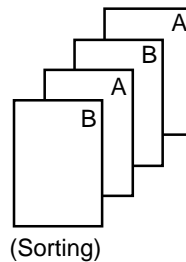
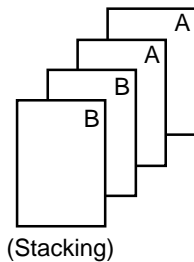
Helpful Hints

1. Set the resolution to either PHOTO or S.FINE, when making copies without enlargement/reduction. If you select STANDARD or FINE, the resolution will automatically default to S.FINE.
2. When you want to change the resolution for each page, you can use Function menu 1-5 (see chap. 6) to set the resolution for each page.
3. When you want to make a copy, make sure the text or image on the original document is not too close to the edge. Your fax machine cannot read anything closer than 4 mm (1/8 inch) from the edge.
4. Do not pull on the paper while copying is in progress. This may distort the copied image and damage your machine.
5. When making copies with enlargement/reduction, set the resolution to either PHOTO or S.FINE. If you select STANDARD or FINE, the resolution will automatically default to FINE.

NOTE: Original documents should be straight, non wrinkled, to be fed correctly. Otherwise the documents may jam in the machine occasionally.

Making Multiple Copies

There are two ways to make multiple copies on your fax machine. The first is the stacking method, this will make a number of copies of page one, a number of copies of page two and so on. These will all be stacked on top of each other. The second method is the sorting or collating method. This is when the fax machine scans the entire document and then makes 1 copy of page 1, 2, 3, 4 in order. Then makes a second copy of 1, 2, 3, 4 until a total of a number of copies has been made.

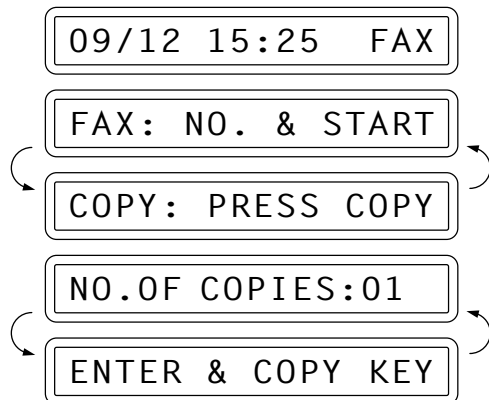


Stacking Multiple Copies

KEYS TO PRESS

1. Place the documents face down into the feeder.
2. Press **Copy**.

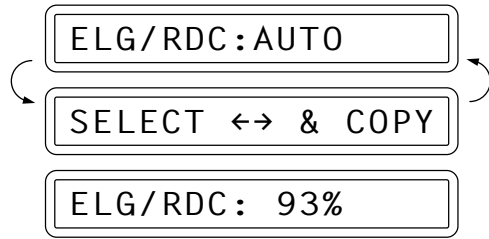

- NOTE:
1. When making Multiple Copies, do not let the receiving tray become overstacked. Remove the copied paper from the receiving tray frequently.
 2. When making Multiple Copies, make sure there is enough recording paper in the machine.

What to Do When You Get a "MEMORY FULL" Message while Making Copies

*If you are using the stacking method, press **Stop**. If you are using the sorting method, press **Copy** to copy the portion that is in the memory, or press **Stop** to cancel.*

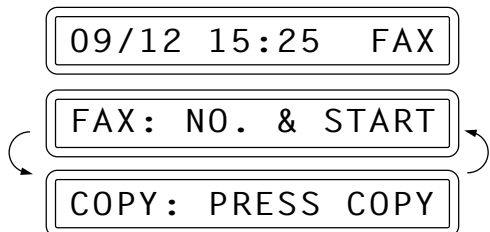
Making Reduced and Enlarged Copies (Only for FAX 1030)

Use this function to make reduced or enlarged copies of a document. Select Auto Reduction (AUTO) if you want to reduce the size of the original, regardless of its size, to the size of the recording paper. To enlarge or reduce a document, select one of the enlargement/reduction ratios: 150%, 125%, 120%, 93%, 87%, 75% or 50%.

1. Insert the documents face down into the feeder.

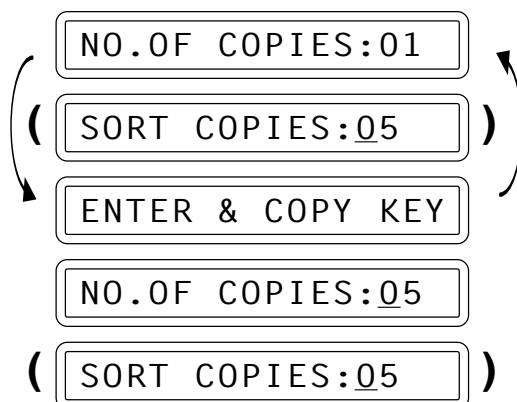
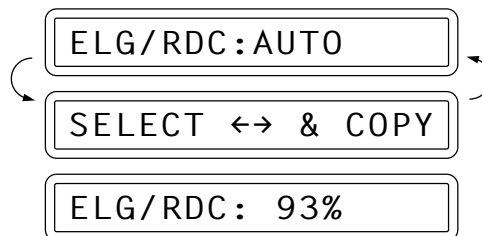

Journal Period

A journal (activity report) can be printed at certain intervals that you specify. You have a choice of setting the journal period to “OFF”, “1 hours”, “3 hours”, “6 hours”, “12 hours”, “24 hours”, “2 days”, “4 days”, or “7 days”. The activity report will provide a list of all outgoing and incoming faxes (up to 30) during that period. The initial setting is “OFF”.

Even if you set the journal period to OFF, the machine always records the latest 30 transactions of outgoing & incoming faxes. So you can check them by printing the journal manually (Menu 3-1).

Transmission Verification (Xmit) Report

Set the Transmission Verification Report to ON or OFF. The initial setting is OFF.

OFF: Report will be printed if transmission errors occur.

ON: Report will be printed every time a fax message is sent correctly or an error occurs.

Chapter 14. REGULAR MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

Regular Maintenance

You can keep your fax machine in optimum condition by cleaning it on a regular basis. Avoid using thinners or other organic solvents to clean the machine and do not use any water.

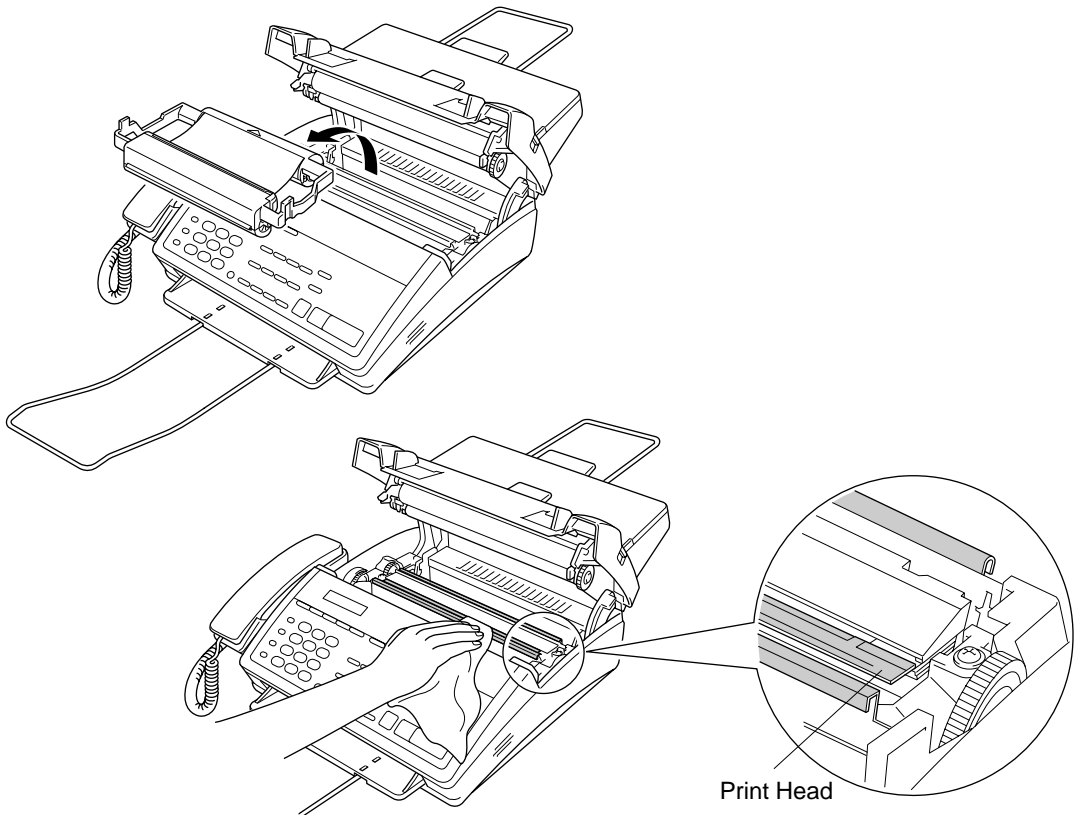
■ Clean the Printer

1. Unplug the telephone line and then the power cord.

When you reconnect these lines later, make sure to connect the power cord first, then the telephone line.

2. Press the OPEN button of the top cover and open it up.
3. Take out the printing cartridge.
4. Moisten a small piece of soft, lint-free cloth with Isopropyl alcohol and wipe the print head and metal parts shaded in grey, shown in the illustration.
5. Install the printing cartridge.
6. Press both edge of the top cover until it clicks and close the top cover.

NOTE: You will hear a warning sound when you open the top cover. Press **Stop** to stop the sound.



■ Clean the scanner

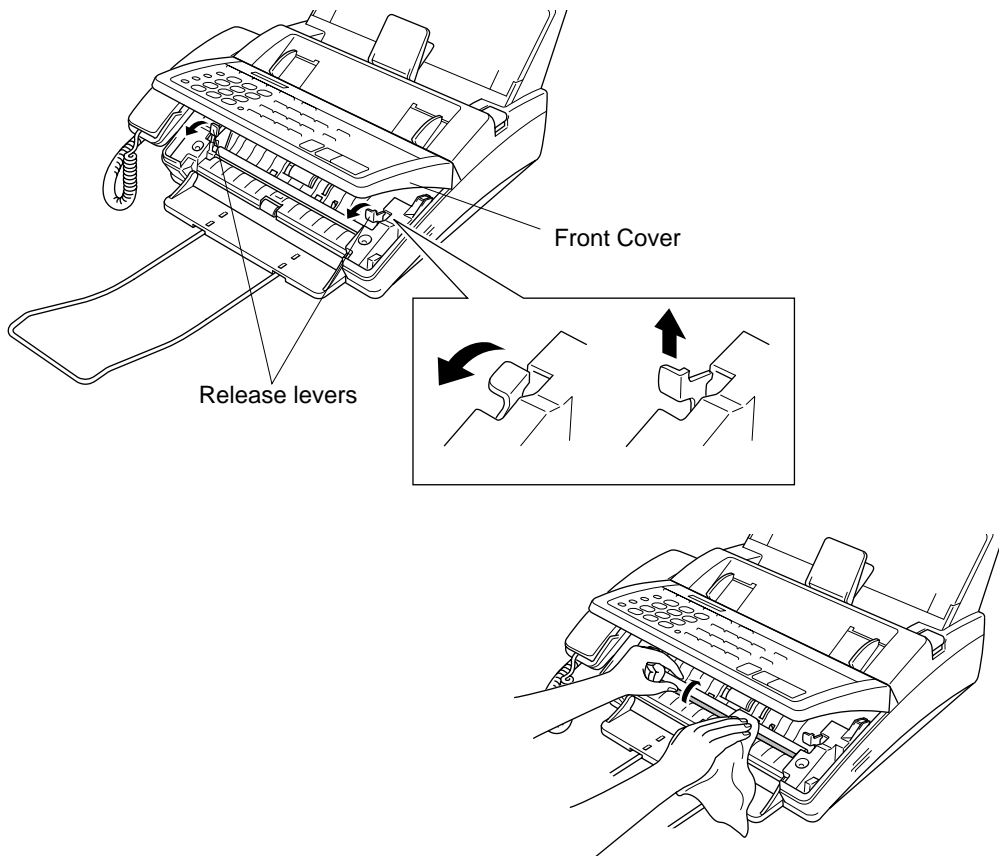
1. Unplug the telephone line and then the power cord.

When you reconnect these lines later, make sure to connect the power cord first, then the telephone line.

2. Open the front cover.
3. Lift the two release lever of the white roller. (Released roller)
4. Lift the two release levers of the white roller.
5. While the bar is lifted, wipe it and the scanner cover glass with small bit of lint-free cloth moistened with Isopropyl alcohol.
6. Press down both levers until the roller is locked into place. (Roller locked)
7. Close the front cover.

CAUTION

- Do not wipe the front cover with alcohol. It can damage the casing.
- Make sure the release lever is locked when closing the front cover. Failure to do so could result in the lever being broken.



Helpful Hints

If the scanner and the print head are dirty, the quality of the transmission, reception and copy images becomes degraded. Use the above procedure, therefore, to clean these parts frequently.

Paper Jams

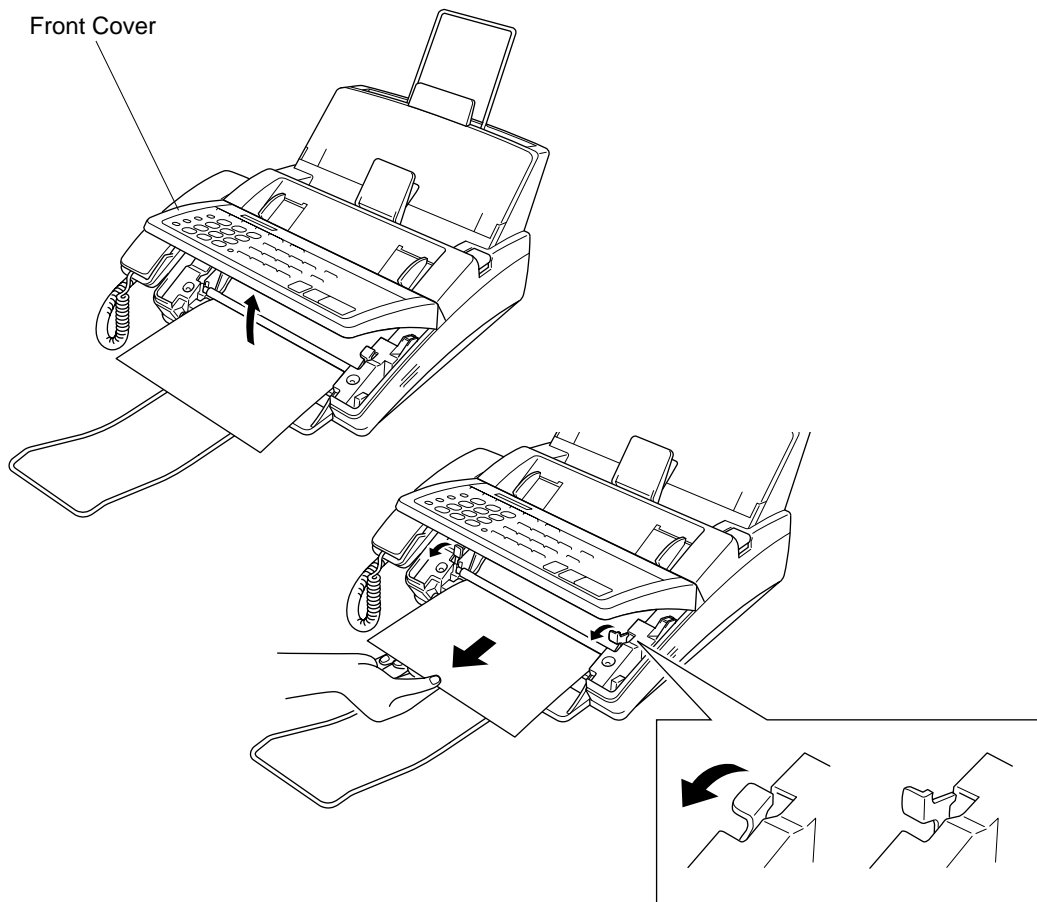
Your fax machine will sound an alarm if the document jams while going through the feeder or if the recording paper becomes stuck. The display will show “DOCUMENT JAM” or “CHECK PAPER”.

Fixing a Document Jam

1. Open the front cover.
2. Lift the two release levers of the white roller. (Roller released)
3. Pull the document toward the front of the fax machine.
4. Put the levers back. (Roller locked)
5. Close the front cover.
6. Press **Stop**.

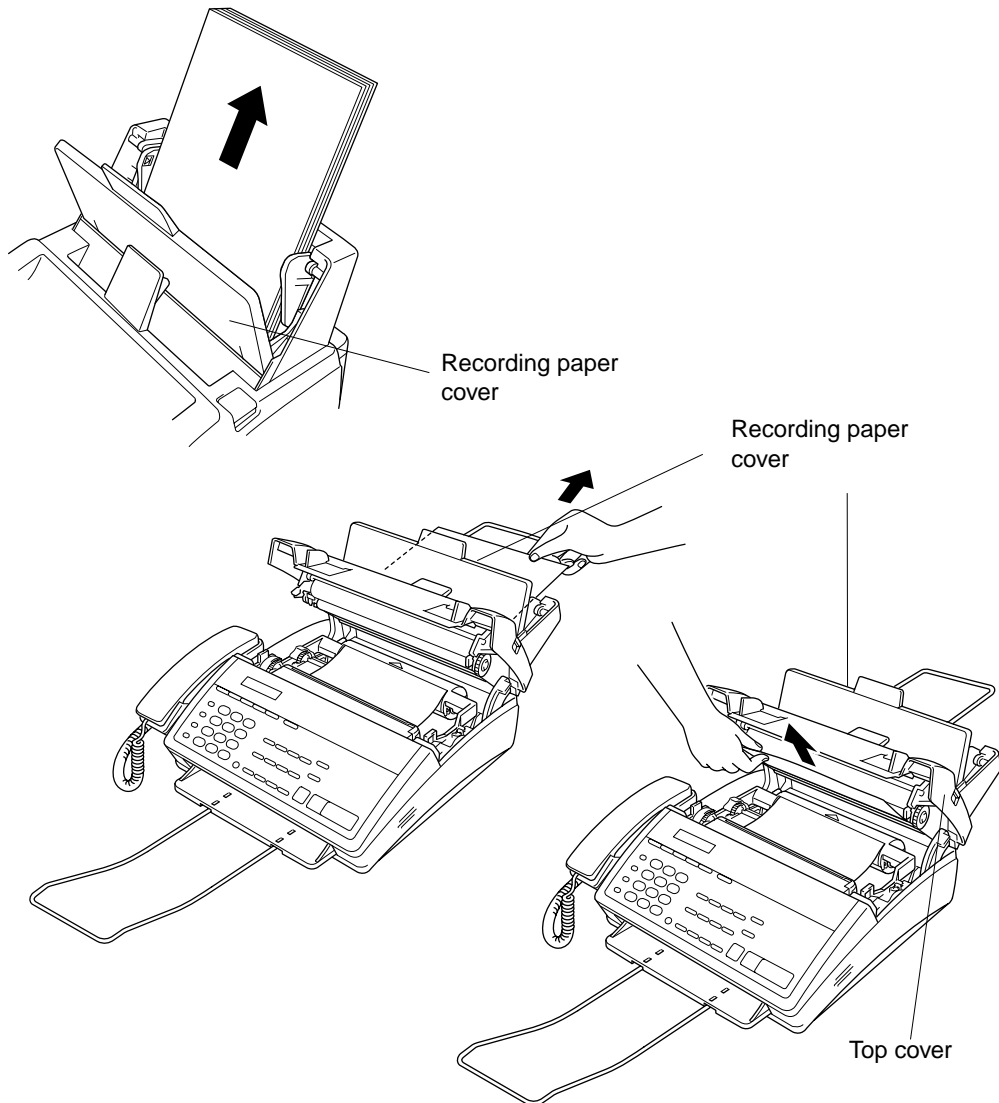
CAUTION

- *Pull the jammed document toward the front. Do not pull the document from the feeder.*
- *Make sure the release lever is locked when closing the front cover. Failure to do so could result in the lever being broken.*



Fixing a Recording Paper Jam

1. Open the recording paper cover and remove the paper in the feeder.
2. Press the OPEN button on the top cover and open it up.
3. Pull the jammed paper toward the back from the feeder and remove it.
If you can't, pull the jammed paper toward the front and remove it.
If you cannot see any jammed paper, remove the ribbon cassette and check underneath.
Remove any jammed paper.
4. Close the top cover.
Press the both edges of the top cover and close it until it clicks.
5. Put the recording paper back into the feeder.
6. Close the recording paper cover.



Troubleshooting

Occasionally, you may have a problem with your fax machine or telephone line. If this happens, your fax machine usually identifies the problem and displays an error message. Refer to the following list when you see an error message on the display. If additional help is needed, please contact our Brother dealer for service.

Error Messages

Error messages are listed below in alphabetical order.

C	CHANGE CARTRIDGE	The printing cartridge has run out. Replace the used cartridge with a new one. (See chap. 1.)
	CHECK PAPER	The machine is out of paper or the paper is not properly loaded in the paper cassette. Refill the paper or remove the paper and load it again.
	CLEAN UP SCANNER	The scanner is dirty. Clean the scanner.
	COMM. ERROR	You encountered a communications error that resulted from a poor quality phone line. Try the call again.
	CONNECTION FAIL	You requested the polling function even though the machine you called does not have the polling feature.
	COVER OPEN	The top cover was not completely closed. Please check them.
D	DISCONNECTED	The telephone line was disconnected by the other party during the communication. Try calling the other party to see what happened.

DOCUMENT JAM

Your documents were not inserted properly, or the documents were not fed properly, or the documents were too long.

Open the control panel and remove the documents. Then close the control panel, press **Stop** and insert the documents again, adjusting the guides on either side of the document, and try sending the fax again.

Original documents should be straight, non-wrinkled, to be correctly fed. Otherwise, the documents may occasionally jam. Please refer to page 6-1 for paper types.

M

MACHINE ERROR XX

PRESS STOP KEY

Cut the power off. Then contact your Brother dealer for service.

N

NO RESPONSE/BUSY

The number you called does not answer or is busy. You also may have reached a number that is not connected to a fax machine. Check the number and try again.

NOT ASSIGNED

The One-Touch key or Speed-Dial number you pressed has no number assigned to it. You need to program a phone number. (See chap. 4.)

P

PRINTER FAULT

The recording head has overheated. Unplug the power cord and wait for 30 minutes.

S

SCANNER ERROR

Try to clean the white bar and the glass under the white bar. If you still get the scanner error, please contact our Brother dealer for service.

Other Problems

When the receiving party says the picture is not clear

Sometimes the setting of the resolution mode is not appropriate. Send the fax again using the FINE or SUPERFINE mode. Also, your machine's scanner may be dirty, so try cleaning it.

When the receiving party says vertical streaks appear on the faxes they receive

Your machine's scanner may be dirty or the receiving party's printer head may be dirty. Clean your scanner, and make a copy to see if the problem was caused by your machine.

Vertical streaks appear on the faxes you receive

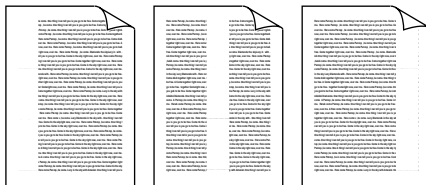
Sometimes you may see vertical streaks on the faxes you receive. Either your machine's thermal print head may be dirty, or the sending party's fax scanner may be dirty. Clean your thermal print head. Make a copy to see if the vertical streaks are still there.

Vertical streaks appear in copies

Sometimes you may see vertical streaks on your copies.

Either the scanner or the thermal print head is dirty. Clean them both.

- * If the printed pages are still blurred at the centre or either edge as below:
- Make sure that the printer is placed on a flat, horizontal surface.



Horizontal Streaks

You may get a fax with horizontal streaks or with missing lines. Usually this is caused by a poor telephone connection. Ask the other party to send the fax again.

If the received data is divided and printed onto 2 pages or if you get an additional blank page your recording size may not be set correctly for the recording paper you are using. If you are using the fixed reduction feature, check to see if the reduction ratio is suitable for the real recording paper (see chap. 7).

When Dialling Doesn't Work...

You may have the wrong dialling mode. Change the TONE/PULSE setting. (See chap. 4.)

You may also want to check all the telephone line connections (such as to the handset and to the wall jack). Check also that the power cord is connected. (See chap. 1.)

Chapter 15. IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Important Safety Instructions

1. Read all of these instructions.
2. Save them for later reference.
3. Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.
4. Unplug this product from the mains power and telephone line sockets before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
5. Do not use this product near water.
6. Do not place this product on an unsuitable cart, stand, or table. The product may fall causing serious damage to the product.
7. Slots and openings in the cabinet at the back, sides or bottom are provided for ventilation; to ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating, these openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the product on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. This product should never be placed near or over a radiator or heater. This product should not be placed in a built-in installation unless proper ventilation is provided.
8. This product should be operated from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power available, consult your Brother dealer or local electricity board or power company.
9. This product is equipped with a 3-wire earthed plug. This plug will only fit into an earthed socket. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet, contact your electrician in order to replace your obsolete socket. Do not attempt to defeat the purpose of an earthed plug.
10. Do not allow anything to rest on the power cord. Do not locate this product where persons will walk on the cord.
11. If an extension cord is used with this product, make sure that the total of the ampere ratings on the products plugged into the extension cord does not exceed the extension cord ampere rating. Also, make sure that the total current of all products plugged into the wall or floor socket does not exceed the socket rating.
12. Never push objects of any kind into this product through cabinet slots as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in a risk of fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the product.
13. Do not attempt to service this product yourself, as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage points or other risks. Refer all servicing to service personnel.

plugged into the mains and switched on at the power socket of the mains switch if applicable. This owner's manual has been provided with your machine to help you make use of the functions provided.

This machine must not be connected in conjunction with parallel extension telephones, unless those telephones are connected downstream of this machine. This means that the cable to which any extension device is connected, should be terminated on a BT modular jack plug type 431A which in turn is inserted into the modular socket of the T-shaped line cord connector of this machine. If these instructions are not followed, the following conditions may occur:

1. The fax machine inadvertently auto-answers in response to outward pulse dialling of an extension telephone.
2. Fax transmissions can be impaired or will fail entirely.
3. Remote activation from extension telephones may not work correctly.

If in doubt about any aspect of telephone extension cabling, contact BT, Kingston upon Hull Telecommunications, your PBX maintainer, your CATV company or a reputable telephone cabling company.
